Dear Readers,

I am glad to hand over the Year – 7, Volume-IV, of AIACE Today in the hand of readers /

AIACE and AICPA collectively are concerned about the plight of coal employees and pensioners. Despite their invaluable contribution to building the nation's coal industry, pensioners are facing financial insecurity due to inadequate pension revisions, rising healthcare costs, and delays in policy decisions. The serving employee are failing to vision the future challenge when they will retire and live for longer years. Those who retired in 2007 and before are getting meagre pension but today's retirees are getting handsome amount. After 10-15 years, this amount will seem to be just meagre.

The demand for revision of pension under the Coal Mines Pension Scheme has been pending for a long time. Inflation has significantly eroded the real value of pensions, leaving many retired executives and workers struggling to maintain a dignified standard of living. This is not merely a financial issue but a matter of justice and recognition.

On 30th March, members of AIACE and AICPA, along with other pensioners and welfare associations, organized a peaceful dharna at Jantar Mantar in New Delhi. This demonstration was a strong and united expression of concern over unresolved pension issues and related grievances.

The participation of pensioners from across the country highlighted the depth of dissatisfaction and urgency of the matter. The dharna was conducted in a disciplined and democratic manner, reinforcing AIACE's commitment to constructive engagement while firmly advocating for rightful demands. The Delhi was supported by mental dharna (Manasik dharna) across the country in Hyderabad, Ramagundam, other operation units of Singreni collieries, Talcher, Bilaspur, Bhopal, Bengaluru, Patna, Kolkata, Bhagalpur, Kerala, Varanasi, Pune, Asansol, Dhanbad, and at many other places individually and collectively to send positive vibrations to PMO for the revision of pension.

AIACE remains committed to pursuing a structured and strategic approach to address the concerns of coal executives and pensioners. The following steps form part of the organization's forward plan:

Policy Engagement: Continued dialogue with the Ministry of Coal, Coal India Limited, and other relevant authorities to expedite pension revision and policy implementation.

Awareness Campaigns: Strengthening communication and outreach to build broader support and awareness.

Collaborative Efforts: Working with trade unions and other associations to present a unified front.

Future Mobilization: Planning further peaceful demonstrations and representations if demands remain unaddressed.

AIACE will continue to uphold the voice of coal executives and pensioners with determination and dignity. The events at Jantar Mantar are not an end but a beginning—a reminder that collective action and persistent dialogue are essential to achieving meaningful change.

The time has come for policymakers to respond with sensitivity and urgency, ensuring that progress in production is matched by progress in welfare.

All are aware that, May is the month when AIACE was formed on 16th day. Since then, its members have not taken the rest and continued resolving the issues of its members and all coal pensioners.

It is time to organize foundation day of AIACE from 16th May which will end with last celebration on 14th June at Bilaspur. The schedule has already been circulated. Local branches can change the date as per their convenience.

CHAPTER-I

PREAMBLE

ALL INDIA ASSOCIATION OF COAL EXECUTIVES (AIACE) was formed on 16/5/2015 by Sri P K Singh Rathor, Sr Manager (IED), SECL Korba Area. He had announced on 1/5/2015 that if Coal Mines Officers Association of India (CMOAI) fails to resolve the issue of PRP and others, he would resign from CMOAI wef 16/5/2016. Sri Rathor resigned from CMOAI on 16/5/2015 as PRP and other issues of working and retired executives were not resolved. With the consent of like-minded officers of SECL Korba Area and support from other executives from CIL/SCCL, it was announced regarding formation of new association of coal executives named AIACE.

Our Vision

To become an association of Coal Executives growing in size and influence by being held in high regard by the membership, with a high level of loyalty and activism.

Our Mission

To be regarded by members as the best trade union through excellence of services and representatives, positive influence upon employers and governments in pursuit of aims and values of trade unions.

Our Values

Commitment, Competence, Democracy, Equality, Transparency & Solidarity.

Aims and objectives of the association:-

1. To act as an effective channel of communication between the Executives and Management and appropriate govt to sort out Executives' grievances.
2. To ensure career growth of the executives by way of
 - a. rational and scientific promotion policy.
 - b. open system of annual performance appraisals.
3. To achieve high level of pay scales/allowances/incentives/PRP /pension, which shall be compatible to the paying organizations in private /public sectors.
4. To get introduced incentive schemes for acquiring and improving educational / professional qualifications of all the executives.
5. To improve the work culture of the organisation so as to ensure its growth and development.
6. To foster a spirit of fellowship, solidarity and co-operation among Association

members.

7. To co-ordinate with CPSU executives federations of India or any other such association in the area of mutual interests and benefits.

8. To organize seminars/conferences on subjects like effective management with the warmth of human relations, productivity, national integration, participative management, etc.

9. To encourage executives to participate in events like sports, publications of articles on various subjects, attending seminars/courses and other activities that will earn name for the organisation.

10. To open institute and conduct courses /training for coal employees and others to improve their professional skills and qualities for increasing employability.

11. To conduct any other activities which are conducive to the attainment of the aims and objectives of the Association by adopting lawful , legal and constitutional means,

12. To provide effective assistance to its members in the matter of law, taxation and grievances redressal etc.

13. To obtain representation on and affiliation with various bodies/ organization with a view to advocate and protect interests of its members.

There will be formed a Branch Executive Committee with the following Set up :-

1. President : 1
2. Vice-President: 2
3. General Secretary : 1
4. Joint General Secretary: 2
5. Treasurer : 1
6. Jt Treasurer: 1
7. Executive committee members:-- 2% of total membership of branch .

3) CENTRAL LEVEL :--

There will be formed a Central Executive Committee with the following Set up :-

1. President : 1
2. Vice-President: 2
3. Principal General Secretary : 1
4. Joint Principal General Secretary: 2

5. Treasurer : 1
6. Jt Treasurer: 1
7. Executive committee members:-- 0.5 % of total membership at central level.

Convenor :-- There will be one post of Convenor in Central Committee. He may be nominated from one of the office bearers of Central Executive committee. The duty of Convenor will be overall growth of association and he will work for expansion of membership, liaisoning with similar organizations and others as per need and situation.

Membership:--

Eligibility:--

i) **Ordinary Members** : An executive employed in coal mines will be eligible to become a member of the Association provided he/she declares to abide by the bye-laws of the Association and has paid the membership admission fee and the periodic subscription to be decided by respective Executive Committee.

ii) **Advisory Members** : Any superannuated/ retired Executive from Coal mines , upon retirement shall be admitted as Advisory Member and shall be referred as AM provided he/she declares to abide by the bye-laws of the Association and has paid the membership admission fee and the periodic subscription to be decided by Executive Committee .

Admission and membership fee:-

Application for admission for ordinary membership shall be submitted online through website of association for its consideration and approval. Membership will be given online if the applicant is found eligible as per membership norm.

Any executive shall need to apply in the prescribed form uploaded in the website and at other places. The membership shall be effective from the date of approval.

The membership fee will be as below for time being and can be revised by Central Executive Committee.

a. One Time registration fee:

- (i) Ordinary/Advisory Members : - Rs 5000/-
- (ii) Associate members: - NIL

b. Annual Subscription :-

- (i) Ordinary/Advisory Members : - Rs 500/-
- (ii) Associate members: - NIL

In case any member wishes to make advance payment for membership fee for 12 months, he shall pay only for ten months ie Rs 500/towards membership fee.

Any member defaulting to pay membership/Subscription / levy for six months will cease to be a member of the Association. But they can be readmitted after fresh registration.

CHAPTER-II

JOURNEY OF AIACE

ALL INDIA ASSOCIATION OF COAL EXECUTIVES(AIACE) was formed on 16/5/2015 by Sri P K Singh Rathor, Sr Manager(IED), SECL Korba Area. He had announced on 1/5/2015 that if Coal Mines Officers Association of India (CMOAI) fails to resolve the issue of PRP and others, he would resign from CMOAI wef 16/5/2015. Sri Rathor resigned from CMOAI on 16/5/2015 as PRP and other issues of working and retired executives were not resolved. With the consent of like-minded officers of SECL Korba Area and support from other executives from CIL/SCCL, it was announced regarding formation of new association of working and retired coal executives named AIACE.

Sri Rathor made first visit to Asansol in first week of June and visited some of areas of ECL and met with many executives to explain the compelling situation for formation of AIACE. In fact, executives of ECL field became the nucleus of AIACE and they readily formed the Asansol Branch of AIACE.

The story of AIACE, Asansol branch is very unique and most unforgettable. A meeting on 6th June, 2015 was planned in CMPDIL, RI-I club that day and due permission was obtained from RD, RI-I, Asansol unit. All the arrangements like seating arrangements, banner placements, dias arrangements were done. About 20 to 25 members turned up for the meeting but in the last moment, we were denied permission for the meeting due to excessive pressure from CMOAI, ECL HQ to foil the meeting.



But we succeeded in arranging a small meeting at Shristinagar, Asansol where 5 to 6 members turned up.



It is worth to recall that our Convenor Sri P K Singh Rathor had told the then RD, RI-I of CMPDIL, Asansol to wait for 5 years to see the impact of AIACE. Today the AIACE, Asansol team is doing excellently and most powerful Branch having highest membership strength .This was possible only due to the joint efforts of all the members.



After that Sri Rathor had toured Dhanabad, Ranchi, Delhi, Patna, Bhubneshwar, Nagpur, Talcher, Sambalpur, Kothagudem (Telangana), Varanasi, Mumbai, Bangalore, Singrauli, Durgapur, Chandrapur and other places.

The association was registered under The Trade Union Act with Chhatisgarh Govt and the registration no is 546 dated 24/5/2016. It has got permanent account no. (PAN) with no. as AAEEAA7978E. The registration and permanent account numbers, an association must have for collecting any subscription from members, otherwise the collection of any amount may be treated as illegal.

In the last 6 years, AIACE conducted meetings each in Kolkata, Asansol, Dhanabad, Ranchi, Delhi, Bilaspur, Bengaluru ,Nagpur, Samabalpur, Talcher, Patna, Bhubnewshar, Mandamari (SCCL), Kothagudem (SCCL) , Hyderabad ,Jabalpur ,Mumbai, Bhopal and other smaller meetings in different areas of Coal India and Singreni collieries from time to time.

AIACE has charted out core issues concerning working and retired executives of CIL and SCCL. Its representatives are meeting parliamentarians. state legislators and govt officials for pressing their issues for solution.

It is working over one major issue for enhancement of pension. Coal pensioners are apprehending that they may not get pension in future, if something concrete is not done at the moment. The working executives and employees will be the worst sufferer if the issue of pension is not addressed properly.

