Dear Readers,

I am glad to hand over the Year – 7, Volume-II, of AIACE Today in the hand of readers.

We have constantly improved the quality and content of the magazine over the past years. Our Association is vigorously working for resolution of pay conflict of executives with that of age board employee, by compensating the executives with personal pay so that salary of executives should not be less than that of wage board employees.

The major issues before retired coal executives and employees are revision of pension and hassle-free medical treatment. CIL has empaneled more than 500 hospitals including some of Apollo hospitals all across the country for treatment to serving and retired employees. This move of CIL is highly appreciated.

For pension revision, AIACE and AICPA have been working hard and regularly following up CIL/SCCL and coal ministry. The members of these associations organized a massive dharna before CIL office, Kolkata on 15th Septemeber,25 which was covered well by print and electronic media. The ministry of coal realised the urgency of pension revision and has proposed to bring bill for amendment of CMPF and MP, 1948. After passing of the bill, the new Act will come into force which will take care of provident fund pension issue. After this, Govt will bring amendment in CMPS,1998 for strengthening fund position for addressing the issue of meagre pension to old retirees.

CIL and SCCL have already increased the levy @ Rs 20/te on non-coking coal and Rs 10/te on coking coal. Our association is demanding 1 % of coal price /te for pension fund. This will ensure perpetuity of the pension fund and no shortage as being flashed by CMPFO.

We are committed for pension enhancement and adding Dearness Relief (DR) along with fixed pension.

Lastly, our association is working over an innovative idea for creating a joint family system of Coal Indians and members of AIACE in cities like Bengaluru, Kolkata, Hyderabad, Delhi- NCR, Pune and other locations named AIACE FAMILY. The groups have been formed in which members and their sons/daughters are being included. This group will be very useful in the days to come.

With these words, I am handing over the magazine to our readers.

## CHAPTER-I

### PREAMBLE

ALL INDIA ASSOCIATION OF COAL EXECUTIVES (AIACE) was formed on 16/5/2015 by Sri P K Singh Rathor, Sr Manager (IED), SECL Korba Area. He had announced on 1/5/2015 that if Coal Mines Officers Association of India (CMOAI) fails to resolve the issue of PRP and others, he would resign from CMOAI wef 16/5/2016. Sri Rathor resigned from CMOAI on 16/5/2015 as PRP and other issues of working and retired executives were not resolved. With the consent of like-minded officers of SECL Korba Area and support from other executives from CIL/SCCL, it was announced regarding formation of new association of coal executives named AIACE.

#### **Our Vision**

To become an association of Coal Executives growing in size and influence by being held in high regard by the membership, with a high level of loyalty and activism.

#### **Our Mission**

To be regarded by members as the best trade union through excellence of services and representatives, positive influence upon employers and governments in pursuit of aims and values of trade unions.

#### **Our Values**

Commitment, Competence, Democracy, Equality, Transparency & Solidarity.

#### **Aims and objectives of the association:-**

1. To act as an effective channel of communication between the Executives and Management and appropriate govt to sort out Executives' grievances.
2. To ensure career growth of the executives by way of
  - a. rational and scientific promotion policy.
  - b. open system of annual performance appraisals.
3. To achieve high level of pay scales/allowances/incentives/PRP /pension, which shall be compatible to the paying organizations in private /public sectors.
4. To get introduced incentive schemes for acquiring and improving educational / professional qualifications of all the executives.
5. To improve the work culture of the organisation so as to ensure its growth and development.
6. To foster a spirit of fellowship, solidarity and co-operation among Association

members.

7. To co-ordinate with CPSU executives federations of India or any other such association in the area of mutual interests and benefits.

8. To organize seminars/conferences on subjects like effective management with the warmth of human relations, productivity, national integration, participative management, etc.

9. To encourage executives to participate in events like sports, publications of articles on various subjects, attending seminars/courses and other activities that will earn name for the organisation.

5. Treasurer : 1
6. Jt Treasurer: 1
7. Executive committee members:-- 2% of total membership of branch .

### **3) CENTRAL LEVEL :--**

There will be formed a Central Executive Committee with the following Set up :-

1. President : 1
2. Vice-President: 2
3. Principal General Secretary : 1
4. Joint Principal General Secretary: 2

5. Treasurer : 1
6. Jt Treasurer: 1
7. Executive committee members:-- 0.5 % of total membership at central level.

**Convenor** :-- There will be one post of Convenor in Central Committee. He may be nominated from one of the office bearers of Central Executive committee. The duty of Convenor will be overall growth of association and he will work for expansion of membership, liaisoning with similar organizations and others as per need and situation.

**Membership:--**

**Eligibility:--**

i ) **Ordinary Members** : An executive employed in coal mines will be eligible to become a member of the Association provided he/she declares to abide by the bye-laws of the Association and has paid the membership admission fee and the periodic subscription to be decided by respective Executive Committee.

ii) **Advisory Members** : Any superannuated/ retired Executive from Coal mines , upon retirement shall be admitted as Advisory Member and shall be referred as AM provided he/she declares to abide by the bye-laws of the Association and has paid the membership admission fee and the periodic subscription to be decided by Executive Committee .

**Admission and membership fee:-**

Application for admission for ordinary membership shall be submitted online through website of association for its consideration and approval. Membership will be given online if the applicant is found eligible as per membership norm.

Any executive shall need to apply in the prescribed form uploaded in the website and at other places. The membership shall be effective from the date of approval.

The membership fee will be as below for time being and can be revised by Central Executive Committee.

a. One Time registration fee:

- (i) Ordinary/Advisory Members : - Rs 5000/-
- (ii) Associate members: - NIL

b. Annual Subscription :-

- (i) Ordinary/Advisory Members : - Rs 500/-
- (ii) Associate members: - NIL

In case any member wishes to make advance payment for membership fee for 12 months, he shall pay only for ten months ie Rs 500/towards membership fee.

Any member defaulting to pay membership/Subscription / levy for six months will cease to be a member of the Association. But they can be readmitted after fresh registration.

## CHAPTER-II

### JOURNEY OF AIACE

ALL INDIA ASSOCIATION OF COAL EXECUTIVES(AIACE) was formed on 16/5/2015 by Sri P K Singh Rathor, Sr Manager(IED), SECL Korba Area. He had announced on 1/5/2015 that if Coal Mines Officers Association of India (CMOAI) fails to resolve the issue of PRP and others, he would resign from CMOAI wef 16/5/2015. Sri Rathor resigned from CMOAI on 16/5/2015 as PRP and other issues of working and retired executives were not resolved. With the consent of like-minded officers of SECL Korba Area and support from other executives from CIL/SCCL, it was announced regarding formation of new association of working and retired coal executives named AIACE.

