

CHAPTER-V AIACE IN ACTION



ALL INDIA ASSOCIATION OF COAL EXECUTIVES MINUTES OF MEETING ON 14TH OCTOBER 2025

A Meeting of AIACE was held on 14th October 2025 on ZOOM to discuss the provisions of the draft Coal Mines Employees' Provident Fund & Miscellaneous Bill, 2025. Dr. B.K.Srivastav Vice-President, AIACE, presided over the meeting that was attended by about 45 members.

Dr. B.K.Srivastav explained in detail the relevant provisions of the draft bill and amendments/suggestions proposed by AIACE to make the legislation beneficial to the pensioners and to strengthen the Scheme. The Bill proposes to repeal the CMPF & Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1948 and enact a new Act by the Parliament to improve the organisational structure of CMPFO and also the Pension Scheme.

AIACE has given comments and proposed amendments to the Draft Bill and Schedule-II to include "Same Grade, Same Pension". Further, in Schedule-I, we have suggested to define "Equivalent Grade" Categories, to suitably accommodate migration to SGSP (Same Grade, Same Pension) as used in OROP (One Rank, One Pension) used for defence personnel.

Section 14 in Chapter-IV needs a change to frame the Scheme as the Coal Mines Employees Provident Fund and Pension Scheme to provide flexibility that can be strategically used to periodically revise pension factors and Dearness Relief linkage without needing full legislative amendment. This enables automatic inflation-indexing or DR adjustments.

Section 15 in Chapter-IV It is suggested to amend to cover every employee of companies (Public or Private) engaged in production, beneficiation, marketing & sales of Coal and Coal products and other minerals. This mandatory coverage expands the number of contributors. A wider pool of contributors improves fund solvency and allows actuarial capacity to provide higher periodic pension with DR. Ensuring universal coverage also helps in transparent DR application.

Section 16 in Chapter-IV needs to be changed to “The employer and employee shall contribute to the Fund at rates based on percentage basis of the salary of the individual member and such contributions shall be credited to the accounts of the employees.” The power to revise contribution rates (if required) must be spelt out and should be binding. This is critical for sustaining enhanced pension benefits and creating fiscal space for DR.

Section 17 in Chapter-IV is to be amended to “An employee may, if he so desires, contribute to the Fund more than the rate prescribed, shall do it only for Provident Fund and it will not be transferred to Pension Fund.” This allows **voluntary top-ups**, enabling members to build larger retirement corpus for Provident Fund.

Section 18 in Chapter-IV is to be amended as “All contributions paid into the Fund and any interest thereon shall be deposited in schemes aligned with inflation-indexed instruments or are Government-backed schemes with such agency or authority as may be notified by the Central Government.” Centralised deposit management facilitates efficient investment strategies. If aligned with inflation-indexed instruments or Government-backed schemes, this provides a stable revenue stream for funding.

Section 19 in Chapter-IV is to be amended as “The amount standing to the credit of a member shall be payable, within 3 months, to him / her / spouse / nominee / legal heir on the occurrence of such events like death / resignation / dismissal/ disablement etc.

This provision enables timely payouts.

Section 20 in Chapter-IV is to be amended as “A member, who subscribes to the Provident Fund, may withdraw maximum 10% of total accrued amount standing to his credit at a time, and not more than 2 times, in entire service period for specified

purposes like construction of First house, education of children, marriage of sons and daughters or immediate relative.

While withdrawal flexibility is important, frequent early withdrawals reduce the corpus available. The Scheme rules should therefore incentivize keeping funds invested until superannuation.

Section 21 in Chapter-IV is the core enabling clause for pension design. The following provisions need to be incorporated in this section.

The Scheme may provide for uniform pension revision and parity among retirees of equivalent rank or grade, commonly referred to as Same Grade, Same Pension. A Scheme framed under the provision of subsection (1) may provide for all or any of the matters provided in the Second Schedule proposed by us.

A timeline must be indicated in the act, when the CMPFO will notify, in Official Gazette, a new Coal Mines Employees' Pension Scheme. Moreover, the Act must specify Minimum payable pension linked with Dearness Relief (DR) in % of Basic pay fixed at the time of retirement.

Because the scheme is framed by notification, it gives Government and CMPFO latitude to introduce Dearness Relief (DR) or cost-of-living indexation directly within the scheme rules.

Adding an explicit sub-clause authorising periodic DR revision (tied to CPI or wage index) would institutionalise inflation protection and prevent ad-hoc increases.