AIACE MEMBERS BENEVOLENT FUND SCHEME

OBJECTIVE & MODALITIES

- i) **Name:** This scheme shall be run by AIACE under the name “AIACE Members’ Benevolent Fund”
- ii) **Date of start of the scheme:** The scheme shall start from 16th May, 2022 i.e., the date of birth of AIACE.
- iii) **Objectives:** To afford financial assistance to Spouse of a Member subject to the death of a Member who has made regular annual contribution to AIACE for the last 3 consecutive years.
- iv) **Definitions:**
 - a) “Spouse” means widow/widower without involving any controversy/litigation
 - b) “Fund” means AIACE Members Benevolent Fund.
- v) **Eligible Members for the fund:**
 - a) All Ordinary and Advisory active members of AIACE who have renewed their Membership by paying required membership.
 - b) All Honorary members of AIACE who are exempted from paying any renewal fee
- vi) **Source of the Benevolent Fund:**
Source for Benevolent fund shall be provided by AIACE out of Subscription revenue generated from Members.
- vii) **Operations of Benevolent fund:**
 - a) AIACE shall approve assistance to be given in each individual case. Presently, the financial assistance in case of death is limited to Rs 10000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only)
 - b) Further, AIACE will have the privilege to review this limit of Grant subject to the viability.
- viii) **Remittances to beneficiaries:**
Remittances to beneficiaries shall be made by local body of AIACE, in cash as far as possible or online as deemed fit and certify it for record and reference.

In cases where it is more expedient, the Convener may adopt other means of remittance. Any incidental expenditure incurred during payment of the amount to the spouse of the deceased executives shall be borne by AIACE.

On 16th May, 2022 AIACE Foundation Day celebrations at Bengaluru, the AIACE MEMBERS’ BENEVOLENT FUND SCHEME was launched by our Convener Sri P K Singh Rathor by unveiling it digitally. A brochure giving details of the Scheme and the activities and achievements of AIACE was released and Dr. B. K. Shrivastav, who explained the salient features of the Scheme through a PowerPoint Presentation.

CHAPTER – IV**PROPOSED CRECHE OLD HOME: AN INITIATIVE OF AIACE****OBJECTIVE & MODALITIES****Introduction**

Creche Old Home is a modern concept of joint family. It is an attempt to give feeling of community living as was found in joint family system in which collectiveness prevails upon individuality.

The home will provide the retired coal executives /senior citizens, care like a child ie the person concerned will be free from any type of anxiety and will be provided entertainment, quality life, food, clothing and shelter by maintaining uniformity in the service. They will be provided world class facility within a boundary without involvement of other agency and will be managed by the inhabitants themselves.

It will be not for profit homes run by the members themselves. These homes will be leased homes till life and no ownership will be legally provided. The home will be used by the members till life of husband and wife and after death of both.

Objective of Creche Old Home

1. To construct cottages/flats for the members of AIACE at no profit no loss under brand name Creche Old Home at the selected places as per demand of members.
2. To maintain and run the Creche Old Home with the financial support of the inhabitants with high end facility as per suggestion of members.
3. To allot the cottage/flat to members only. The member means husband and wife both if alive otherwise any of the survivor.
4. To negotiate, purchase land for the Creche Old Home with land owner/developer/builder and others.
5. To negotiate with service providers like security, medical services, house-keeping and others as per situation and demand and enter into agreement.
6. To negotiate with institutions/organisations to provide expert services through the members of AIACE and inhabitants of Creche Old Home.
7. To Provide Creche Old facility to the members who are above 60 years of age but who opt for the facility before 55 years of age.
8. To transfer the amount without interest given by the members for availing Creche Old Home facility to the next kith and kin as per nomination in case of death of members (both husband and wife).
9. Any other as per need and circumstances.

Membership

Only AIACE members will be provided home. Initially, for availing the home facility, all retired coal executives are entitled but once the home is constructed and become functional, the desirous members will have to take membership at least 5 years before retirement. The retired executives will not be entitled to automatic membership but their credentials and social aptitude will be verified first.

AIACE has envisaged Not for Profit old age homes, to be run by members themselves on leased basis.

Size of home

It will be 1 BHK cottage with world class facility to provide luxurious life to members for another 25-30 years after retirement. It will be a self-contained home for husband and wife with dry kitchen only. The main kitchen will be housed in another hall, where food will be cooked and served in the hall.

There will be another halls as common room, activity room and others with about 60% of the area will be open. Minimum standards will be decided for running the home. Periodic assessment of the standards will be based on the changing needs of the elderly and AIACE.

It will be inside the gated boundary. The manpower line security, driver, cook, gardener and others working in the home will be provided accommodation within the campus.

Locations of the homes- Kolkata, Ranchi, Bilaspur, Bengaluru, Delhi NCR, Pune, Haridwar, Varanasi, Mathura, Vrindavan, Nagpur, Dhanbad, Bhubaneswar and at other places on the basis of demand and sufficient numbers.

Initially, it will be started with 25 cottages which may be extended to maximum 100 cottages at one place.

Preference to Beneficiary

This home is primarily meant for those retired executives whose sons/daughters/other relatives do not stay with them normally and only guests occasionally visit for a very short period. The guests of the inhabitants will be accommodated in other cottages to maintain privacy and 10% cottages will be reserved for guests.

Ultimate cost of the cottage- it will include land, development and construction cost of cottage and periphery and cost will be variable for different cities and locations.

Day's engagement- All inhabitants will be fully engaged in inside activities from 6 am to 6 pm like walking, yoga, gardening, singing, dancing, experience sharing, writing, worshipping etc. It is envisaged that the senior citizens will be kept busier than what they had been during active service life.

Hospitals and doctors will be tied up for emergency treatment.

Social work

Inhabitant will be encouraged for social work like free coaching to students, women empowerment, health and hygiene training in nearby locality.

Also, tie-up will be made with corporate houses for availing the expert service of the inhabitants for resolving technical, social and other issues

Local coal clubs of the cities will be housed in the home.

दिनांक 18 जनवरी 2026 को आहूत बैठक की कार्यवाही

एआईएसीई और एआईसीपीए की एक वर्चुअल बैठक दिनांक 18 जनवरी 2026 को गूगल मीट प्लेटफॉर्म पर आयोजित की गई। बैठक का एजेंडा निम्नानुसार था:

1. पेंशन वृद्धि के लिए आंदोलन फिर शुरू करना
2. संशोधित पेंशन भुगतान आदेश जारी करना
3. सीपीआरएमएसई/सीपीआरएमएस-एनई लाभ और कठिनाइयां

श्री आर बी माथुर ने बैठक की अध्यक्षता की और श्री एस एन सिंह, एआईएसीई उपाध्यक्ष, ने सह-अध्यक्षता की, जिसमें लगभग 100 सदस्यों ने भाग लिया, जिनमें से 70 सदस्यों के नाम पूर्ण उपस्थिति के लिए दर्ज किए गए।

श्री एस एन सिंह ने कहा कि 15 सितंबर 2025 को कोलकाता में सीआईएल कार्यालय के समक्ष अंतिम धरना के बाद हम धैर्यपूर्वक प्रतीक्षा कर रहे थे। लेकिन अब दोहराने का समय आ गया है और हमें अपना आंदोलन फिर शुरू करना चाहिए।

श्री पी के सिंह राठौर, प्रिंसिपल जनरल सेक्रेटरी/कन्वेनर, एआईएसीई/एआईसीपीए ने पेंशन संशोधन, संशोधित पीपीओ जारी करने और अस्पतालों के एम्पैनलमेंट पर उठाए गए कदमों की व्याख्या की। उन्होंने बताया कि नई दिल्ली, वाराणसी, धनबाद में सफल धरनों और अंततः 15 सितंबर 2025 को कोलकाता में मील का पत्थर धरना के बाद कोयला मंत्रालय ने कोल माइंस प्रॉविडेंट फंड एक्ट, 1948 पर संशोधन विधेयक का मसौदा प्रकाशित किया और हितधारकों से टिप्पणियां आमंत्रित कीं। एआईएसीई/एआईसीपीए ने इस विधेयक के तहत बनने वाली मौजूदा कोल माइंस पेंशन योजना को बेहतर बनाने के कई सुझाव दिए। उन्होंने जोर दिया कि पेंशन हमारा अधिकार है और सीएमपीएफओ केवल फंड का संरक्षक है, जिसे समझदारी से निवेश कर उच्च उपज सुनिश्चित कर सेवानिवृत्तों को पर्याप्त पेंशन देनी चाहिए। उन्होंने कहा कि सीएमपीएफओ ने अपनी जिम्मेदारियों को पूरी तरह विफलता से निभाया है और हम मांग करते हैं कि यदि पेंशन नहीं बढ़ाई जा सकती, तो कोर्पस पेंशनभोगियों को लौटा दिया जाए। उन्होंने आगे कहा कि मसौदा विधेयक को अंतिम मानसून सत्र में संसद में पेश किए जाने की उम्मीद थी। लेकिन यह न मानसून सत्र में पेश हुआ और न शीतकालीन सत्र में। हालांकि हम समझते हैं कि विधायी परिवर्तन लाने में समय लगता है, लेकिन बहुत अधिक समय बीत चुका है और अब पेंशन वृद्धि के लिए आक्रामक आंदोलन का समय आ गया है। श्री राठौर ने उपस्थित सभी सदस्यों से टिप्पणियां आमंत्रित कीं।

श्री आर बी माथुर, एआईएसीई अध्यक्ष, ने कहा कि सीआईएल मुद्दे को सुलझाने को तैयार है और सीआईएल प्रबंधन से मिलने की सलाह दी। उन्होंने यह भी कहा कि ठेका खनन ने कोयला उत्खनन में सीआईएल कर्मचारियों की भूमिका को नाटकीय रूप से कम कर दिया है और सीआईएल वर्तमान व पूर्व कर्मचारियों के कल्याण के बजाय लाभ के प्रेरित है। हमें इस ठेका खनन प्रथा का विरोध करना चाहिए।

श्री एन सी सरकार ने श्री माथुर से सहमति जताई कि ठेका खनन ने कंपनियों को बर्बाद कर दिया है और हमें उचित पेंशन की लड़ाई में कार्यरत अधिकारियों व कर्मचारियों को शामिल करना चाहिए।

श्री ए वेणु माधव ने कहा कि एससीसीएल में संशोधित पीपीओ जारी हो रहे हैं। पेंशन फंड की स्थिति सुधारने के लिए कंपनी लाभ का कम से कम 5% पेंशन फंड में स्थानांतरित किया जाए।

श्री पवन टंडन ने कहा कि केंद्रीय ट्रेड यूनियनों के सदस्यों को भी पेंशन वृद्धि संघर्ष में शामिल करने के लिए आमंत्रित किया जाए। कोयला ब्लॉक निजी संस्थाओं को दिए जा रहे हैं, जिससे सीआईएल का महत्व कम हो रहा है। हालिया उदाहरण है कि डामोदर वैली कॉर्पोरेशन को कोयला ब्लॉक आवंटित होने के बाद सीआईएल से कोयला खरीद बंद कर देगा।

