दिनांक 18 जनवरी 2026 को आहूत बैठक की कार्यवाही

एआईएसीई और एआईसीपीए की एक वर्चुअल बैठक दिनांक 18 जनवरी 2026 को गूगल मीट प्लेटफॉर्म पर आयोजित की गई। बैठक का एजेंडा निम्नानुसार था:

1. पेंशन वृद्धि के लिए आंदोलन फिर शुरू करना
2. संशोधित पेंशन भुगतान आदेश जारी करना
3. सीपीआरएमएसई/सीपीआरएमएस-एनई लाभ और कठिनाइयां

श्री आर बी माथुर ने बैठक की अध्यक्षता की और श्री एस एन सिंह, एआईएसीई उपाध्यक्ष, ने सह-अध्यक्षता की, जिसमें लगभग 100 सदस्यों ने भाग लिया, जिनमें से 70 सदस्यों के नाम पूर्ण उपस्थिति के लिए दर्ज किए गए।

श्री एस एन सिंह ने कहा कि 15 सितंबर 2025 को कोलकाता में सीआईएल कार्यालय के समक्ष अंतिम धरना के बाद हम धैर्यपूर्वक प्रतीक्षा कर रहे थे। लेकिन अब दोहराने का समय आ गया है और हमें अपना आंदोलन फिर शुरू करना चाहिए।

श्री पी के सिंह राठौर, प्रिंसिपल जनरल सेक्रेटरी/कन्वेनर, एआईएसीई/एआईसीपीए ने पेंशन संशोधन, संशोधित पीपीओ जारी करने और अस्पतालों के एम्पैनलमेंट पर उठाए गए कदमों की व्याख्या की। उन्होंने बताया कि नई दिल्ली, वाराणसी, धनबाद में सफल धरनों और अंततः 15 सितंबर 2025 को कोलकाता में मील का पत्थर धरना के बाद कोयला मंत्रालय ने कोल माइंस प्रॉविडेंट फंड एक्ट, 1948 पर संशोधन विधेयक का मसौदा प्रकाशित किया और हितधारकों से टिप्पणियां आमंत्रित कीं। एआईएसीई/एआईसीपीए ने इस विधेयक के तहत बनने वाली मौजूदा कोल माइंस पेंशन योजना को बेहतर बनाने के कई सुझाव दिए। उन्होंने जोर दिया कि पेंशन हमारा अधिकार है और सीएमपीएफओ केवल फंड का संरक्षक है, जिसे समझदारी से निवेश कर उच्च उपज सुनिश्चित कर सेवानिवृत्तों को पर्याप्त पेंशन देनी चाहिए। उन्होंने कहा कि सीएमपीएफओ ने अपनी जिम्मेदारियों को पूरी तरह विफलता से निभाया है और हम मांग करते हैं कि यदि पेंशन नहीं बढ़ाई जा सकती, तो कोर्पस पेंशनभोगियों को लौटा दिया जाए। उन्होंने आगे कहा कि मसौदा विधेयक को अंतिम मानसून सत्र में संसद में पेश किए जाने की उम्मीद थी। लेकिन यह न मानसून सत्र में पेश हुआ और न शीतकालीन सत्र में। हालांकि हम समझते हैं कि विधायी परिवर्तन लाने में समय लगता है, लेकिन बहुत अधिक समय बीत चुका है और अब पेंशन वृद्धि के लिए आक्रामक आंदोलन का समय आ गया है। श्री राठौर ने उपस्थित सभी सदस्यों से टिप्पणियां आमंत्रित कीं।

श्री आर बी माथुर, एआईएसीई अध्यक्ष, ने कहा कि सीआईएल मुद्दे को सुलझाने को तैयार है और सीआईएल प्रबंधन से मिलने की सलाह दी। उन्होंने यह भी कहा कि ठेका खनन ने कोयला उत्खनन में सीआईएल कर्मचारियों की भूमिका को नाटकीय रूप से कम कर दिया है और सीआईएल वर्तमान व पूर्व कर्मचारियों के कल्याण के बजाय लाभ के प्रेरित है। हमें इस ठेका खनन प्रथा का विरोध करना चाहिए।

श्री एन सी सरकार ने श्री माथुर से सहमति जताई कि ठेका खनन ने कंपनियों को बर्बाद कर दिया है और हमें उचित पेंशन की लड़ाई में कार्यरत अधिकारियों व कर्मचारियों को शामिल करना चाहिए।

श्री ए वेणु माधव ने कहा कि एससीसीएल में संशोधित पीपीओ जारी हो रहे हैं। पेंशन फंड की स्थिति सुधारने के लिए कंपनी लाभ का कम से कम 5% पेंशन फंड में स्थानांतरित किया जाए।

श्री पवन टंडन ने कहा कि केंद्रीय ट्रेड यूनियनों के सदस्यों को भी पेंशन वृद्धि संघर्ष में शामिल करने के लिए आमंत्रित किया जाए। कोयला ब्लॉक निजी संस्थाओं को दिए जा रहे हैं, जिससे सीआईएल का महत्व कम हो रहा है। हालिया उदाहरण है कि डामोदर वैली कॉर्पोरेशन को कोयला ब्लॉक आवंटित होने के बाद सीआईएल से कोयला खरीद बंद कर देगा।

