ALL INDIA ASSOCIATION OF COAL EXECUTIVES (AIACE) MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON 30th JANUARY 2023

A meeting of AIACE was held on ZOOM platform on 30th January 2023 to discuss the following items.

- 1. Action Plan for the year 2023.
- 2. Dharna at Varanasi in March 2023 and in State Capitals in the following months
- 3. Membership Drive
- 4. Formation of Coal Clubs in different cities
- 5. Establishment of "CRECHEOLD HOMES" in selected cities
- 6. Finalisation of Branch Executive Committees
- 7. Any other matter

P.K.Singh Rathor, Principal General Secretary/Convener, AIACE welcomed all the participants and requested Dr.B.K.Shrivastav to preside over the meeting.

The following points as per the agenda were discussed.

1. ACTION PLAN FOR THE YEAR 2023

Convenor said that today's meeting is an important one in which several decisions are to be taken. AIACE is completing 8 years and from 2015 we have been working hard to solve the problems of working and retired executives. AIACE has successfully resolved the following issues.

- i. PRP
- ii. NPS
- iii. Interest on NPS
- iv. Enhancement of OPD charges from Rs.15,000 to Rs.36,000 p.a.
- v. Promotion of executives.

He further told that major issue of revision of pension is being pursued vigorously. Some issues relating to working conditions and Coal Field Allowance are being dealt with.

He said that all AIACE members have been included in 2 WhatsApp Groups, viz., Main Group (according to Membership number) and Local Group (according to location). A lot of information is disseminated through WhatsApp, website and Facebook for the benefit of the members. Members are requested to regularly follow the posts on these platforms.

All are requested to work dedicatedly for the benefit of everyone. Each Branch Executive Committee Member will be allotted 15-20 members to give personal attention to members' problems.

Sri Rathor informed that Associate and Honorary members were repeatedly asked to post their consent to continue their membership in 2023. All those who have confirmed continuance have been added in Associate and Honorary members group as per their category of membership. Those who have not yet confirmed are once again requested to give their consent in WhatsApp. After getting consent, they will be added to respective group.

Sri Rathor further told that the expert team of AIACE led by Dr B K Srivastava has made a study according to which the interest earned on the corpus of CMPS of pensioners retired before 2007 is more than sufficient to cover their pension. This study is based on hypothetical data and has been submitted to CMPFO for taking reasoned decision for enhancement of pension. AIACE has also offered the services of its expert members to help CMPFO in dealing with pension cases.

2. DHARNA AT VARANASI & OTHER PLACES

It was agreed by the members that a Dharna will be held at Varanasi on 27th March 2023 to press our demand for revision of pension under CMPS. Varanasi Branch is requested to take all steps to make it successful. Members of other branches are also requested to join the dharna.

Sri Rathor told that AIACE has successfully organised 3 dharnas at Jantar-Mantar, New Delhi resulting in acceptance of cess on coal of Rs.10 per MT (subsequently increased to Rs.20 on meeting Members of Board of Trustees at Nagpur) and a dharna at Dhanbad that led to simplification of widow pension. Dharnas will be organised in capitals of coal producing states and other places such as Kolkata, Ranchi, Bhubaneswar, Raipur, Nagpur, Bhopal, Hyderabad and other places for revision of pension.

3. MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

All members are requested to enrol at least 5-6 new members, especially working executives. The executives who will retire after 31st December,2022 will not be given membership of AIACE. All the Branches assured that they will work towards this. It was suggested that membership camps be organised in coalfield areas so that working executives can be motivated to join AIACE. Sri. Manjunath Prasad and Dr. B.K.Srivastav were requested to prepare a PowerPoint presentation on AIACE, its activities and achievements that can be used by the teams visiting the areas.

4. FORMATION OF COAL CLUBS

As decided earlier, Coal Clubs are to be formed at various cities and will be managed by the ladies. Coal Clubs have been formed at the following cities:

Sri P K Singh Rathor, Convenor, AIACE was having close watch on the deliberations in the meeting. He advised committee members to invite Sri Muslim Ansari, Joint Principal General Secretary in all the meetings of Bengaluru branch in future.