श्री पवन टंडन ने कहा कि उन्होंने पिछले 5 वर्षों में सीआईएल द्वारा सीपीआरएमएस ट्रस्ट में हस्तांतरित फंड के विवरण पूछने के लिए आरटीआई क्वेरी दाखिल की। सीआईएल ने जवाब दिया कि यह सार्वजनिक हित से संबंधित नहीं होने से प्रकट नहीं किया जा सकता। दूसरी ओर, यह न केवल सार्वजनिक हित का है बल्कि भ्रष्टाचार से जुड़ा है और डेटा प्रकट किया जाना चाहिए। श्री टंडन ने कहा कि सीआईएल सूचना का अधिकार अधिनियम के दायरे में है और अनुरोधित डेटा प्रकट करने बाध्य है। वे अपीलीय प्राधिकारी के पास जा रहे हैं क्योंकि सीआईएल फंड का दुरुपयोग कर रहा है।

श्री आरके चौधरी, श्री अंबिका चक्रवर्ती, श्री बिजॉन चक्रवर्ती, श्री अंजनी कुमार, श्री थॉमस जॉन, श्री डी के साहा, श्री एन सी साहू, श्री दिनकर साहू आदि ने धरना के लिए समर्थन व्यक्त किया। श्री एन सी साहू ने कहा कि हमें "रेल रोको/रास्ता रोको" आंदोलन करना चाहिए। सहमति बनी कि आंदोलन तलचेर से धरना के साथ शुरू होगा।

श्री दिनकर साहू ने मत व्यक्त किया कि रेल रोको के बजाय "डिस्पैच रोको" करें और खदानों पर स्थानीय यूनियनों को शामिल करें। हमें सभी यूनियनों को पत्र लिखकर हमारे आंदोलन में शामिल होने के लिए आमंत्रित करना चाहिए। हमें सुनिश्चित करना चाहिए कि कम से कम 20% पेंशनभोगी धरना में भाग लें ताकि सरकार को हमारी जनशक्ति का अहसास हो।

डॉ ए एम मोहन ने सलाह दी कि हम नए सीआईएल अध्यक्ष से मिलें और वर्षों के संघर्ष व मंत्रालय की आश्वासनों से अवगत कराएं। उन्होंने कहा कि सीपीआरएमएसई के तहत डोमिसाइलरी भुगतान वृद्धि का आदेश अभी जारी नहीं हुआ। सीआईएल सूचीबद्ध अस्पतालों की निगरानी ठीक से नहीं कर रहा और बिल समय पर भुगतान नहीं हो रहे, जिससे लाभार्थियों को उत्पीड़न झेलना पड़ रहा। श्री के एन प्रसाद ने बताया कि पेंशन मामले की अंतिम सुनवाई शीघ्र होगी और आदेश अपेक्षित है।

हालांकि सीआईएल ने सीपीआरएमएसई सेल स्थापित किया है, लेकिन यह संतोषजनक रूप से कार्य नहीं कर रहा और कारण स्टाफ की कमी बताया जा रहा। श्री एन सी सरकार ने जवाब दिया कि दावों की जांच में बहुत समय लग रहा। अन्य सदस्यों ने चिकित्सा दावों निपटान में अनावश्यक देरी का मुद्दा उठाया। कन्वेनर ने सलाह दी कि यदि दावे 2 माह में निपटे तो सभी विवरणों के साथ एआईएसीई को भेजें ताकि सीआईएल से बात की जाए।

सदस्यों को सीपीआरएमएसई में दी गई प्रक्रिया का सख्ती से पालन करने की सलाह दी गई ताकि दावे अस्वीकार न हों। ध्यान दें कि गैर-सूचीबद्ध अस्पतालों (एनएबीएच मान्यता प्राप्त) में इलाज के दावे केस-टू-केस आधार पर निपटाए जाते हैं और सहायक कंपनी के सीएमडी की मंजूरी आवश्यक है। सदस्यों को सभी ऐसे मामलों में पूर्व में सीएमएस को सूचना सुनिश्चित करनी चाहिए।

श्री समयलाल साहू ने कहा कि हमारे मुद्दों को उजागर करने के लिए जी न्यूज हेल्पलाइन का उपयोग करें और टीवी चैनलों को धरनों को कवर करने के लिए आमंत्रित करें।

पेंशन और सीपीआरएमएसई के लिए लाइफ सर्टिफिकेट जमा करने के संबंध में सूचित किया गया कि डिजिटल लाइफ सर्टिफिकेट (जीवन प्रमान) अब घर से फेस रिकग्निशन मोबाइल ऐप से आसानी से जमा किया जा सकता है। इस विषय पर अक्टूबर व नवंबर 2025 में श्री आर ए मंजुनाथ प्रसाद द्वारा दो प्रशिक्षण सत्र आयोजित किए गए। ब्रांच सचिवों को सदस्यों की सहायता करनी चाहिए। पीपीओ नंबर के आधार पर (जिसमें कंपनी का नाम होना चाहिए) डीएलसी स्वतः सीआईएल व सहायक कंपनियों को प्राप्त हो जाता है। डीएलसी प्राप्ति की पुष्टि सीआईएल वेबसाइट पर जाकर की जा सकती है।

निर्णय लिया गया कि मार्च 2026 में तलचेर, कोठागुडेम और नई दिल्ली में धरने आयोजित किए जाएंगे। अंतिम तिथियां शीघ्र तय होंगी। श्री पी के सिंह राठौर, कन्वेनर, एआईएसीई/एआईसीपीए को पेंशन वृद्धि आंदोलन के समर्थन के लिए सीआईएल/एससीसीएल की अन्य संगठनों से संपर्क करने का अधिकार दिया गया।

श्रीमती नबनीता दास, श्री के बी डेब्रे, डॉ एन जी मुखर्जी, श्री डी एन पांडे, श्री बिजन चक्रवर्ती, श्री जे पी सिंह, श्री डी रामचंद्र राव, श्री टी रघुनाथ, श्री श्रीधर भट्ट, श्री अंबिका चक्रवर्ती, श्री आलोक कर चौधरी आदि ने भी अपने विचार व्यक्त किए और आंदोलन फिर शुरू करने का समर्थन किया।

MINUTES OF THE MEETING ON 18TH JANUARY 2026

A Virtual Meeting of AIACE and AICPA was held on 18TH January 2026 on Google meet platform on following agenda.

1. Restarting agitation for enhancement of Pension
2. Issue of Revised Pension Payment Orders
3. CPRMSE/CPRMS-NE benefits and difficulties.

Sri R B Mathur presided over the meeting and Sri

Sri S N Singh Vice-President, AIACE, co-chaired which was attended by around 100 members out of which the names of 70 members were recorded as they were present through out the meeting.

Sri S N Singh said that after the last Dharna on 15th September 2025 before CIL office, Kolkata , we have been waiting patiently. But it is now time for repeat action and we should restart our agitation.

Sri Sri P K Singh Rathor, Principal General Secretary/Convenor, AIACE /AICPA explained the action taken about revision of pension, issue of revised PPOs, empanelment of hospitals. He told that after our successful dharnas at New Delhi, Varanasi, Dhanbad and finally a milestone dharna on 15th September 2025 at Kolkata, the Ministry of Coal published a Draft amendment Bill on Coal Mines Provident Fund Act,1948 and invited comments from the stakeholders. AIACE/AICPA has given several suggestions to improve the existing Coal Mines Pension Scheme to be formulated under this Bill. He stressed that pension is our right and CMPFO is only a custodian of the funds which is to be judiciously invested to ensure high yielding return for adequate pension to the retirees. He said that CMPFO has grossly failed to carry out its responsibilities and we demand that if pension cannot be enhanced, the corpus should be refunded to the pensioners.He further said that the draft Bill was expected to be tabled in the Parliament in the last Monsoon Session. But it has not been introduced either in the Monsoon Session nor in the Winter Session. Although we understand that it is a time taking process to bring about legislative changes, far too much time has gone by and it is now time for us to go for aggressive agitation to get pension enhancement. Sri Rathor invited comments from all the members present.

Sri R B Mathur, President, AIACE, said that CIL is willing to solve the issue and advised that we meet CIL Management. He also said that contract mining has drastically reduced the role of CIL employees

in excavation of coal and CIL is driven by profit motive rather than the welfare of its present and past employees. We should oppose this contract mining system.

Sri N C Sarkar agreed with Sri Mathur that contract mining has ruined the Companies and we should involve the working executives and employees in our fight for proper pension.

Sri A Venu Madhav said that Revised PPOs are being issued in SCCL. In order to improve the pension fund status, at least 5% of company profits should be transferred to the pension fund.

Sri Pawan Tandon said that members of Central Trade unions should also be invited to join us in the struggle for enhancement of pension. Coal blocks are being given to private entities thereby reducing the importance of CIL. A recent example is that Damodar Valley Corporation would stop buying coal from CIL after being allotted a coal block.

Sri Pawan Tandon said that he had filed an RTI Query asking for the details of fund transferred by CIL to CPRMS Trust in the last 5 years. CIL has replied that this information cannot be revealed as it does not pertain to public interest. On the other hand, it is not only in public interest but also involves corruption and the data is to be revealed. Sri Tandon said that CIL is under the ambit of Right to Information Act and is bound to reveal the requested data. He is approaching the appellate authority on this issue as CIL is misutilising the funds.

Sri RK Chowrasia, , Sri Ambika Chakraborty, Sri Bijon Chakraborty, Sri Anjani Kumar, Sri Thomas John, Sri D K Saha, Sri N C Sahoo, Sri Dinkar Sahu among others expressed their support for the Dharna. Sri N C Sahoo said that we should resort to “Rail roko/Rasta Roko” agitation. It was agreed that the agitation will start at Talcher with a dharna.

Sri Dinkar Sahu expressed his opinion that instead of Rail Roko we should go for “Despatch Roko” and involve the local unions at the mines. We should write to all the Unions and invite them to join our movement. We should ensure that at least 20% of the pensioners participate in the dharna so that the government realises the strength of our mass movement.

Dr. A M Mohan advised that we should meet the new Chairman, CIL to appraise him about our years long struggle and the assurances given by the Ministry. He said that the order regarding enhancement of Domiciliary payment under CPRMSE has not yet been issued. CIL is not properly monitoring the empanelled hospitals and the bills are not paid in time leading to the harassment of beneficiaries. Sri K N Prasad informed that the final hearing in the pension case will come up shortly and order is expected.

Although CPRMSE Cell has been set up by CIL, it is not functioning satisfactorily and the reason given is shortage of staff. Sri N C Sarkar replied that scrutiny of claims is taking a lot time. Other members also raised the issue of inordinate delay in settling medical claims. Convenor advised that if claims are not settled within 2 months, the matter should be referred with all the details to AIACE for taking up the issue with CIL.

Members were advised to strictly follow the procedure given in CPRMSE to avoid disallowance of claims. It may be noted that claims for treatment in non-empanelled hospitals (NABH Accredited) are dealt on case-to-case basis and require approval of CMD of the Subsidiary. Members should ensure that intimation is sent to CMS in advance in all such cases.