Section 22 in Chapter-IV This section is vital for pension enhancement. Clause (b) explicitly allows Governmental top-ups, which can be structured as a Dynamic Government Contribution (DGC) indexed to average national wages or CPI. Such a mechanism can automatically fund periodic DR increments without separate budgetary sanction each year. Additionally, investing a part of the Fund in inflation-indexed securities will safeguard real pension value.

Section 48 in Chapter-IX: This new welfare corpus can serve as a stabilisation and dearness-relief reserve. If its utilisation rules (to be "prescribed") explicitly allow

transfers to the Pension Fund during high-inflation years, it can cushion pensioners by temporarily funding DR increases or one- time relief payments.

Section 65 in Chapter-IX: This ensures continuity of existing members' rights. To support pension enhancement, transitional rules should mandate re-calculation of pension entitlements under the new fund formula, integrating future DR provisions so that older retirees are not left out of inflation-linked adjustments.

Section 66 in Chapter-IX: The savings clause safeguards accrued benefits, but it should also explicitly state that existing pensioners will continue to receive benefits with future DR revisions notified under the new Act. Including a proviso affirming the continuity and enhancement of pension with DR linkage would prevent interpretational disputes.

After the presentation by Dr. B K Srivastav, comments were invited from the members.

1. Sri Kasi Viswanathan said that limiting the withdrawal under Section 20 to 10% of the balance is not fair as the amount may be meagre to serve the purposes such as House Building. Sri P K Singh Rathor said that such a limit is proposed as workers are being exploited by agents who encourage them to withdraw from their PF account leaving very little for their post-retirement life. Sri R A Manjunath Prasad suggested to increase the limit to 50% with a qualifying service of 15 years. Further withdrawals may be permitted once in 5 years thereafter.
2. Sri Bijon Chakraborty enquired whether loan can be availed against PF balance. It was informed to him that keeping track of loan repayment will be a complicated affair.
3. Sri R A Manjunath Prasad suggested that VRS is to be added in Section 19
4. All the members highly appreciated the excellent work done by Dr. B K Srivastav in preparing the comments and suggestions to the Draft Bill and requested to upload the same on website of AIACE.
5. Sri P K Singh Rathor said that the intention of the Ministry of Coal is clearly to improve the status of the fund and of the pensioners. This outcome is a

direct result of the persistent agitation by AIACE and the efforts of our members in approaching more than 100 MPs. He thanked all members, especially members of Kolkata Branch for the success of the Dharna held at Kolkata on 15th September 2025.

Next other matters were discussed.

1. Ministry of Coal, in conformity with the concept of Digital India, is promoting submission of Digital Life Certificate for pension and CPRMSE. Sri C L Patel informed that NCL is insisting on submission of Form B-1 for domiciliary payment under CPRMSE. Dr. B K Srivastav and Dr. A M Mohan clarified that Form B-1 need not be submitted as it has been withdrawn.
2. P.K.Singh Rathor said that DLC is prepared by some of our Branches such as Bengaluru, Asansol, etc. As per the MOU with Department of Posts, we have to pay Rs.70 per DLC and most members require 3 DLCs. Sri R A Manjunath Prasad informed that we can generate Jeevan Pramaan by using Face Recognition App on mobile phone free of cost. He was requested to prepare a training program on this subject, so that members can get their DLC.
3. Payment of Annual Fees: Members were advised that annual fees for the calendar year 2026 is to be paid from 1st November 2025 onwards. A notification will be issued and members are requested not to remit the fees till such notification is issued. After paying the fees, members should post the payment slip with membership number in the local WhatsApp group

Deliberations

Review of Dharna at Coal India Headquarters

A detailed review was conducted of the Dharna jointly organized by AIACE and AICPA on 15th September 2025 in front of the Coal India headquarters, Kolkata. Representing the Kerala Chapter, S/Shri D. Ajayakumar (President), Thomas John Palekkudy (Joint Secretary), and N. Shivanandan (Member) participated.

The event was efficiently organized by the Kolkata Chapter under the leadership of Shri P. K. Singh Rathor, Convener and Principal General Secretary of the Central Committee. Over 450 members participated. Despite logistical challenges, the Dharna successfully conveyed its message to the CIL management.

Key demands included:

- Revision of pension and reorganization of CMPFO
- Regulation of CPRMSE
- Enhancement of domiciliary payment
- Removal of wage disparity due to NCWA-XI scale for non-executive employees

It was resolved that if no satisfactory response is received, the agitation will be escalated. Shri Ajayakumar and Shri Thomas John Palekkudy shared their experiences and commended Shri P. K. Singh Rathor for his exemplary leadership.