श्री पवन टंडन ने कहा कि उन्होंने पिछले 5 वर्षों में सीआईएल द्वारा सीपीआरएमएस ट्रस्ट में हस्तांतरित फंड के विवरण पूछने के लिए आरटीआई क्वेरी दाखिल की। सीआईएल ने जवाब दिया कि यह सार्वजनिक हित से संबंधित नहीं होने से प्रकट नहीं किया जा सकता। दूसरी ओर, यह न केवल सार्वजनिक हित का है बल्कि भ्रष्टाचार से जुड़ा है और डेटा प्रकट किया जाना चाहिए। श्री टंडन ने कहा कि सीआईएल सूचना का अधिकार अधिनियम के दायरे में है और अनुरोधित डेटा प्रकट करने बाध्य है। वे अपीलीय प्राधिकारी के पास जा रहे हैं क्योंकि सीआईएल फंड का दुरुपयोग कर रहा है।

श्री आरके चौधरी, श्री अंबिका चक्रवर्ती, श्री बिजॉन चक्रवर्ती, श्री अंजनी कुमार, श्री थॉमस जॉन, श्री डी के साहा, श्री एन सी साहू, श्री दिनकर साहू आदि ने धरना के लिए समर्थन व्यक्त किया। श्री एन सी साहू ने कहा कि हमें "रेल रोको/रास्ता रोको" आंदोलन करना चाहिए। सहमति बनी कि आंदोलन तलचेर से धरना के साथ शुरू होगा।

श्री दिनकर साहू ने मत व्यक्त किया कि रेल रोको के बजाय "डिस्पैच रोको" करें और खदानों पर स्थानीय यूनियनों को शामिल करें। हमें सभी यूनियनों को पत्र लिखकर हमारे आंदोलन में शामिल होने के लिए आमंत्रित करना चाहिए। हमें सुनिश्चित करना चाहिए कि कम से कम 20% पेंशनभोगी धरना में भाग लें ताकि सरकार को हमारी जनशक्ति का अहसास हो।

डॉ ए एम मोहन ने सलाह दी कि हम नए सीआईएल अध्यक्ष से मिलें और वर्षों के संघर्ष व मंत्रालय की आश्वासनों से अवगत कराएं। उन्होंने कहा कि सीपीआरएमएसई के तहत डोमिसाइलरी भुगतान वृद्धि का आदेश अभी जारी नहीं हुआ। सीआईएल सूचीबद्ध अस्पतालों की निगरानी ठीक से नहीं कर रहा और बिल समय पर भुगतान नहीं हो रहे, जिससे लाभार्थियों को उत्पीड़न झेलना पड़ रहा। श्री के एन प्रसाद ने बताया कि पेंशन मामले की अंतिम सुनवाई शीघ्र होगी और आदेश अपेक्षित है।

हालांकि सीआईएल ने सीपीआरएमएसई सेल स्थापित किया है, लेकिन यह संतोषजनक रूप से कार्य नहीं कर रहा और कारण स्टाफ की कमी बताया जा रहा। श्री एन सी सरकार ने जवाब दिया कि दावों की जांच में बहुत समय लग रहा। अन्य सदस्यों ने चिकित्सा दावों निपटान में अनावश्यक देरी का मुद्दा उठाया। कन्वेनर ने सलाह दी कि यदि दावे 2 माह में निपटे तो सभी विवरणों के साथ एआईएसीई को भेजें ताकि सीआईएल से बात की जाए।

सदस्यों को सीपीआरएमएसई में दी गई प्रक्रिया का सख्ती से पालन करने की सलाह दी गई ताकि दावे अस्वीकार न हों। ध्यान दें कि गैर-सूचीबद्ध अस्पतालों (एनएबीएच मान्यता प्राप्त) में इलाज के दावे केस-टू-केस आधार पर निपटाए जाते हैं और सहायक कंपनी के सीएमडी की मंजूरी आवश्यक है। सदस्यों को सभी ऐसे मामलों में पूर्व में सीएमएस को सूचना सुनिश्चित करनी चाहिए।

श्री समयलाल साहू ने कहा कि हमारे मुद्दों को उजागर करने के लिए जी न्यूज हेल्पलाइन का उपयोग करें और टीवी चैनलों को धरनों को कवर करने के लिए आमंत्रित करें।

पेंशन और सीपीआरएमएसई के लिए लाइफ सर्टिफिकेट जमा करने के संबंध में सूचित किया गया कि डिजिटल लाइफ सर्टिफिकेट (जीवन प्रमान) अब घर से फेस रिकग्निशन मोबाइल ऐप से आसानी से जमा किया जा सकता है। इस विषय पर अक्टूबर व नवंबर 2025 में श्री आर ए मंजुनाथ प्रसाद द्वारा दो प्रशिक्षण सत्र आयोजित किए गए। ब्रांच सचिवों को सदस्यों की सहायता करनी चाहिए। पीपीओ नंबर के आधार पर (जिसमें कंपनी का नाम होना चाहिए) डीएलसी स्वतः सीआईएल व सहायक कंपनियों को प्राप्त हो जाता है। डीएलसी प्राप्ति की पुष्टि सीआईएल वेबसाइट पर जाकर की जा सकती है।

निर्णय लिया गया कि मार्च 2026 में तलचेर, कोठागुडेम और नई दिल्ली में धरने आयोजित किए जाएंगे। अंतिम तिथियां शीघ्र तय होंगी। श्री पी के सिंह राठौर, कन्वेनर, एआईएसीई/एआईसीपीए को पेंशन वृद्धि आंदोलन के समर्थन के लिए सीआईएल/एससीसीएल की अन्य संगठनों से संपर्क करने का अधिकार दिया गया।

श्रीमती नबनीता दास, श्री के बी डेब्रे, डॉ एन जी मुखर्जी, श्री डी एन पांडे, श्री बिजन चक्रवर्ती, श्री जे पी सिंह, श्री डी रामचंद्र राव, श्री टी रघुनाथ, श्री श्रीधर भट्ट, श्री अंबिका चक्रवर्ती, श्री आलोक कर चौधरी आदि ने भी अपने विचार व्यक्त किए और आंदोलन फिर शुरू करने का समर्थन किया।

बैठक श्री आर ए मंजुनाथ प्रसाद के धन्यवाद प्रस्ताव के साथ समाप्त हुई।

MINUTES OF THE MEETING ON 18TH JANUARY 2026

A Virtual Meeting of AIACE and AICPA was held on 18TH January 2026 on Google meet platform on following agenda.