Sri Samaylal Sahoo said that we should use Zee News Helpline to project our issues and invite TV channels to cover our Dharnas.

Regarding submission of Life Certificate for Pension and CPRMSE, it was informed that Digital Life Certificate (Jeevan Pramaan) can now be submitted easily from home using Face Recognition Mobile App. Two training sessions on this subject were conducted by Sri. R.A.Manjunath Prasad during October & November 2025. Branch Secretaries should help the members in this matter. DLC is automatically received by CIL & the Subsidiaries based on the PPO number which should contain the name of the Company. The receipt of DLC can be confirmed by visiting CIL website.

It was decided that Dharnas will be organised at Talcher, Kothagudem and New Delhi in the month of March 2026. Final dates will be decided shortly. Sri P K Singh Rathor, Convenor, AIACE/AICPA was authorised to contact other organizations of CIL/SCCL for supporting the pension enhancement movement.

Mrs Nabanita Das, Sri K B Debray , Dr N G Mukherjee, Sri D N Pandey, Sri Bijan Charaborty, Sri J P Singh, Sri D Ramchander Rao, Sri T Raghunath, Sri Sreedhar Bhatt, Sri Ambika Charaborty, Sri Alok Kar Choudhary and others also expressed their views and supported the start of movement again. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by Sri. R.A.Manjunath Prasad.

Proceedings

The meeting was called to order by the General Secretary at 8:00 PM. He welcomed all participants, and the following agenda items were transacted:

1. Condolence:

The Committee observed a minute of silence in memory of members who passed away in recent months.

2. Confirmation of Previous Minutes:

The minutes of the last Executive Committee meeting were read, discussed, and confirmed.

Central Committee Update:

The gist of discussions held at the Central Committee's general meeting was presented. It was informed that AIACE is planning an agitation in the form of *Dharna* at Singareni, Talcher, Singrauli coalfields and finally at Jantar Mantar (New Delhi) to press demands for enhancement of pension, CPRMSE, and other allied grievances. The Committee took serious note of the issue and unanimously agreed to support and participate in the program.

3. Grievance Redressal:

a. Pension of Mrs. Sudha Mohan Kumar commenced from December 2025 with arrears, following active follow-up by the Grievance Redressal Committee. However, medical bills of Late Mohan Kumar remain pending, and efforts are ongoing for resolution.

b. The medical bills of Mrs. Sreedhari Pillai (wife of Mr. Phalgunan Pillai) have been long pending with CCL HQ. The matter has been escalated to the PM's Office and the National Commission for Women, and responses have begun to arrive from CCL.

4. Member Greetings:

Birthday and anniversary wishes to members have been implemented from 1st January 2026. The initiative has received positive feedback.

5. Membership Revival:

The Committee discussed the Convenor's directive to motivate past members to rejoin AIACE. While the idea was welcomed, the requirement of paying ₹5,000 as membership subscription was felt to be a deterrent. The possibility of exempting returning members from this fee will be explored.

6. Family Gatherings:

The Kerala Branch's inability to conduct monthly family get-togethers, unlike other branches, was discussed. Given the geographical spread of members across the state, frequent physical meetings are impractical. However, efforts will be made to organize online family meetings more often.

7. Member Contact:

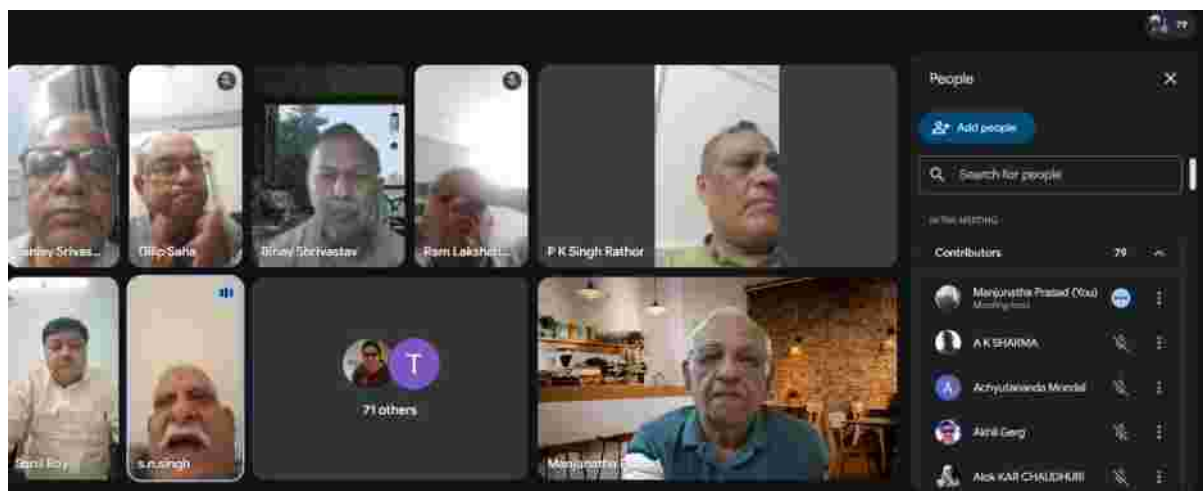

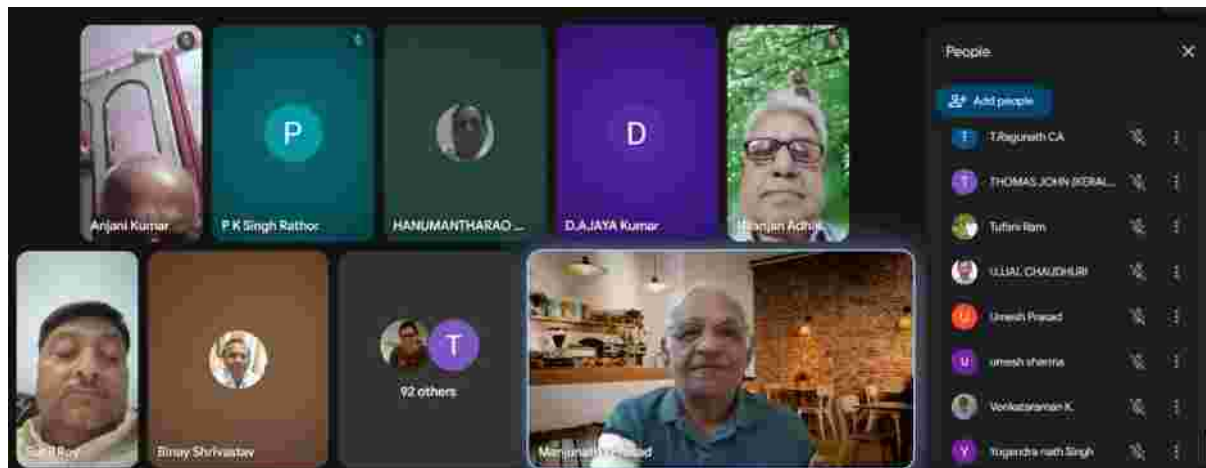
PREPARATIONS FOR DHARNA ON 30TH MARCH 2026

Sri Rathor said that a representation signed by former CMDs and Directors of CIL and SCCL in support of our demand for enhancement of pension will be submitted to the Hon'ble Prime Minister within a few days. This will be a big achievement by AIACE and likely to boost our cause. He informed that 1 banner each of AIACE and AICPA should be brought by all the Branches.

Sri N Adhikary said that Asansol team will attend the dharna in good numbers and requested that a medical team be kept on stand-by. He said that he will bring a few medical instruments like digital oximeter, BP Apparatus, etc., and requested that a manual BP Apparatus be arranged at site.

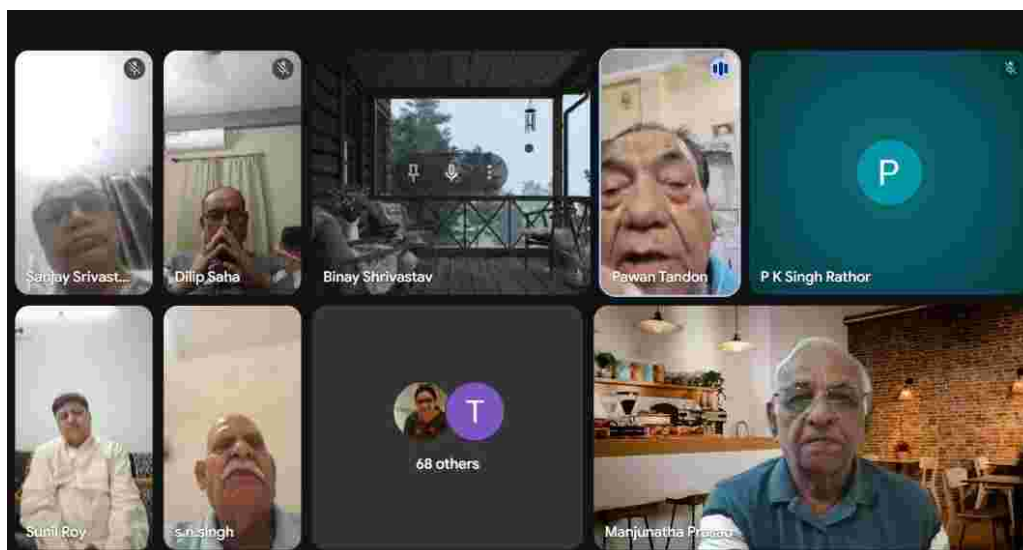
ORIENTATION OF NEWLY ELECTED MEMBERS OF BRANCH & CENTRAL COMMITTEE

Newly elected Branch Committee members who were present were introduced. All of them assured that they will work hard and rise to the occasion.

Dr. B K Srivastva said the basic difference between AIACE and other organizations is that AIACE is formed for the welfare of its members and members should join only if they are ready to help others. Honesty, mutual respect and service are the prime qualities to be possessed by its members. Each member should strive to help in the growth of the association.