Sri Rathor made first visit to Asansol in first week of June and visited some of areas of ECL and met with many executives to explain the compelling situation for formation of AIACE. In fact, executives of ECL field became the nucleus of AIACE and they readily formed the Asansol Branch of AIACE.

The story of AIACE, Asansol branch is very unique and most unforgettable. A meeting on 6th June, 2015 was planned in CMPDIL, RI-I club that day and due permission was obtained from RD, RI-I, Asansol unit. All the arrangements like seating arrangements, banner placements, dias arrangements were done. About 20 to 25 members turned up for the meeting but in the last moment, we were denied permission for the meeting due to excessive pressure from CMOAI, ECL HQ to foil the meeting.



But we succeeded in arranging a small meeting at Shristinagar, Asansol where 5 to 6 members turned up.



It is worth to recall that our Convenor Sri P K Singh Rathor had told the then RD, RI-I of CMPDIL, Asansol to wait for 5 years to see the impact of AIACE. Today the AIACE, Asansol team is doing excellently and most powerful Branch having highest membership strength .This was possible only due to the joint efforts of all the members.



After that Sri Rathor had toured Dhanabad, Ranchi, Delhi, Patna, Bhubneshwar, Nagpur, Talcher, Sambalpur, Kothagudem (Telangana), Varanasi, Mumbai, Bangalore, Singrauli, Durgapur, Chandrapur and other places.

The association was registered under The Trade Union Act with Chhatisgarh Govt and the registration no is 546 dated 24/5/2016. It has got permanent account no. (PAN) with no. as AAEEAA7978E. The registration and permanent account numbers, an association must have for collecting any subscription from members, otherwise the collection of any amount may be treated as illegal.

In the last 6 years, AIACE conducted meetings each in Kolkata, Asansol, Dhanabad, Ranchi, Delhi, Bilaspur, Bengaluru ,Nagpur, Samabalpur, Talcher, Patna, Bhubnewshar, Mandamari (SCCL), Kothagudem (SCCL) , Hyderabad ,Jabalpur ,Mumbai, Bhopal and other smaller meetings in different areas of Coal India and Singreni collieries from time to time.

AIACE has charted out core issues concerning working and retired executives of CIL and SCCL. Its representatives are meeting parliamentarians. state legislators and govt officials for pressing their issues for solution.

It is working over one major issue for enhancement of pension. Coal pensioners are apprehending that they may not get pension in future, if something concrete is not done at the moment. The working executives and employees will be the worst sufferer if the issue of pension is not addressed properly.

## **AIACE MEMBERS BENEVOLENT FUND SCHEME**

### **OBJECTIVE & MODALITIES**

- i) **Name:** This scheme shall be run by AIACE under the name “AIACE Members’ Benevolent Fund”
- ii) **Date of start of the scheme:** The scheme shall start from 16th May, 2022 i.e., the date of birth of AIACE.
- iii) **Objectives:** To afford financial assistance to Spouse of a Member subject to the death of a Member who has made regular annual contribution to AIACE for the last 3 consecutive years.
- iv) **Definitions:**
  - a) “Spouse” means widow/widower without involving any controversy/litigation
  - b) “Fund” means AIACE Members Benevolent Fund.
- v) **Eligible Members for the fund:**
  - a) All Ordinary and Advisory active members of AIACE who have renewed their Membership by paying required membership.
  - b) All Honorary members of AIACE who are exempted from paying any renewal fee
- vi) **Source of the Benevolent Fund:**  
Source for Benevolent fund shall be provided by AIACE out of Subscription revenue generated from Members.
- vii) **Operations of Benevolent fund:**
  - a) AIACE shall approve assistance to be given in each individual case. Presently, the financial assistance in case of death is limited to Rs 10000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only)
  - b) Further, AIACE will have the privilege to review this limit of Grant subject to the viability.
- viii) **Remittances to beneficiaries:**  
Remittances to beneficiaries shall be made by local body of AIACE, in cash as far as possible or online as deemed fit and certify it for record and reference.

In cases where it is more expedient, the Convener may adopt other means of remittance. Any incidental expenditure incurred during payment of the amount to the spouse of the deceased executives shall be borne by AIACE.

On 16<sup>th</sup> May, 2022 AIACE Foundation Day celebrations at Bengaluru, the AIACE MEMBERS’ BENEVOLENT FUND SCHEME was launched by our Convener Sri P K Singh Rathor by unveiling it digitally. A brochure giving details of the Scheme and the activities and achievements of AIACE was released and Dr. B. K. Shrivastav, who explained the salient features of the Scheme through a PowerPoint Presentation.

## CHAPTER – IV

### PROPOSED CRECHE OLD HOME: AN INITIATIVE OF AIACE



### OBJECTIVE & MODALITIES

#### Introduction

Creche Old Home is a modern concept of joint family. It is an attempt to give feeling of community living as was found in joint family system in which collectiveness prevails upon individuality.

The home will provide the retired coal executives /senior citizens, care like a child ie the person concerned will be free from any type of anxiety and will be provided entertainment, quality life, food, clothing and shelter by maintaining uniformity in the service. They will be provided world class facility within a boundary without involvement of other agency and will be managed by the inhabitants themselves.

It will be not for profit homes run by the members themselves. These homes will be leased homes till life and no ownership will be legally provided. The home will be used by the members till life of husband and wife and after death of both.

#### Objective of Creche Old Home

1. To construct cottages/flats for the members of AIACE at no profit no loss under brand name Creche Old Home at the selected places as per demand of members.
2. To maintain and run the Creche Old Home with the financial support of the inhabitants with high end facility as per suggestion of members.
3. To allot the cottage/flat to members only. The member means husband and wife both if alive otherwise any of the survivor.
4. To negotiate, purchase land for the Creche Old Home with land owner/developer/builder and others.
5. To negotiate with service providers like security, medical services, house-keeping and others as per situation and demand and enter into agreement.
6. To negotiate with institutions/organisations to provide expert services through the members of AIACE and inhabitants of Creche Old Home.
7. To Provide Creche Old facility to the members who are above 60 years of age but who opt for the facility before 55 years of age.
8. To transfer the amount without interest given by the members for availing Creche Old Home facility to the next kith and kin as per nomination in case of death of members (both husband and wife).
9. Any other as per need and circumstances.