1. Restarting agitation for enhancement of Pension
2. Issue of Revised Pension Payment Orders
3. CPRMSE/CPRMS-NE benefits and difficulties.

Sri R B Mathur presided over the meeting and Sri

Sri S N Singh Vice-President, AIACE, co-chaired which was attended by around 100 members out of which the names of 70 members were recorded as they were present through out the meeting.

Sri S N Singh said that after the last Dharna on 15th September 2025 before CIL office, Kolkata , we have been waiting patiently. But it is now time for repeat action and we should restart our agitation.

Sri Sri P K Singh Rathor, Principal General Secretary/Convenor, AIACE /AICPA explained the action taken about revision of pension, issue of revised PPOs, empanelment of hospitals. He told that after our successful dharnas at New Delhi, Varanasi, Dhanbad and finally a milestone dharna on 15th September 2025 at Kolkata, the Ministry of Coal published a Draft amendment Bill on Coal Mines Provident Fund Act,1948 and invited comments from the stakeholders. AIACE/AICPA has given several suggestions to improve the existing Coal Mines Pension Scheme to be formulated under this Bill. He stressed that pension is our right and CMPFO is only a custodian of the funds which is to be judiciously invested to ensure high yielding return for adequate pension to the retirees. He said that CMPFO has grossly failed to carry out its responsibilities and we demand that if pension cannot be enhanced, the corpus should be refunded to the pensioners.He further said that the draft Bill was expected to be tabled in the Parliament in the last Monsoon Session. But it has not been introduced either in the Monsoon Session nor in the Winter Session. Although we understand that it is a time taking process to bring about legislative changes, far too much time has gone by and it is now time for us to go for aggressive agitation to get pension enhancement. Sri Rathor invited comments from all the members present.

Sri R B Mathur, President, AIACE, said that CIL is willing to solve the issue and advised that we meet CIL Management. He also said that contract mining has drastically reduced the role of CIL employees

in excavation of coal and CIL is driven by profit motive rather than the welfare of its present and past employees. We should oppose this contract mining system.

Sri N C Sarkar agreed with Sri Mathur that contract mining has ruined the Companies and we should involve the working executives and employees in our fight for proper pension.

Sri A Venu Madhav said that Revised PPOs are being issued in SCCL. In order to improve the pension fund status, at least 5% of company profits should be transferred to the pension fund.

Sri Pawan Tandon said that members of Central Trade unions should also be invited to join us in the struggle for enhancement of pension. Coal blocks are being given to private entities thereby reducing the importance of CIL. A recent example is that Damodar Valley Corporation would stop buying coal from CIL after being allotted a coal block.

Sri Pawan Tandon said that he had filed an RTI Query asking for the details of fund transferred by CIL to CPRMS Trust in the last 5 years. CIL has replied that this information cannot be revealed as it does not pertain to public interest. On the other hand, it is not only in public interest but also involves corruption and the data is to be revealed. Sri Tandon said that CIL is under the ambit of Right to Information Act and is bound to reveal the requested data. He is approaching the appellate authority on this issue as CIL is misutilising the funds.

Sri RK Chowrasia, , Sri Ambika Chakraborty, Sri Bijon Chakraborty, Sri Anjani Kumar, Sri Thomas John, Sri D K Saha, Sri N C Sahoo, Sri Dinkar Sahu among others expressed their support for the Dharna. Sri N C Sahoo said that we should resort to “Rail roko/Rasta Roko” agitation. It was agreed that the agitation will start at Talcher with a dharna.

Sri Dinkar Sahu expressed his opinion that instead of Rail Roko we should go for “Despatch Roko” and involve the local unions at the mines. We should write to all the Unions and invite them to join our movement. We should ensure that at least 20% of the pensioners participate in the dharna so that the government realises the strength of our mass movement.

Dr. A M Mohan advised that we should meet the new Chairman, CIL to appraise him about our years long struggle and the assurances given by the Ministry. He said that the order regarding enhancement of Domiciliary payment under CPRMSE has not yet been issued. CIL is not properly monitoring the empanelled hospitals and the bills are not paid in time leading to the harassment of beneficiaries. Sri K N Prasad informed that the final hearing in the pension case will come up shortly and order is expected.

Although CPRMSE Cell has been set up by CIL, it is not functioning satisfactorily and the reason given is shortage of staff. Sri N C Sarkar replied that scrutiny of claims is taking a lot time. Other members also raised the issue of inordinate delay in settling medical claims. Convenor advised that if claims are not settled within 2 months, the matter should be referred with all the details to AIACE for taking up the issue with CIL.

Members were advised to strictly follow the procedure given in CPRMSE to avoid disallowance of claims. It may be noted that claims for treatment in non-empanelled hospitals (NABH Accredited) are dealt on case-to-case basis and require approval of CMD of the Subsidiary. Members should ensure that intimation is sent to CMS in advance in all such cases.

Sri Samaylal Sahoo said that we should use Zee News Helpline to project our issues and invite TV channels to cover our Dharnas.