Statement of Accounts

Shri K. Kuttan, Treasurer, presented the financial statement detailing member contributions toward travel expenses for Dharna participants. The Committee recorded its appreciation for the generosity of members who made additional contributions to cover the deficit.

It was noted with concern that, despite repeated reminders, some members failed to contribute their share. The statement of contributions and expenditures is annexed to this report.



Grievance Redressal Committee

The Committee applauded the efforts of the Grievance Redressal Committee, whose intervention led to the initiation and disbursement of pension arrears to the widow of Late Shri V. V. Vijayan.

Inclusion of Apollo Hospital, Angamali (Cochin)

The Committee welcomed the inclusion of Apollo Hospital, Angamali (Cochin), in the CPRMSE panel. It was decided to review the contract details and pursue the inclusion of additional multi-specialty hospitals in Kerala.

Membership Expansion

The list of potential members submitted by the Joint General Secretary was discussed. It was resolved to follow up with each individual to encourage their enrollment in the Association.

Media Coverage of Dhama

The Committee appreciated the efforts of Shri Thomas John Palekkudy, Joint General Secretary, for documenting and sharing photographs and videos of the Dhama event.

As a consequence of our long struggle for revision of pension by holding several dharnas at Jantar Mantar, New Delhi, Dhanbad, Varanasi and finally at Kolkata on 15th September 2025, Ministry of Coal has finally invited comments on the draft Coal Mines Employees' Provident Fund & Miscellaneous Bill, 2025.

The Core Committee of AIACE has proposed certain amendments/suggestions to make the legislation beneficial to the pensioners and to strengthen the Scheme. The Bill proposes to repeal the CMPF & Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1948 and enact a new Act by the Parliament to improve the organisational structure of CMPFO and to formulate a revised Pension Scheme. The bill is likely to be tabled in the Parliament in the forthcoming Winter Session.

AIACE has rendered help to its members in filing their profile forms on CIL website in respect of Coal India Executive Defined Contribution Pension Scheme (also called NPS), submission of Digital life certificates and CPRMSE issues.

It was informed that Sri B Sairam has been selected as Chairman, CIL, but the appointment order is yet to be issued. It was decided to meet the new chairman when he assumes charge for appraising him about the burning issues of serving and retired executives.

Members were invited to give their comments on holding of election to the Central Committee.

Sri R A Manjunatha Prasad explained that the Central Committee will constitute of the following office bearers.

Sri P K Singh Rathor said that AIACE is continuously working for the welfare of its members and their problems are solved as far as possible. With

the dedication of the members “Nothing is impossible”. AIACE has grown from its humble beginning to its present stature in the last 10 years.

He proposed that 2 members of Bengaluru Branch be nominated as nodal officers for each of the empanelled hospitals to take up the issue of medical treatment with the hospitals. This will help the members and bring a sense of involvement and satisfaction by serving the society.

He informed that soft-skills training programs will be arranged online on various subjects starting with a program on “Need for making a WILL”. This program will initially be conducted for members of Bengaluru Branch.

He assured that issues concerning CPRMSE will be taken up and requested the members to post their issues in the main groups.

Dr. A K Verma and Sri B P Kesri said that since reimbursement is limited to CGHS rates and empanelled hospitals are not extending cashless treatment, empanelment of hospitals is pointless. Members should be allowed to get treatment from any NABH accredited hospital. Speaking about the recent MOU with Apollo group of hospitals, Sri K A Sundar and Sri N D Prakash stated that some of the hospitals have not yet received instructions from their principals. Sri K A Sundar also said that a few hospitals are not aware of the revision of rates by CGHS. Sri B P Kesri was of the opinion that instead of the complicated procedure under CPRMSE, Coal India should go for a tie-up with insurance companies and issue smart card that the beneficiaries can swipe at the hospitals. Sri Rathor informed that this issue was considered by CIL but due to practical issues it could not be implemented.

In the absence of any of these Nodal Officers, other Nodal Officer can visit any of the hospitals as per their availability and convenience. Members requiring their help will contact them. Nodal Officers can also request for the details of pending bills from the hospitals so that CIL can be persuaded to clear the same.

Convenor is requested to send the list of Nodal Officers to CIL, Subsidiaries and the hospitals. He is also requested to take up the matter of denial of services by the hospitals.