---

**Membership**

Only AIACE members will be provided home. Initially, for availing the home facility, all retired coal executives are entitled but once the home is constructed and become functional, the desirous members will have to take membership at least 5 years before retirement. The retired executives will not be entitled to automatic membership but their credentials and social aptitude will be verified first.

AIACE has envisaged Not for Profit old age homes, to be run by members themselves on leased basis.

**Size of home**

It will be 1 BHK cottage with world class facility to provide luxurious life to members for another 25-30 years after retirement. It will be a self-contained home for husband and wife with dry kitchen only. The main kitchen will be housed in another hall, where food will be cooked and served in the hall.

There will be another halls as common room, activity room and others with about 60% of the area will be open. Minimum standards will be decided for running the home. Periodic assessment of the standards will be based on the changing needs of the elderly and AIACE.

It will be inside the gated boundary. The manpower line security, driver, cook, gardener and others working in the home will be provided accommodation within the campus.

Locations of the homes- Kolkata, Ranchi, Bilaspur, Bengaluru, Delhi NCR, Pune, Haridwar, Varanasi, Mathura, Vrindavan, Nagpur, Dhanbad, Bhubaneswar and at other places on the basis of demand and sufficient numbers.

Initially, it will be started with 25 cottages which may be extended to maximum 100 cottages at one place.

**Preference to Beneficiary**

This home is primarily meant for those retired executives whose sons/daughters/other relatives do not stay with them normally and only guests occasionally visit for a very short period. The guests of the inhabitants will be accommodated in other cottages to maintain privacy and 10% cottages will be reserved for guests.

Ultimate cost of the cottage- it will include land, development and construction cost of cottage and periphery and cost will be variable for different cities and locations.

Day's engagement- All inhabitants will be fully engaged in inside activities from 6 am to 6 pm like walking, yoga, gardening, singing, dancing, experience sharing, writing, worshipping etc. It is envisaged that the senior citizens will be kept busier than what they had been during active service life.

Hospitals and doctors will be tied up for emergency treatment.

**Social work**

Inhabitant will be encouraged for social work like free coaching to students, women empowerment, health and hygiene training in nearby locality.

Also, tie-up will be made with corporate houses for availing the expert service of the inhabitants for resolving technical, social and other issues

Local coal clubs of the cities will be housed in the home.

## Productivity improvement in Coal Mines – Role of AI

### Abstract

The coal production in India in 2024-25 is 1047.57 MT in comparison to 997.83 MT in 2023-24 from all the sources ie Coal India Ltd, Singreni Collieries company Ltd, captive mines and other private players. The major producer of coal in the country is CIL and it is also one of the largest coal producers of the world which produced 781.06 MT of coal which is about 74.52 % of total Indian coal production. This paper focuses on adoption of latest technologies including AI for productivity enhancements in open-cast mine.

### 1. Introduction

Presently, coal accounts for approximately 74% of the total power generation and 55% of the national energy mix. Coal is expected to remain the primary energy source, with its share projected to not dip below 40% until at least 2070 (Blinova et al., 2023). This study aims to evaluate the impact of introduction of latest as well as high capacity technology in opencast mines for increasing production & productivity, decreasing environmental impact, reducing accidents etc.

### 2. Literature Review

The mining operations are undergoing drastic changes for efficiency improvement through the adoption of advanced smart mining technology, as emphasized by Xie et al. (2010). The adoption of latest technology allows mining companies to automate different production processes as well as information system. Adoption of technology ensures increase in productivity, reduction of downtime of machines, proper loading of machines in case of breakdown, cost reduction, improvement in safety standards. Incorporating remote-controlled or autonomous mining vehicles (by Zhang et al. 2016), eliminates human involvement in hazardous tasks, thereby reducing the risk of accidents. As discussed by Johnstone and Hielscher (2017), chirp facilitates data exchange, aids in location determination, and enhances communication and coordination within mining operations. Mining companies worldwide are investing in the digital transformation of their operations aligning with the observations of Liu et al. (2016).

### 3 Technology adoption in coal mining

#### 3.1 Mining 4.0 technologies

- ❖ **Cloud mining**— It integrates the core business of the mine such as production and operation mgt, mining technology, planning services into cloud through effective use of cloud technology, cloud resources and cloud services.
- ❖ **Artificial intelligence**- Artificial Intelligence (AI) is revolutionizing coal mining by optimizing operations, enhancing safety, and improving efficiency. Through advanced algorithms and machine learning techniques, AI systems analyze vast amounts of data collected from

sensors, drones, and other IoT devices to predict equipment failures, streamline logistics, and optimize resource extraction.

- ❖ **Internet of things**-It enables things equipped with RFID sensors, actuators and mobile devices to interact with each other and work collaborate towards reaching common goals.
- ❖ **Drone**— Drone is used for 3D Mapping of mine environment, quality control of drilling and blasting, state of coal deposit and monitoring the sustainability of tailing
- ❖ **Virtual Reality**- VR is generated by software and audio-visual transmission. It is about the recreation of aspect of real life in these recreations, users feel inside them. The usefulness lies in possibility of performing simulation and education.
- ❖ **Augmented Reality**- It allows remote inspection and assistance by experts who are remote to machinery, equipment, processing plants among others. It is also possible to carryout maintenance and repairs assisted by experts who remotely guide less experienced personnel in carrying out what is necessary step by step.
- ❖ **Intelligent logistic system**- An intelligent logistic system in coal mining integrates cutting-edge technologies to streamline operations and optimize efficiency throughout the supply chain. Utilizing advanced algorithms and real-time data analytics, it coordinates the movement of materials, equipment, and personnel seamlessly, enhancing productivity and safety. Automated processes such as predictive maintenance for machinery and dynamic routing for transportation ensure minimal downtime and maximum resource utilization.
- ❖ **Machine vision**—Machine vision opens up new ways to automate mining enterprises that are being upgraded to Mining 4.0 platform by integrating traditional mining equipment and robotics, traditional human decision making and their adjustment by machine to optimize processes.
- ❖ **Remote sensing**- Remote sensing is very useful for topographical survey of mine and mining operation, measurement of progress of operations, blasting, slope monitoring, inspection of dump and deposits, transportation of tolls and artifacts as well security inspection.
- ❖ **Enterprise Resource planning (ERP)** - It is designed to integrate and efficiently employ all of organizational resources. There is a connection with big data. By employing ERP, real time data can be evaluated and allow for early detection.