Sri R K Chowrasia, President, Bengaluru Branch, informed that last time Sri Ansari was invited in picnic but he had not attended due to his poor health. As such, they had not invited and disturbed him this time because of his deteriorating health day by day. Any way, he agreed that he would take care of this in future.



The following discussions took place.

1. ACTION PLAN 2023:

It was agreed that Family Get-together will be organised by the Bengaluru Coal Club once every quarter. A picnic or trip will also be organised in November/December 2023.

Foundation Day of AIACE will be celebrated on 16th May 2023 and Convenor and Central Committee members should be invited to attend the function.

2. MEMBERSHIP DRIVE:

All the members were requested to get in touch with their contacts and persuade them to join AIACE and inform them that executives retiring after January 2023 will not be eligible for membership.

Each member will be required to be in touch with 15-20 members of Bengaluru Branch and take up their issues, if any. Detailed distribution will be done by General Secretary and Joint Secretaries.

3. BENGALURU COAL CLUB: It was inaugurated on 11th January 2023 and Smt. Gunavathi Mohan Das is nominated as the Secretary of the Club. Smt. Gunavathi Das has requested to co-opt Smt. Kakoli Chatterji, Smt. Sudha Mohan, Smt. Anjali Shankar and Smt. Vidhya Rajan to manage the affairs of Coal Club. This was agreed to by the Committee Members.

4. FOUNDATION DAY:

AIACE Foundation Day will be celebrated on 16th May 2023. Central Committee Members and members of other Branches are cordially invited to attend the function. Bengaluru Coal Club Committee has agreed to arrange a cultural program and games on this occasion. It was proposed to invite a noted local personality to be the Chief Guest. This proposal will be examined. It is preferable to hold the function during the daytime.

5. REVISION OF PENSION: Members were informed about the proposed Dharnas for revision of pension. The first Dharna will be held on 27th March 2023 at Varanasi and 5 committee members have volunteered to join the Dharna. At least 10 members will join the Dharna at Hyderabad as and when it is organised. Central Committee may be requested to hold it early. All members of AIACE, Bengaluru are requested to come forward to join the protest and post their consent in WhatsApp group. Board and lodging arrangements will be made accordingly.

6. CPRMSE:



Some members wanted to know whether cost of regular medicines that they are purchasing will be reimbursed. It was confirmed that the cost of such medicines will be reimbursed provided they are prescribed by empanelled hospital doctor. Members were advised to purchase medicines from Pradhan Mantri Jana Aushadi Kendras as the cost of medicines at these centres is a fraction of the cost of branded medicines.

- 1. Empanelled hospitals are not giving cashless treatment to indoor patients and also not extending CGHS Rates for indoor or outdoor treatment. Some of the hospitals are outrightly denying that they are empanelled with CIL. Sri. A.K.Garg explained that many hospitals are outsourcing some treatment like dental etc., for which they will charge at hospital rates. He also clarified that treatment can be taken at any other hospital accredited to NABL and reimbursement will be restricted to CGHS/MAR rates.
- 2. It was decided to approach the empanelled hospitals to persuade them to extend cashless treatment and also CGHS Rates. For this purpose, different teams have been formed to visit the hospitals as per Table-1 below. The teams will also ascertain the problems faced by the hospitals like non-clearance of their bills by CIL and obtain a list of such bills. A letter to this effect will be mailed to the hospitals before the teams' visit. The team members are requested to visit the hospitals at an early date.

The meeting ended with a Vote of Thanks by Sri. Kasi Viswanathan.

A virtual meet on ZOOM was held on 4th March 2023 to review the preparations for Dharna to be held at Varanasi on 27th March 2023. Sri. P.K.Singh Rathor, Convenor, AIACE welcomed the members and requested Dr.B.K.Srivastav, Vice-President, AIACE to preside over the meeting.