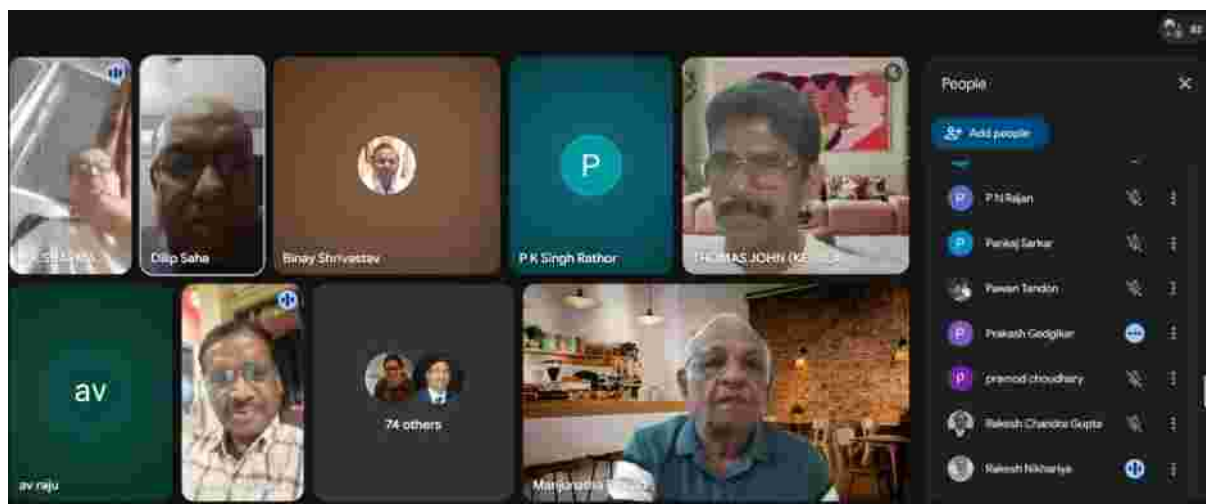


Sri Nilanjan Adhikary said that there is safety in numbers and we should increase the number of members. He urged the executive members to assist all members in solving their problems.

Also Branch wise groups have been created (like B-4/26 BENGALURU AIACE) in which only matters related to the branch are to be posted. Do not make any post of main group in local groups. Any member voluntarily exiting a group will not be re-admitted.

New groups of Central Body and Branch Committees will be created.

The following basic norms are circulated for proper functioning of the Association and for making all AIACE groups highly active, functional, harmonious, inclusive and vibrant groups. All are requested to abide. Any one violating the norm will be removed from the group without assigning any reasons.

1. No political, religious and dogmatic comments should be posted in the group.
2. No derogatory or provocative comments about any faith, caste, creed, language, culture, tradition, state, ethnicity and personal belief should be posted in the group.
3. No slanderous, defamatory or derogatory comments should be posted about any political, religious, social, literary or other well-known personalities, institutions and organizations.
4. No offensive and personal comments should be made about any member.

6. No greeting messages (like Good Morning...) to be posted.
7. Members may exchange pleasantries and greetings on the occasion of festivals, days of significance, religious; social; literary and cultural events but no attempts should be made for promulgation, indoctrination and propagation of any faith, cult and ism.
8. Coal clubs are meant to showcase the talent of members and their family members in the fields of performing arts, literary works and other cultural areas. Every member should try to bring in culturally evolved people to enrich the club.
9. It is further added that the club is a platform for promoting healthy culture, noble thoughts, aesthetic values and grooming of talent. It is observed that some members are posting sermons,

memes, reels, long and tedious videos from entertainment, social media and other channels and cramming the wall of the Club with frivolous posts, silly and uncouth jokes, movie scenes and songs and gibberish in general. This beats the very purpose of the Club.

Branch Presidents and EC Members should ensure that the norms are followed.

Smt. Nabanita Das requested that the Dharna program be broadcast on FaceBook Live for the benefit of members who are not able to visit Delhi. Sri Thomas John is requested to take note of it. She also requested that 1 or 2 members from each Coal Club be deputed for coordinating with CIEWA (CIL Executives Wives Association). She assured that Kolkata Branch is very active and the Executive Members are well connected with all the members.

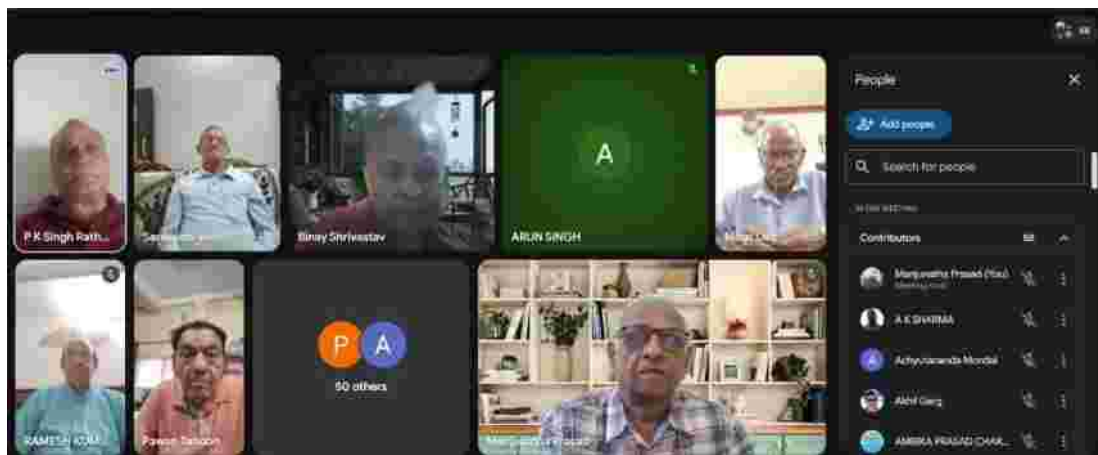
The meeting was presided over initially by Sri P K Tandon and later by Dr. B K Srivastva. He welcomed all the members.

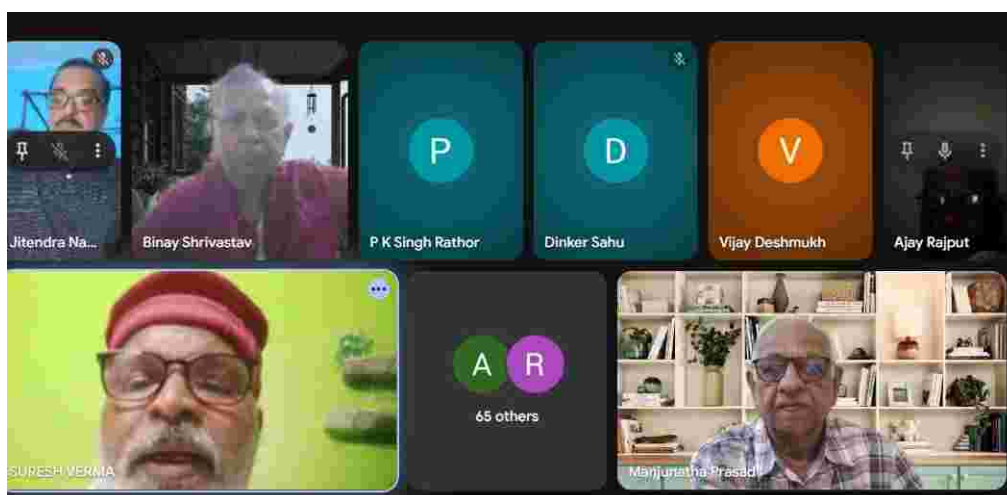

REPORT OF DHARNA AT JANTAR MANTAR ON 30-3-2026 BY PENSIONERS LED BY AICPA/AIACE

On **30 March 2026**, a **Dharna by coal pensioners** was held at Jantar Mantar under the banner of All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA) and All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE). The demonstration highlighted long-pending demands related to coal sector pensions and post-retirement welfare.

Key Points of the Dharna

1. Background

- Retired employees from Coal India Limited (CIL), its subsidiaries, and Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) participated.
- The protest was aimed at pressing the government and coal authorities for reforms in the Coal Mines Pension Scheme 1998 (CMPS-1998).

2. Major Demands

- **Revision of pension under CMPS-1998**, which has remained largely static despite inflation.
- **Regular Dearness Relief** or indexation to protect pensioners from rising costs of living.
- **Implementation of recommendations** from past committees on coal pension reforms.
- **Creation of a sustainable pension fund mechanism** and assurance of long-term pension viability.
- **Healthcare and medical support** for retired mineworkers suffering from occupational illnesses.

3. Participation

- Delegates came from multiple coal-bearing states.
- Leaders from AICPA and AIACE addressed the gathering, urging the government to act on long-pending representations.
- Memoranda were submitted to relevant ministries and authorities for urgent intervention.

4. Core Message

Speakers emphasized that retired coal employees served under hazardous mining conditions and now face severe financial and medical hardships due to stagnating pensions. They appealed for immediate government attention and policy-level reform to ensure dignity and social security for retired miners.

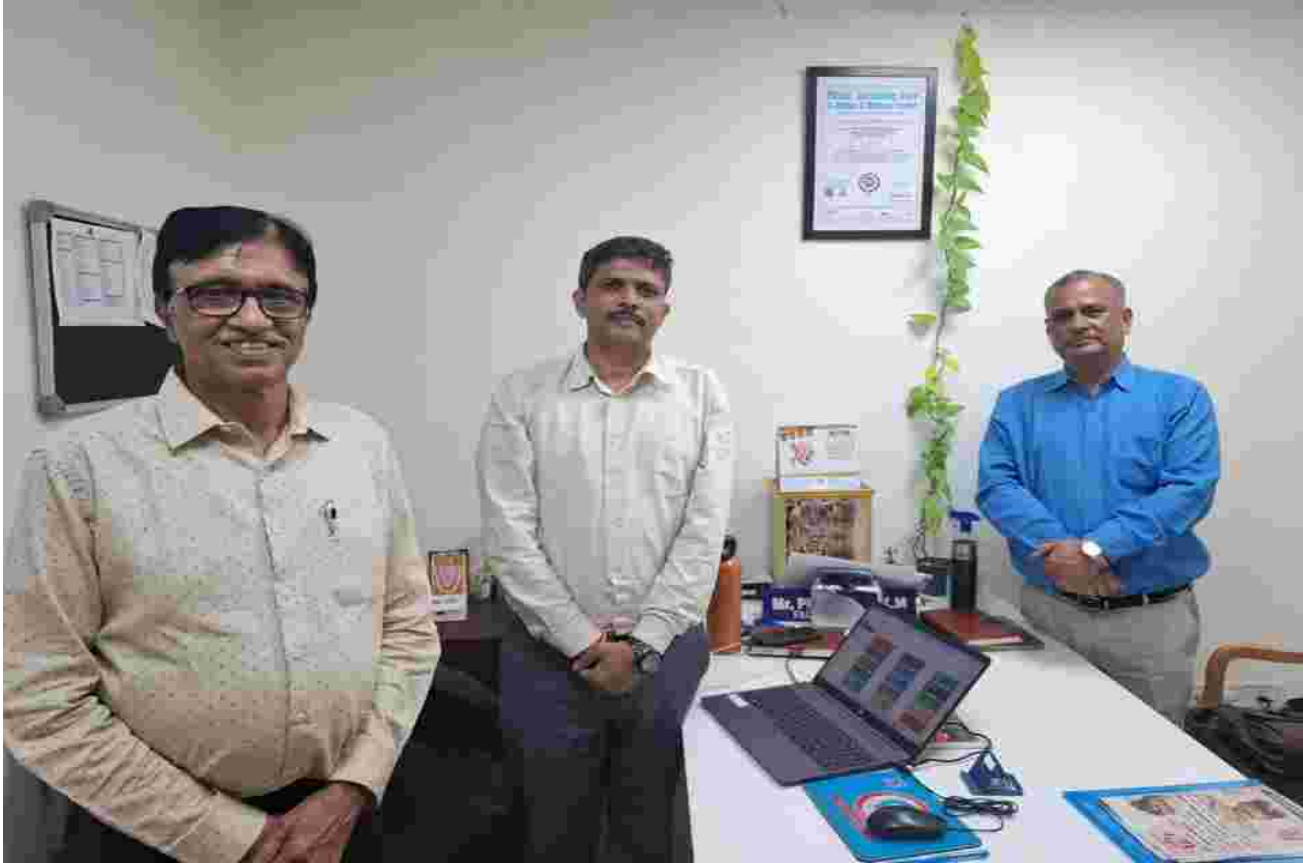

कोयला अफसरों के वेतनमान में बदलाव पर कोल इंडिया लेगा फैसला

They also stated that the association convener PK Singh Rathod should understand the seriousness of the problem and extend their support to them.