#### 4. Case Study

The chosen case study revolves around a prominent coal company in India which holds a significant position, meeting a substantial portion of the country's coal demand.

1. *Monitoring of vehicle movement*- The coal is dispatched to consumer through rail, road, and merry go round and conveyor belt. The coal is transported from mine to railway siding by trucks and by conveyor belt to silos for dispatch through rail. All the trucks have been fitted with GPS sensors and their movements are tracked from control room. This has increased the effectiveness in the system. Earlier, for monitoring of vehicle movement, a large number of manpower was engaged. The monitoring by using GPS has resulted in lesser deployment of manpower.
2. *Geo fencing of mine boundary and designated routes*— *Geo fencing of mine boundary has been done to restrict entry and exit of unauthorized vehicle, coal carrying trucks.* In case of any encroachment, signals are generated to make the concerned persons alert and for taking suitable real-time action. The mine has been able to control the pilferage of coal and other consumables.

3. *Freight Operations Information system (FOIS) connectivity* – It has been installed in different railway sidings for transferring weighment data from in-motion rail weigh bridge instantly to railway server in coordination with railway. This is a tamper proof system of weighment and data transfer. The mine has been able to reduce the loading time and turnaround time.
4. *CCTV surveillance*- CCTV have been installed at coal stocks, weigh bridges, mine entry-exit barrier, railway siding, explosive magazine, coal sampling/crushing points for e-surveillance. Now, the man-power and person requirement of the PQR company for performing this work has reduced and due to this OMS of the mine has increased.
5. *Deployment of high capacity HEMM*—The mines used to deploy lower capacity dumpers of 50/60 Te capacity and now is deploying 240 Te dumpers which is capable of moving larger volume of coal/OB in comparison to previously used dumpers. This has drastically reduced the deployment of dumper operators. Similarly, the company has deployed 42 M3 shovels and 381 mm drills for faster evacuation of coal an OB with lesser manpower, lesser fuel/power consumption and increased safety.
6. The mine has deployed in-pit crushing and carrying of coal by belt substantially which has reduced deployment of dumpers.as increased he safety of man and machine.
7. Establishment of Control and command Centre—The company has established control and command center at its corporate HQ and production areas for real time monitoring and control of activities. This has reduced the deployment of manpower substantially.
8. Implementation of SAP/ERP- The company has implemented SAP/ERP and integrated all its activities viz finance, HR, Material, project and others.

## 5. Results and Conclusions

After introduction of the technology, the mine has been able to increase production, productivity and reduce accidents. The morale of the employees has also gone high.

After introduction of latest technology, following Jobs are likely to see significant increases

- Drone Operators (short term)
- Industrial Internet of Things (IIoT) sensor design (mineral identification, environmental monitoring, etc.)
- Highly skilled Maintenance Techs
- Network Administrators
- System Integrators
- Algorithms for planning, routing, traffic management, blend optimization
- Analytics and Reporting

*The company is likely to face shortage of skilled manpower in near future and company must gear up to meet this shortage.*

## 5. Future Trend

Automation of mining operations reduces cost, increase safety and productivity. There will be heavy reliance on remotely controlled HEMMs like excavator, dumpers, dozers, drills by employing location awareness, Artificial intelligence, machine learning.

The use of sensors and IoT technologies to monitor machines and equipment facilitates automatic stopping if necessary to prevent accidents. Workforce of the future mines should have knowledge in computer science and engineering, statistics, coding, managing database, system integration, analytics, data visualization, hard-core math (AI/ML), etc. will be the skills most probably appreciated in future mining industry. This is a perfect instance of new jobs that will be created due to mine digitization and automation. The miner would be able to solve problems directly at the source by remotely interacting with other operators, experts, and customers in multi-competent teams.

### MINUTES OF GENERAL BODY MEETING ON 7TH SEPTEMBER 2025

A General Body Meeting of AIACE was held on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2025 on ZOOM. Dr. B. K. Srivastav Vice-President, AIACE, presided over the meeting that was attended by about 30 members. The meeting started at 7:00 PM, The agenda for the meeting was as under:

1. Presentation of Accounts for the Calendar year 2024 and Financial Year 2024-25
2. AIACE Activities and Action in the year 2024 and up to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2025
3. Future course of action
4. Any other matter

Due to lack of the required quorum, the meeting was adjourned for 10 minutes and was reconvened.

Sri R A Manjunath Prasad read out the Accounts for the Calendar Year 2024 and Financial Year 2024-25 highlighting the salient points. Sri Kasi Viswanathan enquired why accounts are being prepared for calendar year as well as Financial Year. Sri P K Singh Rathor clarified that accounts for the calendar year are to be prepared as per the bye-laws of the Association and for submission to the Labour Department. Accounts for the Financial Year are to be prepared under statutory provisions and for submission to Income Tax Department.

After due deliberation and discussion with all the members, the Annual Accounts and Audit Reports for the Calendar Year 2024 and Financial Year 2024-25 were approved and adopted unanimously by the General Body of AIACE.

Dr. B. K. Srivastav spoke about the activities of AIACE. Two meetings were held at the Ministry of Coal regarding revision of pension. However, in spite of the assurances given to us that the necessary amendments to Coal Mines Pension Scheme would be tabled during the monsoon session of the Parliament, the issue has not been taken up. Therefore, AIACE is going ahead with the proposed Dharna at CIL HQs, Kolkata on 15<sup>th</sup> September 2025 to get a commitment in writing regarding revision of pension, pay conflict, enhancement of domiciliary payment under CPRMSE, clubbing of CPRMS for both executives and non-executives, PRP and NPS

coverage to non-executives and issue of revised PPOs. CIL had said that the domiciliary payment of Rs.36,000 under CPRMSE would be increased. But based on the actuary's report no order has been issued and no further information is forthcoming. Under the AIACE Benevolent Scheme, so far 42 payments have been made to widows of deceased members and the scheme is running smoothly. Several issues regarding Pension have been resolved. SBI, Dhanbad has been made the Nodal Bank for disbursement of Pension and henceforth Life Certificate for pension is to be sent to SBI, Dhanbad. Kerala and Nagpur Branches are very active in settling widow pension cases. In fact, Nagpur Branch has covered several cases of SECL also.