Regarding submission of Life Certificate for Pension and CPRMSE, it was informed that Digital Life Certificate (Jeevan Pramaan) can now be submitted easily from home using Face Recognition Mobile App. Two training sessions on this subject were conducted by Sri. R.A.Manjunath Prasad during October & November 2025. Branch Secretaries should help the members in this matter. DLC is automatically received by CIL & the Subsidiaries based on the PPO number which should contain the name of the Company. The receipt of DLC can be confirmed by visiting CIL website.

It was decided that Dharnas will be organised at Talcher, Kothagudem and New Delhi in the month of March 2026. Final dates will be decided shortly. Sri P K Singh Rathor, Convenor, AIACE/AICPA was authorised to contact other organizations of CIL/SCCL for supporting the pension enhancement movement.

Mrs Nabanita Das, Sri K B Debray , Dr N G Mukherjee, Sri D N Pandey, Sri Bijan Charaborty, Sri J P Singh, Sri D Ramchander Rao, Sri T Raghunath, Sri Sreedhar Bhatt, Sri Ambika Charaborty, Sri Alok Kar Choudhary and others also expressed their views and supported the start of movement again. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by Sri. R.A.Manjunath Prasad.

- Support for Agitation: The Talcher branch fully supports the call for a massive dharna.
- Escalation of Protest: It was decided that the agitation would include "Rail Roko" (railway blockade) and "Dispatch Roko" (stoppage of coal dispatch) on the scheduled date.
- Leadership Mandate: The timing and execution of these activities will be carried out on the due date as determined by the Convenor, Sri P K Singh Rathor.

The meeting ended with the vote of thanks to the chair.

Proceedings

The meeting was called to order by the General Secretary at 8:00 PM. He welcomed all participants, and the following agenda items were transacted:

1. Condolence:

The Committee observed a minute of silence in memory of members who passed away in recent months.

2. Confirmation of Previous Minutes:

The minutes of the last Executive Committee meeting were read, discussed, and confirmed.

Central Committee Update:

The gist of discussions held at the Central Committee's general meeting was presented. It was informed that AIACE is planning an agitation in the form of *Dharna* at Singareni, Talcher, Singrauli coalfields and finally at Jantar Mantar (New Delhi) to press demands for enhancement of pension, CPRMSE, and other allied grievances. The Committee took serious note of the issue and unanimously agreed to support and participate in the program.

3. Grievance Redressal:

a. Pension of Mrs. Sudha Mohan Kumar commenced from December 2025 with arrears, following active follow-up by the Grievance Redressal Committee. However, medical bills of Late Mohan Kumar remain pending, and efforts are ongoing for resolution.

b. The medical bills of Mrs. Sreedhari Pillai (wife of Mr. Phalgunan Pillai) have been long pending with CCL HQ. The matter has been escalated to the PM's Office and the National Commission for Women, and responses have begun to arrive from CCL.

4. Member Greetings:

Birthday and anniversary wishes to members have been implemented from 1st January 2026. The initiative has received positive feedback.

5. Membership Revival:

The Committee discussed the Convenor's directive to motivate past members to rejoin AIACE. While the idea was welcomed, the requirement of paying ₹5,000 as membership subscription was felt to be a deterrent. The possibility of exempting returning members from this fee will be explored.

6. Family Gatherings:

The Kerala Branch's inability to conduct monthly family get-togethers, unlike other branches, was discussed. Given the geographical spread of members across the state, frequent physical meetings are impractical. However, efforts will be made to organize online family meetings more often.

7. Member Contact:

The Convener's observation that personal contact with branch members is unsatisfactory was reviewed. The EC felt this was a misinformation, as members are regularly assisted and supported. Nevertheless, further efforts will be taken to strengthen member relationships.

8. New Member Integration:

Regarding the suggestion of one volunteer per branch to socialize with new members, it was explained that Kerala Branch already has an in-house system to monitor and integrate new members into the mainstream.

9. Membership Retention:

The Committee appreciated the Kerala Branch's achievement of 100% membership retention, which has also been commended by the Central Body. We have also added four new members during this period.

10. Hospital Visit Committee:

To study onsite conditions and discuss CPRMSE features—particularly cashless treatment provisions—at the newly added Adlux Apollo Hospital, Angamali, a two-member committee comprising Shri K. Kuttan (Treasurer) and Shri Thomas John (Joint General Secretary) was formed. The committee will report to the EC before the ensuing General Body meeting.

11. Annual General Body Meeting:

It was decided that the Annual General Body Meeting of the Kerala Branch will be held online via Google Meet at 4:00 PM on 10th February 2026. The General Secretary will circulate the agenda and related information in advance.

12. Foundation Day Celebration:

The 2026 Foundation Day celebrations will be held on 18th May 2026. After considering various options, it was decided to host the event on a Cruise Ship in the Arabian Sea/Kerala backwaters.

Shri Thomas John (Joint General Secretary) was entrusted with exploring the arrangements.

13. Agenda Preparation:

Preparation of the agenda and issuance of notices to members was assigned to the General Secretary.