Srirampur, February 7 (Andhra Jyoti): Retired after working in the coal sector The All India Association of Coal Executives and the All India Coal Pensioners Association have decided to jointly agitate for an increase in the pension of employees. The leaders of the respective associations took key decisions in a meeting held through Google Meet. Speaking, the association's vice president BK Srivastava said that despite holding a dharna in Kolkata on September 15 last year, there was no response from the government. Coal Pensioners Association convener PK Singh Rathod said that the main demand should be to fight for a pension increase. He also said that the CMPF has completely failed to protect the funds deposited by the employees. He demanded that the corpus fund be paid to the pensioners if the pension cannot be increased. He said that they had also given suggestions in the draft CMPF bill, but the bill has not been introduced in Parliament yet. He said that they have decided to hold a huge dharna in New Delhi on March 30 on pension increase and other issues. Later, they said, they will hold protests in other areas as well. Representatives from Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, and other states participated in the Google Meet in large numbers and expressed their support.

All India Coal Pensioners' Dharna Date Finalized

- Massive protest in New Delhi on March 30

Hyderabad, February 7. The All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA) has decided to hold a massive protest in New Delhi on March 30 to resolve the issues of coal pensioners. A virtual meeting was held under the auspices of AICPA on February 5, 2026 to decide on the dates, times and locations of the dharna events. About 70 members from across the country attended the meeting. The meeting was presided over by Dr. B.K. Srivastava, Vice President of All India Coal Executives Association. He said that we have been waiting patiently since the last dharna held in Kolkata on September 15, 2025, but now the time has come to start the agitation again. AICPA/AICE Convener P.K. Singh Rathore explained the steps taken so far on pension revision, issuance of revised PPOs and empanelment of hospitals. However, he clarified that the main issue is the pension revision. After the dharnas held in New Delhi, Varanasi and Dhanbad and the landmark dharna held in Kolkata on September 15, 2025, the Coal Ministry released a draft of the Coal Mines Provident Fund Bill, but it has not been introduced in Parliament so far. Pension is our right and it is our responsibility to use the funds judiciously so that retirees get adequate pension.

He alleged that the CMPFT is a corporation, but that the organization has failed to discharge its responsibilities properly. He demanded that if the pension cannot be increased, at least the pension corpus should be paid back to the pensioners. He said that in the last meeting held on January 18, 2026, it was decided to organize dharnas in Talcher, Kothagudem and New Delhi in the month of March. On this occasion, the views of the members were invited. Dr. B.K. Srivastava, speaking, suggested the possibility of organizing dharnas in three phases in March. However, All India Association of Coal Officers Vice President S.N. Singh criticized that so far there have been empty promises and no clear actions. He called for intensifying the movement even if it is necessary to face arrests and for members to attend in large numbers to make the dharnas successful.

Pawan Tandon, on behalf of the All India Coal Pensioners Association, suggested that the agitation should not be delayed any further and that the dates be fixed in advance keeping in mind the festivals. Shri N.C. Sahu from Talcher said that the members there were interested in participating in the dharna rather than the rail roko. He revealed that the issue had been brought to the notice of the Chief Minister of Odisha. Dinkar Sahu and Shyamal Sahu from Betal assured that about 1000 members would participate in the dharna. D. Ramachandra Rao and A. Venumadhav from Hyderabad said that a large number of representatives from Telangana and Andhra Pradesh states would participate. After extensive discussions, a final decision was taken to organize a huge dharna in New Delhi on March 30, 2026. It was announced that agitations would be held in other places in the next phase if necessary. The All India Coal Pensioners Association has appealed to current and retired employees and their families to participate in the movement, saying that the pension amendment will benefit all coal employees and pensioners.

Representatives from Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh and other states participated in the meeting in large numbers and expressed full support. The pension revision is beneficial to all employees - current and retired, and the leadership called on them to participate in the movement along with their families. In this meeting, Singareni Retired Employees Welfare Association President Dandam Raju Ramchandra Rao and General Secretary Alavandar Venu Madhav participated and said that they are working hard to consult ministers and MPs for the pension revision, and a large number of representatives from Telangana will participate in the dharna. ILO should intervene on CMPF pension issue

Hyderabad, March 11: Representatives of AICPA and AIACE have appealed to the International Labour Organization (ILO) to intervene in the issue of meager pensions being received by coal miners in India under the Coal Mines Pension Scheme. To this end, the representatives of the association said on Thursday that they have sent a letter of representation to the Director General of the International Labour Organization through e-mail on behalf of the All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA) and the All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE). This appeal was sent by AICPA convener P.K. Singh Rathore through e-mail. According to the letter, coal miners have worked in extremely dangerous conditions during their service and have made immense contributions to the industrial development and energy security of the country. However, after retirement, many workers have to live on a pension that is not even enough for a minimum livelihood. Coal Mines Pension is currently administered by the Coal Mines Provident Fund Organization (CMPFO).

It was stated that many pensioners under the scheme are getting only a monthly pension that is too low for a dignified life. They said that despite their associations having appealed to the Coal Ministry and the concerned authorities on this issue several times, no appropriate action has been taken. In this context, they have requested that the minimum pension be increased significantly that the pension be linked to inflation with the Dearness Relief (DR) mechanism, and that the pension be revised from time to time keeping in mind the cost of living. They also suggested that a transparent digital portal be set up for CMPF pensioners and pension administration should be improved. In the absence of a proper response from the concerned government agencies, the coal pensioners' associations have decided to hold a peaceful dharna at Jantar Mantar, New Delhi on March 30, 2026 to focus on this long-standing issue. They appealed to the International Labour Organization, which is committed to protecting labor rights and social security standards, to look into this issue, bring it to the notice of the concerned authorities and show the way for a solution.

We have sought the intervention of the International Labor Organization on the plight of coal pensioners.

He expressed his concern that the pension currently being received by coal miners under the Coal Mines Pension Scheme run by the Mines Provident Fund Organisation is very low. Rathore reminded that coal miners have worked in extremely dangerous, underground conditions for decades for the industrial development and energy security of the country. However, the pension they receive after retirement is not even adequate for basic livelihood, and despite their associations submitting several representations to the Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation, the Coal Ministry and other concerned authorities on this issue, there has been no proper response.

Keeping in view the rising cost of living, they are demanding a significant increase in the minimum pension in the coal pension scheme, and provision of drought relief by linking the pension to inflation. Similarly, the unions are also demanding a system of periodic revision of pension and the establishment of a transparent digital pensioner portal for coal mines pensioners. Rathore said that a peaceful dharna will be held at Jantar Mantar in New Delhi on the 30th of this month, demanding that the government take immediate action on this long-pending issue. He made it clear that providing a dignified pension to coal miners who have served the country is a matter of social justice as well as human dignity. We hope that the International Labour Organization will kindly look into this matter and extend its moral support to resolve the issue of coal pensioners in India, P.K. Singh Rathore said.

‘Many Have Passed Away Waiting’: Retired Coal Workers Demand Pension Revision Pending for Three Decades

The pensioners, all of whom are now in the age bracket of 60-90 years, say that their pensions have never been revised despite a mandate to review the amount every three years.

New Delhi: Retired coal workers across the country are planning a fresh protest as their pensions have not been revised since the time of their retirement, with several top-level executives getting less than Rs 10,000 per month.

The retired employees – mainly from Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL), Coal India Limited (CIL) and their subsidiary companies – have alleged that the pension amount which, as per the Coal Mines Pension Scheme, 1998, is to be reviewed every three years has not been revised since inception. Additionally, the 1998, 2007 and 2017 wage revisions for employees were also not applied to these pensioners.

“There are more than five lakh coal pensioners whose pensions have not been revised. Many have even passed away waiting,” said Venu Madhav, a retired SCCL employee, who has been advocating for pension revision for years.

While the government raised the minimum monthly pension rate in 2024 to Rs 1,000 for those getting even lesser, many mid-to-senior-level retired employees continue to receive meagre monthly pensions that have not kept pace with inflation.

SCCL and CIL are both public sector undertakings under the administrative control of the Union coal ministry. However, these pensioners have been overlooked despite the pensions of other central government employees **having been enhanced** from time to time as per the Unified Pension Scheme.

Similarly, the pension amount for employees of other public sector enterprises and public sector undertakings – like Gas Authority of India Ltd, Indian Oil Corporation, Bharat Petroleum Corporation and public sector banks – have also increased over the years.

The Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation (CMPFO), the autonomous body which provides for the pension of coal sector employees, and falls under the Union coal ministry, has repeatedly told the pensioners that due to a shortage of funds, they have not revised the pensions.

Pensioners have, however, countered this in a petition in the Delhi high court, stating that the fund has grown over the years.

‘Government not doing anything for us’

Rayanna P.B. worked at SCCL, Telangana for 33 years before retiring as the chief transport officer with a basic pay of Rs 40,000 in 2006. Seventy nine now, he gets a pension of Rs 8,087 per month, the same as 20 years ago.

“We work so hard for so many years, take risks on the job, inhale coal dust regularly, yet the government is not doing anything to improve our lives,” he alleged.

Ramachandra Reddy B., another SCCL retiree who retired as a general manager of civil operations in 2002, said, “I was on one of the higher pay brackets. Yet, my pension, which was Rs 4,000 at the time, has not been revised to date.”

In 2002, Reddy drew a basic pay of Rs 23,600, which he said was equivalent to nearly Rs 1 lakh, with the wage revisions for employees since. “What good is Rs 4,000 today to run daily expenses?” the 82-year-old asked.

Like him, Prabir Kumar Mukherjee, a retired CIL executive, who gets a monthly pension of Rs 9,977, said, “The basic pay of employees has increased over the years. The 2007 and 2017 wage revisions

provided for handsome revisions for newer employees, making way for better pensions too. However, for us, in 27 years, there has been no pension revision.”

“The Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation keeps saying that they do not have funds and so cannot increase the pension rate. The government is taking no action in this regard,” Mukherjee said.