Sri R A Manjunath Prasad informed that Branch wise list of volunteers for Dharna at CIL HQs, Kolkata on 15<sup>th</sup> September 2025 is being updated regularly with details of their arrival and departure to facilitate arrangements.

Sri Rathor explained the action taken about revision of pension, issue of revised PPOs, empanelment of hospitals. After receiving the notice of Dharna, CIL tried to have a meeting with AIACE on the subject of Pay Conflict. However, after consultation with our members, Convenor rejected the request and we will go ahead with the proposed Dharna for which Kolkata Branch has already made necessary arrangements. About 350 to 400 members from all over India are expected to attend. Accommodation has been arranged for outstation members at a Guest House near CIL HQ. Local police have been informed about the Dharna and it has been noted by New Town Police Station,

Kolkata. The Police Inspector of the Station sought details of the issues from Sri. N C Sarkar, President,

Kolkata Branch and Sri P K Singh Rathor, Convenor, AIACE. A final meeting will be held on 10<sup>th</sup> September 25 to review the situation. Alphabetical branch-wise list of members is to be printed for easy registration of the delegates.

Sri Ram Narain Som and Sri Nilanjan Adhikary assured that members of Asansol Branch will participate in the Dharna in large numbers for which buses have been arranged.

Sri S N Singh said that there are still 913 cases of NPS that are not settled. He also asked what is the future course of action on 478 cases of Revised PPOs sent by us. Since there is no progress on these matters, we have to strongly protest during the Dharna.

Sri Pawan Tandon had filed an RTI Query regarding the fund transferred by CIL to CPRMSE Trust in the last 5 years. CIL has replied that this information cannot be revealed. Sri Tandon said that CIL is under the ambit of Right to Information Act and is bound to reveal

the requested data. He is approaching the appellate authority on this issue as CIL is mis-utilizing the funds.

Sri Nilkanth Sharma, Sri Ajay Kumar, Sri Ambika Chakraborty, Sri Bijon Chakraborty, Sri Anjani Kumar, Sri Ranjan Kumar Singh, Sri G R Srikantaiah, Sri Silvano Rodrigues and Smt. Gunavati Mohan Das expressed their solidarity with AIACE and wished for the success of the Dharna.

Tributes were paid to our departed members- Sri Muslim Ansari, Dr. Dinesh Chandra Gupta, Sri A P Singh and Sri K B P Singh.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by Sri. R. A. Manjunath Prasad.

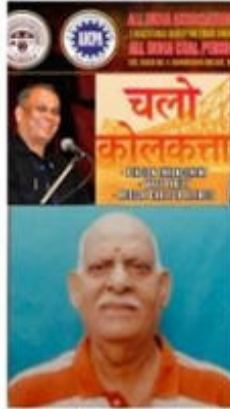

Union Coal and Mines Minister G Kishan Reddy on Friday said several ambitious steps are being taken to reshape the coal mining sector, which will give it a new condition and direction.

Speaking at the Central Coalfields Limited (CCL) headquarters in Ranchi, the minister inaugurated the Integrated Command and Control Centre (ICCC), a new system introduced, for the first time, in the coal sector. The ICCC will centralise live data from cameras, sensors, drones, and vehicle tracking systems to monitor coal mining activities in real time.

The minister shared the launch of the latest technology-based monitoring system on X.

The technology platform, based at CCL's Darbhanga House, is designed to improve safety, transparency, and operational efficiency. It includes features such as AI-based video analytics, GIS-enabled displays, customisable dashboards, and multi-channel alerting systems.

“This system will play an important role in making the monitoring and operation of coal mines more safe and transparent,” Reddy said.

The minister also announced that from September 17, coinciding with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's birthday and Labour Day, a uniform dress code will be mandatory for all coal sector employees, including CMDs. “All coal family will be seen in the same dress code,” he said.

On the issue of coal royalties, Reddy said the Centre has formed a committee to look into the state's claim of 1.36 lakh crore under coal royalty and other heads. The committee includes representatives from the state government, the Centre, and Coal India.

He also raised concerns about illegal mining and the resulting loss of lives, and said better coordination with the state government will be established to address the issue.

**On pending pension matters, the minister said Coal India will look into the concerns of retired employees. “They have been from the same coal family and are grossly unpaid so far as pension is concerned. Coal India will seriously look into it,” he said.**

अधिकारियों को गेट पर भेजा गया, जिसे संघ के प्रतिनिधियों ने सख्ती से अस्वीकार कर दिया। उन्होंने साफ कहा कि वे अध्यक्ष से नीचे किसी भी अधिकारी से बातचीत नहीं करेंगे।

कोरबा कोल इंडिया में बीते 27 वर्ष से पेंशन पुनरीक्षण नहीं हुआ है। इसके कारण कोयला कंपनियों के कई सेवानिवृत्त कर्मचारियों को एक हजार रूपए से भी कम पेंशन मिल रही है। कई शिकायतों के बाद भी मांग पूरी नहीं होने से कोल इंडिया के पेंशनर्स नाराज हैं। इसे लेकर पेंशनर्स ने कोल इंडिया मुख्यालय के समक्ष धरना प्रदर्शन किया। कोल इंडिया मुख्यालय के समक्ष सोमवार को आयोजित धरना प्रदर्शन में एसईसीएल सहित कोल इंडिया के अन्य सहायक कंपनियों से सेवानिवृत्त होने वाले अधिकारी और कर्मचारियों के साथ ही बड़ी संख्या में कार्यरत अधिकारी संगठन के लोग भी शामिल हुए। कोल इंडिया की



पेंशन स्कीम वर्ष 1998 में लागू हुई थी। कोल पेंशनर्स के पीएफ और पेंशन का प्रबंधन सीएमपीएफ के माध्यम से होता है। कोयला कर्मचारियों की शिकायत है कि नियमानुसार हर तीन साल में इसका संशोधन होना था, लेकिन पिछले 27 वर्षों के दौरान इसमें कोई बदलाव

नहीं हुआ। इसके कारण बड़ी संख्या में रिटायर्ड कोयला अधिकारियों और कर्मचारियों को आज भी काफी कम पेंशन राशि मिल रही है। जिसे लेकर पेंशनर्स में निराशा है। ऑल इंडिया एसोसिएशन ऑफ कोल पेंशनर्स और ऑल इंडिया एसोसिएशन ऑफ कोल एक्जीक्यूटिव्स ने इस मुद्दे पर