Two Dharnas were successfully organised at Jantar Mantar, New Delhi on 25th July 2022 and 5th December 2022 to demand review and revision of Pension under CMPS. Dharnas were also held on 10th October 2022 at Headquarters of CMPF, Dhanbad and all the Regional Offices. Petitions were submitted to a number of MPs, Ministers and the Prime Minister in this regard. Meetings were held with Joint Coal Secretary, Commissioner, CMPFO and a few MPs and Cabinet Ministers. Attempts are being made to meet Smt. Nirmala Seetharaman, Hon'ble Minister of Finance, to appraise her of the hardships faced by pensioners due to non-revision. Due to our untiring efforts, action is being taken by BoT, CMPF and the Ministry of Coal. In spite of all these efforts, there is no tangible progress in the revision of pension which is a major issue for us. It was therefore decided to hold a massive Dharna at Varanasi, the Parliamentary constituency of our Hon'ble Prime Minister, Sri Narendra Modi so that our voices will reach him.

The response to the Dharna is encouraging and it is expected that more than 300 members from across 12 States will participate in it. Sri S N Singh, Vice-President, AIACE, informed that the venue of the Dharna is Lal Bahadur Shastri Ghat on the banks of Varuna River. It is less than 2 km from Banaras Railway Station. Permission from the local authorities for the Dharna is expected shortly. The Dharna will be held from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM. All the members and their families of Varanasi Branch are to mandatorily participate. Location map will be shared in the group after official permission is received.

Arrangements of a covered stage and seating arrangements for 300-350 people have been made. Lunch and refreshments will be provided.

Accommodation for outstation volunteers has been arranged at a nearby place for 2 days from 26th March 2023. The following discussions took place as per agenda.

- 1. Welcome of members: At outset all the participant executive members were given warm welcome and greeted by the audience.
- Review of past activities: The activities of AIACE Central body in general and Delh-NCR branch in particular, were discussed. Members were happy to note the co=operation being received from AIACE Central body. Sri Mathur, President complimented all for successfully 2 massive Dharnas at Jantar-Mantar on 25-7-2022 and 5-12-2023. These Dharnas are showing signs of fulfilment of various demands as elaborated below in appropriate sections.
- 3. Upcoming Dharna at Varanasi: Dr B K Shrivastav, Vice-President elaborated at length the issue of pension revision and the importance of proposed Dharna at Varanasi on 27-3-2023. He said that there is no cut-off date as such 1-1-1997 from which the pensioners will be benefited. He said that all those who retired from 1995 are eligible for revision, as all of them are covered by the same pension scheme. The problem is that pension fixation is done as per salary drawn at the time of retirement, and salary structure has undergone considerable changes in last 2 decades. This leads to disparity in pension fixation allowing higher pension to new retiree compared to old retiree. He further said,

that due to non-investment of our pension corpus in instruments yielding high returns, CMPF preferred to pay pension from current subscriptions. This led to exhaustion of pension corpus. The need of the hour is to augment in such a way that, payment of pension as well as strengthening of corpus fund, both are achieved. Without needful guidelines from Government, it will be difficult to achieve pension revision. It was a matter of joy to record that many members of Delhi-NCR branch including Sri Arun Kumar Sharma, Sri D R K Singh, Sri G K Raghav and others will be joining Dharna at Varanasi on 27/3/23 along with spouses.

- 4. CPRMSE issues: Members were concerned that many, not all, empanelled hospitals are extending CGHS rates to beneficiaries. Apparently, most hospitals have suspended CGHS rates in anticipation of likely enhancement of CGHS rates. A suggestion came to approach CIL for amendment in CPRMSE rules to allow an Indoor patient to avail treatment in other departments also even if those departments are not under empanelment of that hospital. This is required sometime, when a patient develops complications after being admitted in a particular department.
- **5. Induction of new Members to AIACE:** Members agreed to work for enhancing the membership drive. Elderly members present in the meeting were concerned that lowering of Registration fee may be considered as the competitive associations do not charge any registration fee and offer liberal facilities for members.