Madhav said, “The central government keeps talking about ‘*atmanirbharta*’, they ask us to be ‘*atmanirbhar*’, but how will we be if we remain so poor? So many industries are dependent on coal and coal workers – power supply being at the top. It is a dangerous job that we do, there are health risks involved. Yet, we are not given enough pension or benefits to even pay medical bills.”

A Bill yet to be tabled in the parliament

The retirement age for coal mine employees is 60 years. Many of the protesting pensioners are in the age bracket of 70-90 years now, facing serious health problems and struggling to meet daily expenses.

The Coal Mines Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1948, was last amended in 1996. The Coal Mines Pension Scheme, which replaced the Coal Mines Family Pension Scheme, 1971, came into effect on March 31, 1998, to provide monthly pension benefits to retired coal miners, and was covered under the 1948 Act.

In October 2025, 77 years after the 1948 Act’s enactment, and following years of protests by coal pensioners, the Union government announced an overhaul by proposing a draft Bill, titled the [Coal Mines Employees’ Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Bill, 2025](#).

The Bill has not been tabled in the parliament yet. In a letter to the coal ministry, dated October 15, 2025, the All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE) and All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA), demanded restructuring of the pension scheme to include the pensioners’ demands – a substantial increase in coal pensions, linking pensions to inflation and ensuring financial security and dignity for retired coal workers who dedicated their lives to building the nation’s coal industry.

The associations also sought a timeline for the preparation and implementation of a new pension scheme under this Bill to ensure the introduction of a Dynamic Pension Scheme with built-in Dearness Relief (DR) linkage without requiring parliamentary amendment, as per the letter. DR is additional payment to pensioners to ensure the pay keeps up with inflation.

'No dearness allowance'

The AIACE and AICPA has organised similar protests several times in the past too, including in 2019, 2022, 2023 and 2025.

Speaking to *The Wire*, P.K. Singh Rathor, convener of the AIACE-AICPA, said that in so many years, there was also no provision for dearness relief in the scheme. "As a result, even someone who retired at the top level may be getting something around Rs 3,000 because their pension was never revised," he said.

In a supplementary letter, the coal employees' body said, "In the 27 years since the pension scheme's inception, no comprehensive revision or actuarial rebalancing has ever been implemented. The pension amount paid to retired coal employees is grossly inadequate – in many cases less than Rs 1,000 per month – rendering the scheme socially meaningless and financially exploitative.

"The Court case and representations for enhancement of pension over two decades show a complete failure of fiduciary responsibility and erosion of pensioners' faith in the system," the letter added.

When *The Wire* reached out to the coal ministry, it reverted with the standard response that the CMPFO "does not have sufficient funds to sustain an increase in pension".

According to Chetna Shukla, deputy director general at the coal ministry, matters of pension revisions are dealt "on a case-to-case basis".

The Wire also reached out to the CMPFO commissioner regarding the status of the revisions. Assistant Commissioner, CMPFO, Madhuresh Kumar Singh pointed to a Rs 47 crore-deficit in funds. "The matter is under review. Decisions are taken by the board of trustees. We do not know anything about it," he said.

'They claim insufficient funds, but the companies are making a profit'

P.T. Rao, who retired in 2001 as a senior finance executive from the SCCL in Telangana, receives a mere Rs 5,000 as monthly pension. "We have approached the central government many times, written to the prime minister, coal minister, etc. They keep saying they don't have sufficient funds but the companies are making profits," he alleged.

In July 2025, the parliament's Public Accounts Committee (PAC), chaired by Congress general secretary and Lok Sabha member KC Venugopal, [tabled its report](#) in the House saying that the "failure of Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation (CMPFO) to take timely decision to redeem debentures of Diwan Housing Finance Corporation Limited (DHFL) resulted in [an] avoidable loss of Rs 315.35 crore".

The PAC observed that money from the CMPFO was invested in the debentures of DHFL despite its "ill reputation".

The committee had observed there has been "critical irregularity" on part of the Ministry of Coal to oversee the functioning of CMPFO which led to the failure to ensure safety of its investments due to "lackadaisical approach in redeeming debentures of DHFL despite adverse critical ratings."

"The funds are not being diverted to the pensioners. We are the worst sufferers," Rao said.

In 2015, petitioners, under the banner of Federation of Coal Industries Retired Employees Association, had approached the Delhi high court regarding the valuation and revision of the Coal Mines Pension Scheme.

According to the petitioners, the pension fund grew from Rs 21,033.27 crore in 2022-23 to Rs 22,898.90 crore in 2023-24, and stood at Rs 24,495.66 crore as of March 31, 2025.

Despite an apparent monetarily healthy position, they argued, the members of the pension fund are drawing a very meagre amount of pension due to non-revision at the end of the Board and the Union government.

The matter is expected to be listed before the Delhi high court on March 20.

Meanwhile, coal pensioners have decided to stage a *dharna* at Jantar Mantar in New Delhi on March 30 to raise their demands.

The protest is being organised by AIACE-AICPA and other pensioners' organisations. Ahead of the protest, Rathor said that the government should recognise the sacrifices of coal workers and take immediate action to resolve the long-pending pension issue, emphasising the need to draw national attention to the difficult conditions faced by thousands of elderly coal pensioners.

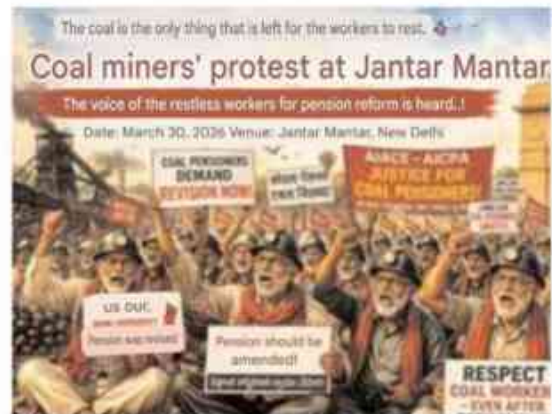
The voices of coal pensioners fighting for pensions, will resonate at Jantar Mantar

A distinguished group of 75 members, consisting of former Chairmen, CMDs and Directors of Coal India Limited and Singareni Collieries Company Limited, has submitted an appeal to the Prime Minister, Narendra Modi, urging immediate and meaningful reform of coal pension.

The appeal was submitted with active efforts made by Onkar Singh, Executive Body member of All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE) who, on behalf of the elite group, submitted this in person.

The appeal, dated 23 March 2026, highlights the long-standing issue affecting nearly 5 lakh retired coal employees, whose pensions-fixed at the time of

retirement-have remained stagnant without any linkage to inflation or rising cost of living. Coal industry in India holds a unique and critical position in meeting the nation's primary energy requirements. Unlike other industries, its sustainability depends heavily on scientific mining and conservation undertaken in the past by its employees.

The former senior leadership emphasized that India's coal sector, which contributes over 55% of the nation's commercial energy needs, has been built through decades of dedicated service under extremely hazardous and challenging conditions. They noted that these contributions have enabled the sector to generate over ₹70,000 crore annually for the national exchequer.

The representation also draws attention to serious concerns regarding the Coal Mines Pension Scheme, 1998 (CMPS-1998), including issues of corpus management and suboptimal investment decisions. These concerns were earlier highlighted in the 12th Report of the Public Accounts Committee (2020), yet remain largely unaddressed.

The signatories have urged the Government of India to:

- Undertake immediate revision of coal pension
- Introduce a mechanism for periodic adjustment linked to inflation
- Ensure fair returns on contributions under CMPS-1998
- Restore dignity and financial security for retired coal employees

The appeal underscores that coal pensioners are not seeking any favour, but only the rightful realization of benefits assured under the pension scheme.

The team of old veterans of coal industry, retd. Chairmen, CMDs, Directors of Coal India Ltd and Singareni Collieries Company Ltd have also reiterated their full support to the peaceful movement led by All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE) and All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA) for justice to coal pensioners.

AIACE and AICPA expressed confidence that the Hon'ble Prime Minister will take a sympathetic and time-bound decision to address this long-pending issue of national importance.

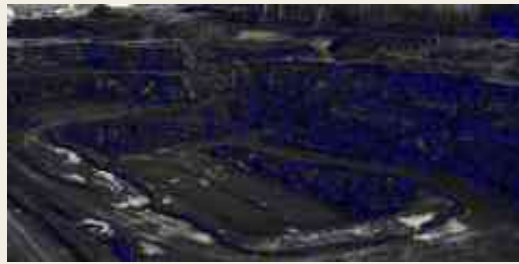

‘Spent Our Lives Serving the Nation’: Ex-Coal Mine Employees

New Delhi: Seventy-five retired coal mine employees, consisting of former chairmen, managing directors and directors of Coal India Limited and Singareni Collieries Company Limited, on Monday (March 23) wrote to prime minister Narendra Modi, urging him to address the issue of long pending pension revision, which they have repeatedly raised has remained unchanged without any revision since their retirement.

“We have superannuated from Coal India Ltd. (CIL) / its Subsidiary Companies and Singareni Collieries Company Ltd. (SCCL), after serving the nation for decades, many of us at the level of Chairman and Directors. Our collective efforts, along with lakhs of coal workers, have helped build these institutions into pillars of India’s energy security, contributing over 55% of the country’s commercial energy needs and generating more than Ra 70,000 crores annually for the national exchequer,” read a letter, dated March 23, 2026.

“The root of the problem is the fact that the pension fixed on the date of retirement, remains constant forever without any adjustment for rise in prices,” they said.

The retirement age for coal mine employees is 60 years. Many of the protesting pensioners are in the age bracket of 70-90 years now, facing serious health problems and struggling to meet daily expenses.

The Wire has previously [reported](#) that several top-level executives of these coal companies receive a pension of less than Rs 10,000 per month. The pension amount which, as per the Coal Mines Pension Scheme (CMPS), 1998, is to be reviewed every three years has not been revised for many employees since inception. Additionally, the 1998, 2007 and 2017 wage revisions for employees were also not applied to these pensioners.

The pensioners have alleged that for decades, they have worked in some of the harshest and most hazardous conditions, “comparable only to those of jawans in the armed forces, to power the nation’s growth and ensure energy security”. Yet, many of these retired workers are now struggling to survive because the pension rates have fallen far behind the rising costs of living, medicines and basic necessities.

“It is deeply concerning that pension in coal sector under CMPS-1998 has suffered due to corpus mismanagement and suboptimal investment decisions. These shortcomings have already been highlighted in the 12th Report of the Public Accounts Committee (Report No. 2193, presented on 18th March 2020). Though the Government had agreed to review and restructure the scheme, no meaningful corrective action has followed,” they have said.

The Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation (CMPFO), the autonomous body which provides for the pension of coal sector employees, and falls under the Union coal ministry, has repeatedly told the pensioners that their pensions have not been revised due to a shortage of funds.

In October 2025, 77 years after the 1948 Act’s enactment, the Union government announced an overhaul by proposing a draft Bill, titled the [Coal Mines Employees’ Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Bill, 2025](#).