**कोल इंडिया में पांच लाख से अधिक पेंशन भोगी**

कोल इंडिया में पांच लाख से अधिक पेंशनभोगी हैं। वर्ष 2007 से पूर्व रिटायर हुए अधिकारी व कर्मचारियों को आज भी 1000 रूपए से कम पेंशन मिल रही है। पेंशन स्कीम में खामियां हैं और इसमें असमानता भी है। अब इसकी समीक्षा और सुधार जरूरी है। पेंशन पदाधिकारियों का कहना है कि कम से कम पांच साल में पेंशन पुनरीक्षण जरूरी है। इसके साथ ही राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर पेंशन ट्रस्ट का निर्माण जरूरी है।

सोमवार को कोल इंडिया मुख्यालय के सामने धरना प्रदर्शन किया। आंदोलकारी मुख्यालय की तरफ बढ़ रहे थे तो उन्हें पुलिस ने रोक दिया। पुलिस के आग्रह पर

प्रतिनिधिमंडल कोल इंडिया चेयरमैन से मिलने को तैयार हुआ, लेकिन प्रबंधन की ओर से कनिष्ठ अधिकारियों को ज्ञापन लेने भेजा गया। इसे लेकर संगठन के प्रतिनिधियों ने नाराजगी जाहिर करते हुए स्पष्ट किया कि वे चेयरमैन से नीचे के किसी अधिकारी से वार्ता या ज्ञापन सौंपने को तैयार नहीं हैं। इस आंदोलन में कोरबा एवं बिलासपुर क्षेत्र से पीके सिंह राठौर, डॉ. एस. मुरलीमोहन, सुभाष चंद्र सिन्हा, पीके शरण, एचके शर्मा, उमेश शर्मा, सुरेश वर्मा, श्यामलाल, संजय दास और अन्य शामिल हुए। आंदोलन में बड़ी संख्या में महिलाएं भी शामिल हुईं। एसोसिएशन के प्रधान संयोजक पीके सिंह राठौर का कहना है कि यह आंदोलन अधिकारियों और सेवानिवृत्त कर्मचारियों की लंबित मांगों की।

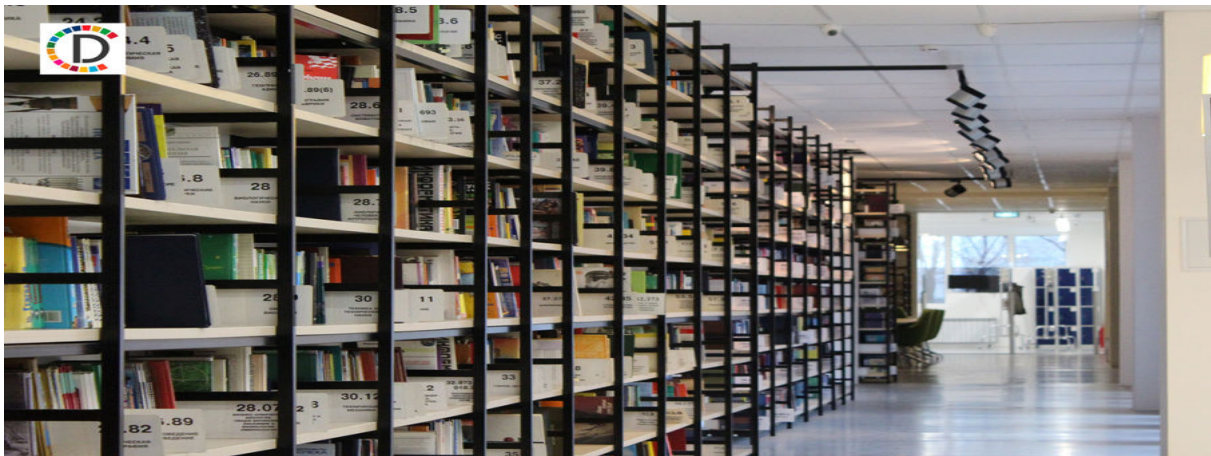

We welcome the recent decision of Union Government for announcing UPS for 23 lakhs union government employees. (vide PIB Release ID: 2048607 dated 24-8-2024).

Though, we are not beneficiaries under UPS, we feel proud that the government has largely borrowed the idea from CMPS-1998 Pension scheme, being implemented by the coal ministry This Coal Mines Pension Scheme (CMPS) 1998 was brought by NDA government under leadership of Late Atal Bihari Vajpayee j (Notified by Publication vide G.S.R. 123(E), dated 5.3.1998, published in the Gazette of India, Ext. Pt., I, Section 3(i), dated 5.3.1998). This scheme is effective wef 1/4/1994 ie for those who retires after April 1993 and had opted this scheme.

We wish to bring to your kind notice that the two pension schemes namely CMPS and UPS differ to some extent in a manner that UPS has provision of Inflation Indexation to provide dearness relief, whereas the pensioners under CMPS-1998 are deprived of it. Due to this drawback of our scheme, pension once fixed, remains stagnant over the years in spite of provision for review of scheme every three years and for enhancement of pension.

It is learnt that this CMPS-1998 is on way of recast. We shall be thankful to you for instructing the concerned authorities to examine and incorporate this feature of Inflation Inedxation along with enhancement of payable minimum pension to Rs 10000/- We may be permitted to submit a study prepared by us which speaks of the problem and its diagnosis for your kind perusal.

**Appendix****COAL MINERS' PENSION – TRAGEDY & REMEDY****PREAMBLE**

Coal Industry in India is recognised for its valuable contribution towards fulfilling primary energy needs of the country. Apart from its hazardous nature of work, it differs from other industries in the sense that its future growth is largely dependent on present day scientific mining and conservation of coal reserves. Public Sector Enterprises (PSEs) have struggled a lot to put the coal industry in track after its nationalization. Non-revision of pension speaks poor of coal industry and younger generation tend to avoid this sector.