- 6. Formation of Delhi-NCR Coal Club: While discussing the membership drive, a conclusion was arrived that membership drive can be enhanced if we allow social gatherings among ourselves. This conclusion proved a foundation for discussing- launch of our Delhi-NCR Coal Club. Sri A Kalam offered his assistance for scheduling the launch of Coal Club in Qutab Golf Course. Members unanimously agreed to hold the launch at a later date keeping in mind the ensuing hot summer season. It was also agreed to invite Sri P K Singh Rathor, Convenor, AIACE for inaugurating this club. It was also agreed that, Delhi-NCR being a large geographical area, meetings of proposed Coal Club will be held in rotation at different region of NCR like Noida, Greater Noida, Gurugram etc.
- 7. **Feasibility of Old age home at Delhi-NCR:** Initially not in agenda, yet, the matter of finding feasibility of establishing a Crèche Old Age Home in Delhi-NCR region was discussed. Knowing about our scheduled meeting at Qutab Golf Course, Mr R. N. Maurya,

M.D., AKR Infratech, Faridabad approached President, AIACE and with his permission, presented a brief description of various models of old age home and cost involved. The members thanked him for his initiative and informed him that as this concept is still in nascent stage, it needs more interactions in future for arriving at any decision.

The following discussions took place as per agenda.

1. CMPS Pension Issue in coal sector: Speakers elaborated that all those who retired after April 1994 are getting pension under CMPS 1998. They are eligible for revised pension, as all of them are covered by the same pension scheme. The problem is that pension fixation is done as per salary drawn at the time of retirement, and salary structure has undergone considerable changes in last 2 decades. This leads to disparity in pension fixation allowing higher pension to new retiree compared to old retiree. The members expressed that due to non-investment of our pension corpus in instruments yielding high returns, CMPF preferred to pay pension from current subscriptions. This led to exhaustion of pension corpus. The need of the hour is to augment in such a way that, payment of pension as well as strengthening of corpus fund, both are achieved. Without needful guidelines from Government, it will be difficult to achieve pension revision.



Review of past activities: The activities of AIACE Central body in general and Ranchi branch in particular, were discussed. Members were happy to note the co-operation being received from AIACE Central body. Sri A. K. Singh complimented all for successfully 2 massive Dharnas at Jantar-Mantar followed by a Dharna at Varanasi on 27-3-2023. These Dharnas will definitely lead to fulfilment of various demands.



3. Inauguration of Ranchi Coal Club: To allow social gatherings among ourselves, need for launch of our Ranchi Coal Club was explained by Sri P K Singh Rathor.. Accordingly, the

members proceeded for inaugurating this club. It was also agreed that the Ranchi Coal Club will be run by spouses of AIACE members and necessary guidelines will be issued by the central body for its operation.



4. Information about Creche Old Home Old age home: The matter of finding feasibility of establishing a Crèche Old Age Home in Ranchi-Jamshedpur region was discussed. A brief description of various models of old age home and cost involved were discussed. As this concept is still in nascent stage, it needs more interactions in future for arriving at any decision so that needy members may afford to lead a life with dignity and comfort.



5. Membership Drive: Members agreed to work for enhancing the membership drive. The ladies present in the meeting took challenge to add more members to AIACE.



6. Any other matter:

a) AIACE Members' Benevolent Fund -- Sri P K Singh Rathor said that launching of AIACE Members' Benevolent Fund at the Foundation day Function held at Bengaluru on 16th May 2022 is another remarkable achievement.

The Amount of Rs.10000 each as per the scheme is being given to spouses of deceased executives.



b) CPRMSE Issue -- Members decided to express their views on post-retirement medicare benefits. Members were concerned that many, not all, empanelled hospitals are extending CGHS rates to beneficiaries. Apparently, most hospitals have suspended CGHS rates in anticipation of likely enhancement of CGHS rates. A suggestion came to approach CIL for amendment in CPRMSE rules to allow an Indoor patient to avail treatment in other departments also even if those departments are not under empanelment of that hospital. This is required sometime, when a patient develops complications after being admitted in a particular department.



Sri A K Singh, General Secretary, Sri S S Ray, Vice- President, Sri H K Sinha Vice -President, Sri Ratnesh Kumar, Choudhary Arvind Kumar ans others alao spoke on this occasion.

Lastly cultural programme was organised with song, dance, poems, jokes and others by members. The member enjoyed the programme very much and decided to organise such function from time to time.