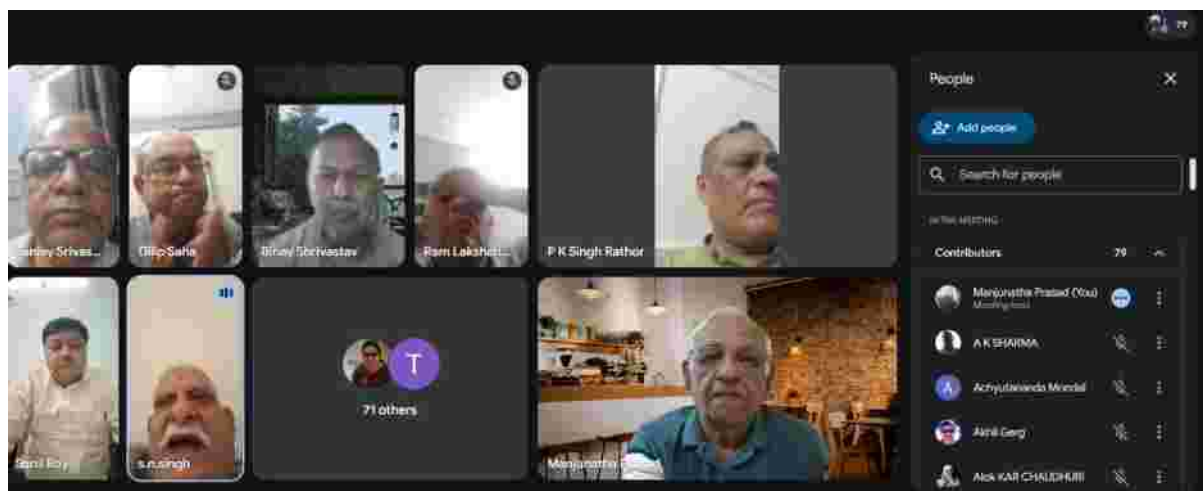
MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 18TH MARCH 2026

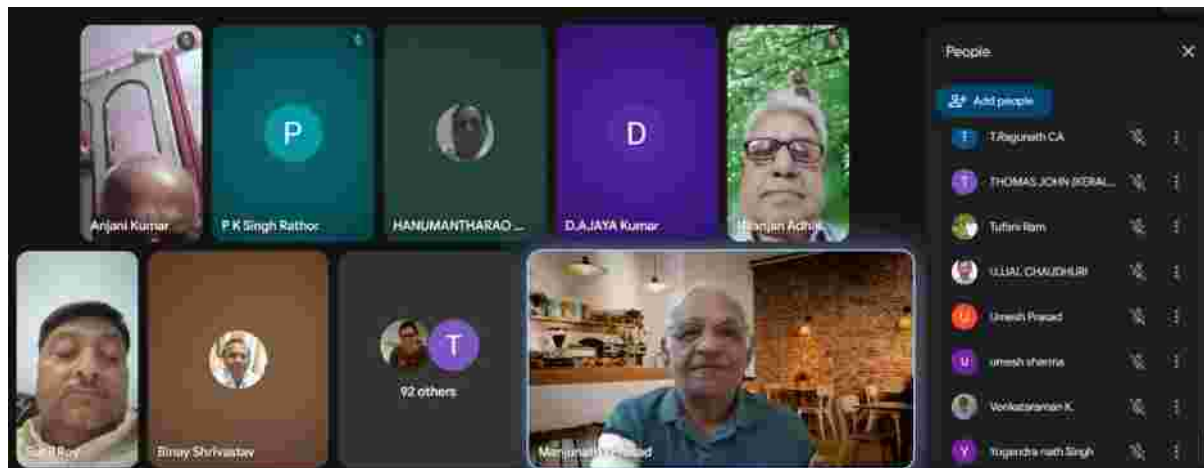
PREPARATIONS FOR DHARNA ON 30TH MARCH 2026

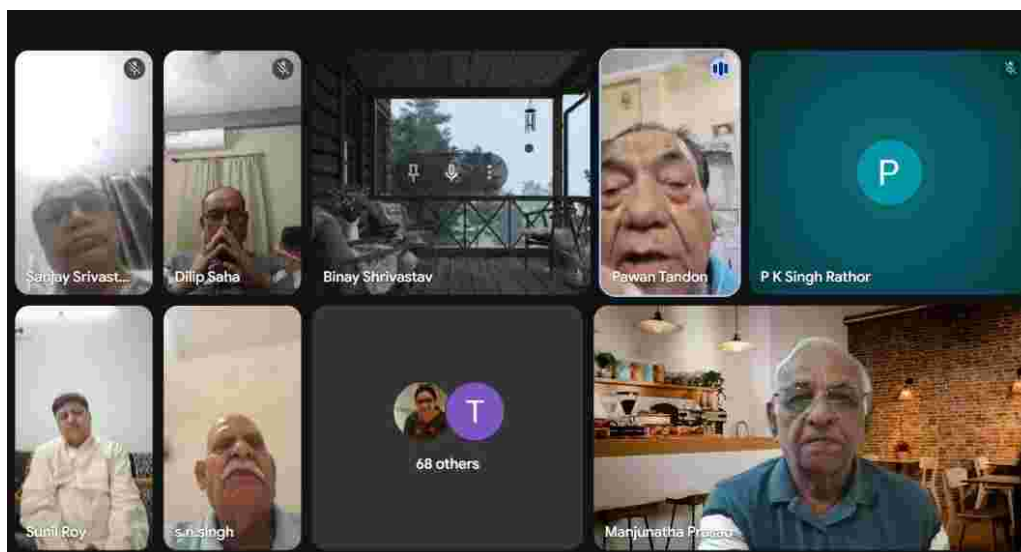
ORIENTATION OF NEWLY ELECTED MEMBERS OF BRANCH & CENTRAL COMMITTEE

Newly elected Branch Committee members who were present were introduced. All of them assured that they will work hard and rise to the occasion.