**LAUNCH OF PENSION SCHEME**

Prior to independence on 15<sup>th</sup> August 1947, Coal mining in India was entirely under private sector. In the year 1948, Govt. of India, enacted Coal Mines Provident Fund Organization (CMPFO) to provide one-time post-retirement benefits, in the form of Provident Fund, to workers of coal industry. Presently, CMPFO is under administrative control of Coal Ministry. Scope of CMPFO was enlarged in 1971, under CMFPS-1971, to ensure pension to family of coal workers in case of demise during employment. In a revolutionary step, Pension for organized Industrial Workers were also allowed with its introduction in coal sector in 1998 by Vajpayee government. This was termed as (Contributory) Coal Mines Pension Scheme -1998 (CMPS-1998). It came into effect on 31st March, 1998 vide Notification No. G.S.R. 123 (E) dated. 5th March, 1998. It allowed membership from 1st April, 1994 and covers employees of CIL, SCCL, TISCO and Pvt mines.

**SALIENT FEATURES OF PENSION SCHEME**

Corpus for paying pension is created from,

- (i) Equal contribution by employee & employer, (Rate of contribution to Pension fund varied in 1971, 1998 & 2017)
- (ii) Government contribution @1.67% of employee basic pay (Max. 1600)
- (iii) Voluntary contribution of Welfare cess collected @Rs 10 per tonne of coal produced by PSU coal companies CIL & SCCL

Earnings on Corpus was envisaged to be utilized in paying pension. The pension is fixed based on last pay drawn and pension remains constant throughout the life of pensioner as, in spite of provisions, no review/revision since 1998 has been done. It is to be noted that, many are getting below pension below Rs.1000 p.m.

---

**REASONS FOR STAGNANT PENSION**
**Part – I : Role of Actuarial Reports**

An actuary is a professional who specializes in assessing and managing the financial risks associated with pension funds and insurance plans and determining whether funding is sufficient to meet pension obligations. After the implementation of the scheme in the year 1998, the actuarial valuation of the pension fund was to be done every 3 years but it has been done only in 2001, 2005, 2012 and 2013 but the recommendations were never implemented. Actuary has prepared need based interim reports and blames CMPFO for incomplete data. Actuaries' reports discuss 2 types of profits and losses, (i) "Notional" and (ii) Actual. "Notional" means imaginary and actual profit and loss is meant to explain the financial position. Projecting notional profit and loss and actual profit and loss gives pension fund investors a fair idea of the performance of their investments.

**Part – II : Reasons Highlighted by CAG/PAC Reports**

In Part I of the 12th report of Public Accounts Committee (PAC) No. 2193 report, under Section III.1.8 Net Deficit of CMPFO, the statement of Coal ministry is stated as under "There is no net deficit in Coal Mines Provident Fund Organization at the end of December 2019, only actuarial (notional) deficit exists."

In Part II of the 12th report of PAC No. 2193 report, under **Restructuring of Coal Mines Pension Scheme**, it is mentioned that, *"The Committee strongly express the need for undertaking a review exercise of the existing Pension scheme. It is imperative to revamp the scheme so as to enable in payments being commensurate with the contributions received. The Ministry in this regard is needed to guide CMPFO in strengthening the fund through appropriate measures/amendments."*

The same report contains Action Taken by the Government on the Observations/Recommendations of the Committee and it is stated that, *"For the sustainability of fund, Ministry is working on multipronged strategy viz. capping of maximum pension, extension of period for arriving average salary for fixation of pension and appointment of actuary to suggest further measure for sustainability of fund."*

Findings of CAG report which are accepted by government in Parliament in 2019 can be summarized as:

- i) Stringent Internal Audit
- ii) Element of Transparency- Single Instrument
- iii) Restructuring of CMPS-1998
- iv) Regular Appointment of Actuary

**STATUS OF REFORMS**

So far, lack of appropriate measures have prevented speedy implementation on suggestions contained in this PAC report. Even pensioners have failed to draw government's attention for intervention. For obtaining speedy resolution, in a parallel move, Federation of Retired Employees Association & Others, approached Supreme Court vide W.P. 88 of 2015 from where the case got transferred to Delhi High Court vide W.P.(C) 3118/2015 and is still undecided.

**REQUIRED REFORMS BASED ON CAG REPORT AND UPS:**

- i) Immediate Restructuring of present CMPS-1998 with a better scheme
- ii) Immediate review and enhancement of pension linked with Dearness Relief (DR)
- iii) If needed, compulsory welfare cess of 1% on selling price of coal
- iv) Expansion of CMPF Trustee Board to include Persons who are Investment experts.
- v) Coal Ministry officials are given free hand to overrule BoT obstructions.
- vi) To ensure Actuary report every 3 years

### INFLATION AND PROPOSED PENSION ENHANCEMENT BY LINKING IT WITH CPI

Under pension scheme governed by CMPS-1998, amount of pension once fixed remains unchanged throughout the life of a pensioner. As such, effect of inflation of rupee over the years is not added to this pension amount, and the handsome pension fixed in the beginning loses its money value considerably over the years.

The inflation rate in India between 1995 and 2022 was 460.53%, as per data available at <https://www.inflationtool.com/indianrupee?amount=100&year1=1998&year2=2022&frequency=yearly>.

This means that 100 rupees in 1995 are equivalent to 560.53 rupees in 2022. The average annual inflation rate between these periods was 6.59%, where in 1995 CPI was 25.4 which changed to 142.37 in 2022.

Hence, it is proposed to provide relief to existing surviving pensioners at a rate of 6.59% of pension being drawn for every year of survival.

That means, a surviving pensioner of 1994-95 getting a stagnant pension of Rs 1100 pm, needs Rs 6100-Rs 1100= Rs 5000 pm. for 100% neutralization of inflation.

So, for all the surviving pensioners since 1994-95, this will require Rs 405 Cr per annum (less than 10% of pension outflow in 2021-22).

#### EXPLANATION OF ABOVE TABLE FOR ESTIMATING SURVIVING PENSIONERS IN 2021-22:

In 2021-22, No. of pensioners = 6.06 lakhs (approx.) which include pensioners surviving pensioners over the years since 1994-1995.

Considering the mortality rate among elders in India, the above Table is obtained.

Thus, in the year 1994-1995, there were estimated 5000 (Column-6), out of which at an age of 85 years in 2021-22, a total of 50 pensioners (Column-7) are estimated to be estimated to be alive 27 years after 1994-95, considering a mortality rate of 99%.

Thereafter, next year in 1995-96, 330 pensioners were added and with respective mortality rate of 98% at an age of 86 years in 2020-21, there are 7 pensioners estimated to be alive 26 years after 1995-96.

Similarly, surviving pensioners for all the subsequent years till 2021-22 have been estimated.

#### ASSESSMENT OF FUND AVAILABILITY FOR INTRODUCING PENSION ENHANCEMENT

This additional requirement of fund of Rs 405 crores can be had by one of the following ways:

- 1) Levying welfare cess on per tonne selling price of coal by CIL and SCCL, or
- 2) CIL and SCCL can earmark nominal percentage of profit before tax
- 3) Strengthening corpus fund whose investment will return a minimum Rs 405 crores

**1) Levying welfare cess**

Coal Production of CIL in 2020-21 was 754 Million Tonne

Cess generated by levy of Rs 10 per tonne of coal, Rs 754 Crore per year which is more than required Rs 405 crores

NOTE - Four of the Electricity Discom companies are levying a cess of 3.8% on consumers to strengthen the pension fund. This step has been upheld by Delhi High Court in 2020.

**2) Earmarking nominal percentage of profit before tax**

*CIL and SCCL can earmark nominal percentage of profit before tax for the pension fund on the lines of post-retirement medical scheme CPRMSE (guidelines of DPE).*

**3) Strengthening the corpus fund****(i) Actual increment in place of Notional increment of employees**

In place of Notional increment, let CIL and SCCL transfer the actual annual increment of employees year on year from 1/7/95 to 30/9/2017 on actual basis. This could fetch more than Rs 10000 crore which may strengthen pension fund.

**(ii) Transfer of 9.84% of salary of on roll non-executive employees (as on 31-12-2006) to CMPS-1998 corpus fund**

It is suggested that matching 9.84% of salary of non-executive employees, who were on roll of the company as on 31/12/2006, be earmarked and transferred to CMPS-1998 corpus fund. This will add another Rs 20000 crore to CMPS-1998 corpus fund for ensuring sustainability.

**(iii) Executives joining on or after 1-1-2007 be allowed only New Pension Scheme with liabilities removed from CMPS-1998**

- Apart from pension under CMPS-1998, w.e.f. 1.1.2007 the Executives are covered by pension under NPS (with 9.84 % of salary as superannuation benefit). This NPS corpus is more than 2000 cr.
- This fund towards those in-service members, who have joined CIL/SCCL and other involved organizations before 31/12/2006, could be transferred to CMPS-1998.

**Comment:** As per CMPF Act & CMPS-1998, this may not be possible as it is mandatory for every employee to be covered by CMPS-1998. Since NPS is part of Executive Pay Revision approved by the President of India such discrimination may not be possible.

**(iv) Utilization of Suspense account fund blocked due to non-settlement of pension**

- Out of available pension fund corpus, about 3%-5% unclaimed amount is remaining idle
- Due to cumbersome process for starting widow pension, more than 10% spouses could not claim their legitimate CMPS pension
- Moreover, in Suspense account, due to non-settlement of pension, more than Rs 2000 crore is lying idle with CMPFO. It can be also utilized

**(v) Transfer of CMPF trust fund to CIL and SCCL to be managed by themselves which will minimize expenses on Administrative charges**

It is suggested to transfer of CMPF trust fund to CIL and SCCL to be managed by themselves which will minimize expenses on Administrative charges. This is another viable option as these companies can manage this fund.

**(vi) Contractor workers with ensured minimum wages be mandatorily covered under CMPS-1998**

Real count of contractor workers should be taken and they should be mandatorily covered under CMPS-1998. Minimum wages should be as per High power committee recommendations.

All these suggested measures could yield a one-time increase of pension fund by Rs 30000 crores from the present Rs 13000 crores.

**CONCLUSION**

This is merely a study to examine the feasibility of pension enhancement. Our assumed figures for pension enhancement is, in no way connected to our conclusions. These values, including arrear payment, if any, can be decided scientifically at a later stage. Certainly, necessary urgent reforms are required to overhaul the ministry's approach, prioritize the welfare of retired coal miners, and ensure that their rightful pension benefits are promptly and fairly revised. It is a pity that, pensioners in coal sector are not asking for any mercy but, requesting compensating the loss of corpus and rightful returns out of their own contributions as per CMPS-1998 scheme's commitments which have been betrayed.

Sub: Request to take up the issue of coal pensioners with the Minister of Coal so that their pension can be enhanced

Hon'ble Sir,

We represent the All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA), an association of serving and retired coal officers and employees of Coal India Limited and Singareni Collieries Company Limited. We work closely with our sister association, namely All India Association of Coal Executives (AICE), which comprises serving and retired officers belonging to CIL and SCCL and their widowed spouses as members.

These coal sector employees are covered under the pension scheme called CMPS-1998, and the fund management is done by CMPFO under the Ministry of Coal, Govt. of India. This CMPS-1998 scheme has been the subject of criticism and scrutiny, as is evident from the 12<sup>th</sup> Report No. 2193 of the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) presented in Parliament on March 18, 2020.

The CMPS-1998 was notified on March 31, 1998, and the drawback of this scheme is that once the pension is fixed, it remains stagnant for years despite the provision for review of the scheme every three years and enhancement of pension.

It is to bring to your notice that many pensioners are getting less than Rs 1000 per month despite working in dirty environments for long hours to meet the energy needs of the country. Even the highest Board level and below Board level officials, who retired prior to 2007, are receiving meagre pensions, which are inadequate to lead a comfortable life. For Singareni Collieries Company Limited, the situation is even worse as the pensioners living outside the coalfield area are deprived of any medical benefits after retirement.

The present growth of the coal industry is mainly due to the conservation of coal reserves, which was carefully done by the same employees who are currently pensioners. CIL and SCCL are unable to help these retired employees, who are now pensioners, as they do not have the authority to handle and disburse pensions. It is a bitter truth that past decisions and present indecision have made the increase in pension for the pensioners a nightmare and a distant dream, as many elderly pensioners depart for heavenly abode every year. In view of these facts, we request your intervention in the matter so that the pension of these pensioners may be revised and increased by the concerned authorities without any further delay. We request to apprise Hon'ble Union Coal Minister to find an amicable solution to this complex issue.

We wish to recall meeting held at Shastri Bhawan on 25-2-2025 with the representatives of AIACE/AICPA with you and Ms Santosh, DDG on the issue of sustainability of fund and enhancement of pension to retirees in coal sector under CMPS-1998.

The analysis shows that from 2049-50 onwards, Pension fund will be in surplus. It implies that enhancement in Pension is possible and Surplus in pension fund can be also advanced by increasing welfare cess.