Dr. B K Srivastva said the basic difference between AIACE and other organizations is that AIACE is formed for the welfare of its members and members should join only if they are ready to help others. 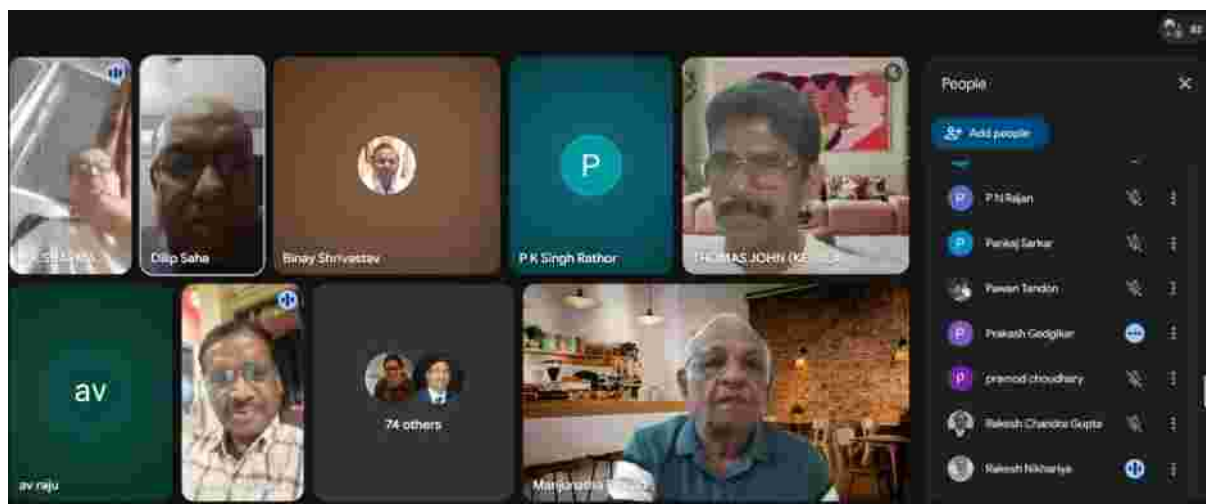


Sri Nilanjan Adhikary said that there is safety in numbers and we should increase the number of members. He urged the executive members to assist all members in solving their problems.

New groups of Central Body and Branch Committees will be created.

The following basic norms are circulated for proper functioning of the Association and for making all AIACE groups highly active, functional, harmonious, inclusive and vibrant groups. All are requested to abide. Any one violating the norm will be removed from the group without assigning any reasons.

1. No political, religious and dogmatic comments should be posted in the group.
2. No derogatory or provocative comments about any faith, caste, creed, language, culture, tradition, state, ethnicity and personal belief should be posted in the group.
3. No slanderous, defamatory or derogatory comments should be posted about any political, religious, social, literary or other well-known personalities, institutions and organizations.
4. No offensive and personal comments should be made about any member.
5. No message should be forwarded without fact checking and authentication.
6. No greeting messages (like Good Morning...) to be posted.
7. Members may exchange pleasantries and greetings on the occasion of festivals, days of significance, religious; social; literary and cultural events but no attempts should be made for promulgation, indoctrination and propagation of any faith, cult and ism.
8. Coal clubs are meant to showcase the talent of members and their family members in the fields of performing arts, literary works and other cultural areas. Every member should try to bring in culturally evolved people to enrich the club.
9. It is further added that the club is a platform for promoting healthy culture, noble thoughts, aesthetic values and grooming of talent. It is observed that some members are posting sermons,

memes, reels, long and tedious videos from entertainment, social media and other channels and cramming the wall of the Club with frivolous posts, silly and uncouth jokes, movie scenes and songs and gibberish in general. This beats the very purpose of the Club.

Branch Presidents and EC Members should ensure that the norms are followed.

Proceedings

- The meeting was called to order by the General Secretary, who then handed over proceedings to the President.

- Obituary Tribute:

Shri Thomas John, Vice President / CEC Member, presented an obituary in memory of deceased fellow members. In view of the forthcoming Dharna program demanding a raise in CMPF pensions, he made special mention of Late Muslim Ansari, who pioneered the idea of pension revision and brought many members into the Association.

- Welcome Address:

Shri A.V. Seshan, General Secretary, warmly welcomed the new entrants to the Executive Committee of the Kerala Chapter and wished them a fruitful tenure.

- CPRMSE Payment Update:

Shri Thomas John apprised the committee of the latest position regarding CPRMSE payments for Shri P. Sidharthan (M. No. 2204) and Shri P.K. Unnikrishnan, assuring that payments would be cleared within a couple of days.

- Dharna Program (30th March 2026):

- It was finalized that the Kerala Chapter of AIACE would be represented by four members: S/Shri D. Ajaya Kumar, Thomas John, K.A. Gopalan Achary, and N. Sivanandan.

- Shri Thomas John was entrusted with arranging two banners in the names of AIACE and AICPA to be carried during the demonstration at Jantar Mantar, New Delhi.

- Slogans for the demonstration would be finalized, printed, and distributed by the Central Executive Committee at the venue.

- Financial Estimate for Dharna:

Shri K. Kuttan, Treasurer, presented the estimated expenditure for air travel and incidental expenses of the Kerala team, calculated at approximately ₹20,000 per person. Contributions from branch members were expected to cover around ₹40,000, leaving a considerable deficit. It was unanimously agreed that any deficit would be personally borne by the participating members, should no additional support be available.

- Contribution Status:

The General Secretary presented a list of members who had contributed, and those who had not, towards the Dharna assistance fund. It was resolved that a detailed account of the Kerala team's travel expenses would be tabulated and submitted to the Central Executive Committee upon completion.

- Foundation Day Celebration (18th May 2026):

A brief discussion was held regarding the upcoming Foundation Day celebration and follow-up on earlier decisions. It was emphasized that all members must attend the function, setting aside other commitments.

The participation list should be finalized well in advance to plan guest involvement, considering the limited capacity of the vessel chosen for the event.

It was agreed that further steps for Foundation Day preparations would be taken after the Dharna demonstration at Jantar Mantar.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Shri P. Sidharthan, Joint Treasurer.

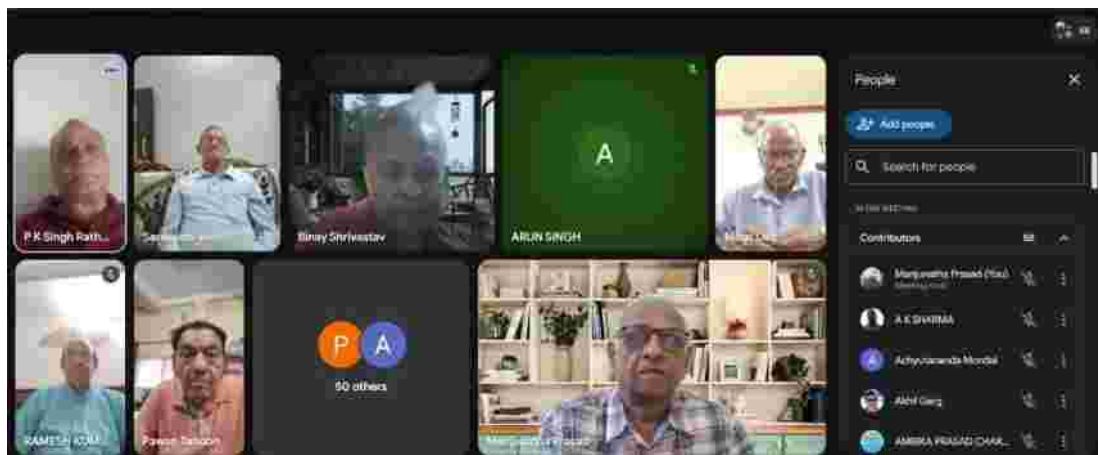
The meeting was presided over initially by Sri P K Tandon and later by Dr. B K Srivastva. He welcomed all the members.



Sri P K Singh Rathor, Convenor, AICPA/AIACE, informed that an appeal for revision of pension, signed by 75 ex-CMDs/Directors of CIL/SCCL, has been submitted to the Hon'ble Prime Minister. The appeal by coal veterans will certainly give result in coming days. It is the first time that so many ex senior board members joined hands together for pension revision. All the members present in the meeting thanked all the signatories of the appeal by clapping.

Sri Rathor further told that, a letter has been sent to SEBI giving information about proposed dharna by coal pensioners for intervention. He said that a letter has also been sent to Ministry of Health and hospitals in New Delhi informing about the Dharna in which pensioners aged more than 70--80 years will be participating and requesting them to arrange medical facility on stand-by, for which we are ready to pay the charges. Letters have also been sent to Members of Parliament to visit the Dharna site on 30th March 2026. This is a significant achievement that deserves congratulations to Dr. B K Srivastva, Sri Onkar Singh and other members of Delhi-NCR Branch who have worked tirelessly. All the members applauded these efforts. The members applauded the guidance and untiring efforts of Sri P K Singh Rathor and assured that they will continue to work in future for the success of our agitation. Sri P K Singh Rathor requested members unable to attend the Dharna, to gather with their families and carry on the protest as a psychological support to our cause. They should display placards and post photos and videos of their

gathering in WhatsApp groups. He urged the members to use Dharna posters as their WhatsApp status. Each branch should bring 1 banner each of AIACE and AICPA TO Delhi. Members of Delhi Branch are requested to attend the Dharna with their family.



Efforts will be made to show the Dharna on AIACE Facebook page using Facebook Live. Sri Thomas John, Sri R A M Prasad and Sri Ambika Chakraborty to arrange this so that members all over India can view the proceedings.



Dr. B K Srivastva said that accommodation for outstation delegates has been booked and the final list will be posted on 28th March 2026. Banners and placards are designed and given for printing. Sri P K Tandon to bring banners and placards. He expressed his gratitude to Sri Onkar Singh submitting the memorandum to the PM's Secretariat. He said that we are getting pension as a return on our own contribution during our service period and it is not any charity as some people believe. Due to the mismanagement of the Pension Fund by CMPF Board of Trustees, revision of pension has not been done and the pensioners are being penalized for no fault of theirs.

Sri Nilanjan Adhikary said our approach is very correct and expressed his happiness at the support from ex-CMDs and Directors. This is a decisive battle and we may have to be ready for further fight.

Sri G K Raghav & Sri Onkar Singh of Delhi Branch informed that they will meet the Superintendent of Police on 25th March 2026 to obtain permission to hold Dharna.

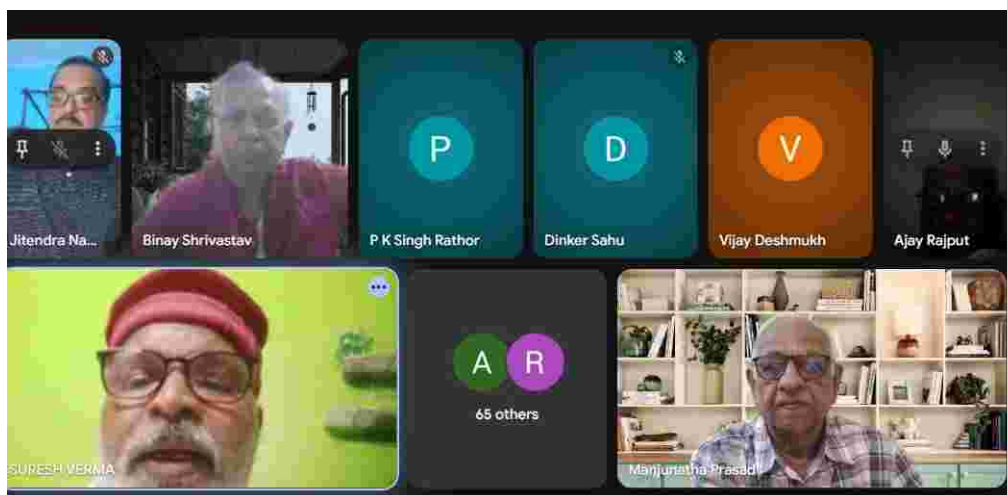

REPORT OF DHARNA AT JANTAR MANTAR ON 30-3-2026 BY PENSIONERS LED BY AICPA/AIACE

On **30 March 2026**, a **Dharna by coal pensioners** was held at Jantar Mantar under the banner of All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA) and All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE). The demonstration highlighted long-pending demands related to coal sector pensions and post-retirement welfare.

Key Points of the Dharna

1. Background

- Retired employees from Coal India Limited (CIL), its subsidiaries, and Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) participated.
- The protest was aimed at pressing the government and coal authorities for reforms in the Coal Mines Pension Scheme 1998 (CMPS-1998).

2. Major Demands

- **Revision of pension under CMPS-1998**, which has remained largely static despite inflation.
- **Regular Dearness Relief** or indexation to protect pensioners from rising costs of living.
- **Implementation of recommendations** from past committees on coal pension reforms.
- **Creation of a sustainable pension fund mechanism** and assurance of long-term pension viability.
- **Healthcare and medical support** for retired mineworkers suffering from occupational illnesses.

3. Participation

- Delegates came from multiple coal-bearing states.
- Leaders from AICPA and AIACE addressed the gathering, urging the government to act on long-pending representations.
- Memoranda were submitted to relevant ministries and authorities for urgent intervention.

4. Core Message

Speakers emphasized that retired coal employees served under hazardous mining conditions and now face severe financial and medical hardships due to stagnating pensions. They appealed for immediate government attention and policy-level reform to ensure dignity and social security for retired miners.

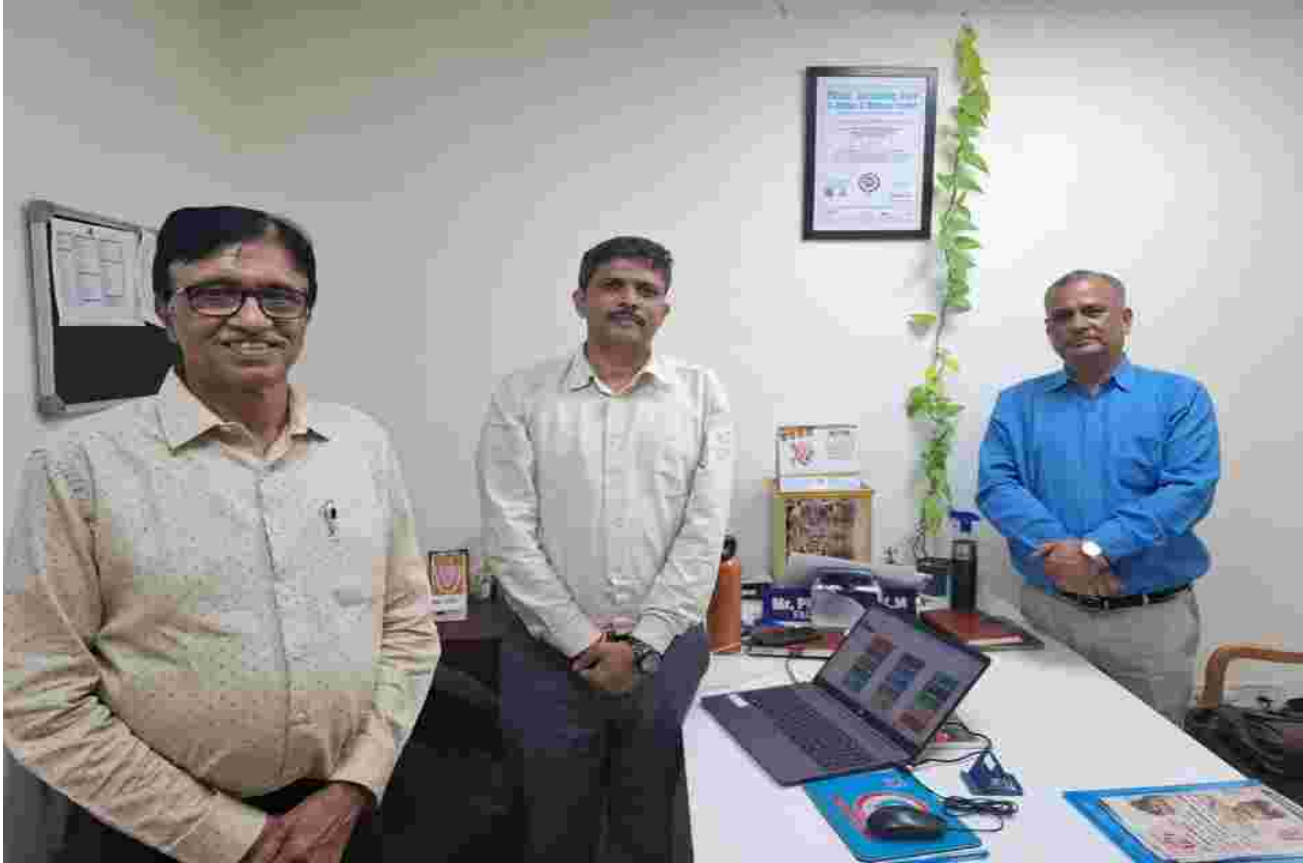