The Bill has not been tabled in the parliament yet.

In March last year, Modi, hailing the country’s achievement of 1 billion tonne coal production, called it a “historic milestone” and “proud moment for India”, and [recognised](#) the relentless dedication and hard work of those associated with the sector.

Highlighting this, the coal pensioners said that the “entire Coal Family of India felt proud” when this was declared. “Such proud moments are because of the dedication of today’s

workforce in coal (tomorrow's pensioners) and equally the contribution of the past workforce (today's pensioners)."

The pensioners have demanded the government to take immediate steps to substantially increase the coal pension so that retired miners and employees can "live their remaining years with dignity and security".

"It is an issue of justice, dignity, and national gratitude to those who spent their lives serving the nation from beneath the earth to keep the wheels of the economy running," they said.

They have also demanded the government to introduce a mechanism for periodic adjustment linked to inflation, ensure fair returns on contributions under CMPS-1998 and restore dignity and financial security for retired coal employees. Separately, they have also demanded that medical facilities be provided free of cost to retired employees and their spouses.

Notably, the All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE) and the All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA) have been raising these demands for years.

"It is a matter of grave concern that while the coal sector – particularly Coal India Limited and Singareni Collieries Company Limited – has consistently contributed thousands of crores of rupees to the national exchequer in the form of taxes, royalties, and dividends, the very workforce that built and sustained this sector has been left neglected in their old age," the associations said in a letter on Monday to Securities and Exchange Board of India, Bombay Stock Exchange and National Stock Exchange of India.

The coal pensioners, led by AIACE and AICPA, have decided to stage a *dharna* at Jantar Mantar in New Delhi on March 30 to raise their demands.

Mancherial, 25th March (Praja Jyoti): Nationwide delay in granting widow pension to the life partners of K coal mine pensioners after their death is a matter of great concern. The same situation continues in Singareni area as well, causing financial and mental hardship to the widows. As per the rules, immediately after the death of a retired employee, the pension account should be converted to 'Former Survivor Mode' without any delay in the payment of family pension to his wife. For this, the Aadhaar, PAN cards and Pension Payment Order (PPO) copies of the wife and husband have to be submitted to the Coal Mines Provident Fund (CMPF). As part of this process, the pension available to the wife (usually 60 percent) is clearly mentioned in the revised PPO. In case of sudden death of a retired employee, after getting the revised PPO, the concerned widow should submit the death



certificate, Aadhaar, PAN and bank passbook copies along with the PPO copies to the SBI branch manager in his/her residential area. The bank officials sent the documents to the nodal bank in Dhanbad and

‘Many Have Passed Away Waiting’: Retired Coal Workers Demand Pension Revision Pending for Three Decades

The pensioners, all of whom are now in the age bracket of 60-90 years, say that their pensions have never been revised despite a mandate to review the amount every three years.

New Delhi: Retired coal workers across the country are planning a fresh protest as their pensions have not been revised since the time of their retirement, with several top-level executives getting less than Rs 10,000 per month.

The retired employees – mainly from Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL), Coal India Limited (CIL) and their subsidiary companies – have alleged that the pension amount which, as per the Coal Mines Pension Scheme, 1998, is to be reviewed every three years has not been revised since inception. Additionally, the 1998, 2007 and 2017 wage revisions for employees were also not applied to these pensioners.

“There are more than five lakh coal pensioners whose pensions have not been revised. Many have even passed away waiting,” said Venu Madhav, a retired SCCL employee, who has been advocating for pension revision for years.

While the government raised the minimum monthly pension rate in 2024 to Rs 1,000 for those getting even lesser, many mid-to-senior-level retired employees continue to receive meagre monthly pensions that have not kept pace with inflation.

SCCL and CIL are both public sector undertakings under the administrative control of the Union coal ministry. However, these pensioners have been overlooked despite the pensions of other central government employees **having been enhanced** from time to time as per the Unified Pension Scheme.

Similarly, the pension amount for employees of other public sector enterprises and public sector undertakings – like Gas Authority of India Ltd, Indian Oil Corporation, Bharat Petroleum Corporation and public sector banks – have also increased over the years.

The Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation (CMPFO), the autonomous body which provides for the pension of coal sector employees, and falls under the Union coal ministry, has repeatedly told the pensioners that due to a shortage of funds, they have not revised the pensions.

Pensioners have, however, countered this in a petition in the Delhi high court, stating that the fund has grown over the years.

‘Government not doing anything for us’

Rayanna P.B. worked at SCCL, Telangana for 33 years before retiring as the chief transport officer with a basic pay of Rs 40,000 in 2006. Seventy nine now, he gets a pension of Rs 8,087 per month, the same as 20 years ago.

“We work so hard for so many years, take risks on the job, inhale coal dust regularly, yet the government is not doing anything to improve our lives,” he alleged.

Ramachandra Reddy B., another SCCL retiree who retired as a general manager of civil operations in 2002, said, “I was on one of the higher pay brackets. Yet, my pension, which was Rs 4,000 at the time, has not been revised to date.”

In 2002, Reddy drew a basic pay of Rs 23,600, which he said was equivalent to nearly Rs 1 lakh, with the wage revisions for employees since. “What good is Rs 4,000 today to run daily expenses?” the 82-year-old asked.

Like him, Prabir Kumar Mukherjee, a retired CIL executive, who gets a monthly pension of Rs 9,977, said, “The basic pay of employees has increased over the years. The 2007 and 2017 wage revisions

provided for handsome revisions for newer employees, making way for better pensions too. However, for us, in 27 years, there has been no pension revision.”

“The Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation keeps saying that they do not have funds and so cannot increase the pension rate. The government is taking no action in this regard,” Mukherjee said.

Madhav said, “The central government keeps talking about ‘*atmanirbharta*’, they ask us to be ‘*atmanirbhar*’, but how will we be if we remain so poor? So many industries are dependent on coal and coal workers – power supply being at the top. It is a dangerous job that we do, there are health risks involved. Yet, we are not given enough pension or benefits to even pay medical bills.”

A Bill yet to be tabled in the parliament

The retirement age for coal mine employees is 60 years. Many of the protesting pensioners are in the age bracket of 70-90 years now, facing serious health problems and struggling to meet daily expenses.

The Coal Mines Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1948, was last amended in 1996. The Coal Mines Pension Scheme, which replaced the Coal Mines Family Pension Scheme, 1971, came into effect on March 31, 1998, to provide monthly pension benefits to retired coal miners, and was covered under the 1948 Act.

In October 2025, 77 years after the 1948 Act’s enactment, and following years of protests by coal pensioners, the Union government announced an overhaul by proposing a draft Bill, titled the [Coal Mines Employees’ Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Bill, 2025](#).

The Bill has not been tabled in the parliament yet. In a letter to the coal ministry, dated October 15, 2025, the All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE) and All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA), demanded restructuring of the pension scheme to include the pensioners’ demands – a substantial increase in coal pensions, linking pensions to inflation and ensuring financial security and dignity for retired coal workers who dedicated their lives to building the nation’s coal industry.

The associations also sought a timeline for the preparation and implementation of a new pension scheme under this Bill to ensure the introduction of a Dynamic Pension Scheme with built-in Dearness Relief (DR) linkage without requiring parliamentary amendment, as per the letter. DR is additional payment to pensioners to ensure the pay keeps up with inflation.

‘No dearness allowance’

The AIACE and AICPA has organised similar protests several times in the past too, including in 2019, 2022, 2023 and 2025.

Speaking to *The Wire*, P.K. Singh Rathor, convener of the AIACE-AICPA, said that in so many years, there was also no provision for dearness relief in the scheme. “As a result, even someone who retired at the top level may be getting something around Rs 3,000 because their pension was never revised,” he said.

In a supplementary letter, the coal employees’ body said, “In the 27 years since the pension scheme’s inception, no comprehensive revision or actuarial rebalancing has ever been implemented. The pension amount paid to retired coal employees is grossly inadequate – in many cases less than Rs 1,000 per month – rendering the scheme socially meaningless and financially exploitative.

“The Court case and representations for enhancement of pension over two decades show a complete failure of fiduciary responsibility and erosion of pensioners’ faith in the system,” the letter added.

When *The Wire* reached out to the coal ministry, it reverted with the standard response that the CMPFO “does not have sufficient funds to sustain an increase in pension”.

According to Chetna Shukla, deputy director general at the coal ministry, matters of pension revisions are dealt “on a case-to-case basis”.

The Wire also reached out to the CMPFO commissioner regarding the status of the revisions. Assistant Commissioner, CMPFO, Madhuresh Kumar Singh pointed to a Rs 47 crore-deficit in funds. “The matter is under review. Decisions are taken by the board of trustees. We do not know anything about it,” he said.

‘They claim insufficient funds, but the companies are making a profit’

P.T. Rao, who retired in 2001 as a senior finance executive from the SCCL in Telangana, receives a mere Rs 5,000 as monthly pension. “We have approached the central government many times, written to the prime minister, coal minister, etc. They keep saying they don’t have sufficient funds but the companies are making profits,” he alleged.

In July 2025, the parliament’s Public Accounts Committee (PAC), chaired by Congress general secretary and Lok Sabha member KC Venugopal, [tabled its report](#) in the House saying that the “failure of Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation (CMPFO) to take timely decision to redeem

debentures of Diwan Housing Finance Corporation Limited (DHFL) resulted in [an] avoidable loss of Rs 315.35 crore”.

The PAC observed that money from the CMPFO was invested in the debentures of DHFL despite its “ill reputation”.

The committee had observed there has been “critical irregularity” on part of the Ministry of Coal to oversee the functioning of CMPFO which led to the failure to ensure safety of its investments due to “lackadaisical approach in redeeming debentures of DHFL despite adverse critical ratings.”

“The funds are not being diverted to the pensioners. We are the worst sufferers,” Rao said.

In 2015, petitioners, under the banner of Federation of Coal Industries Retired Employees Association, had approached the Delhi high court regarding the valuation and revision of the Coal Mines Pension Scheme.

According to the petitioners, the pension fund grew from Rs 21,033.27 crore in 2022-23 to Rs 22,898.90 crore in 2023-24, and stood at Rs 24,495.66 crore as of March 31, 2025.

Despite an apparent monetarily healthy position, they argued, the members of the pension fund are drawing a very meagre amount of pension due to non-revision at the end of the Board and the Union government.

The matter is expected to be listed before the Delhi high court on March 20.

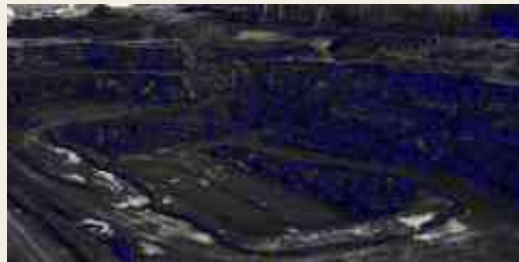
Meanwhile, coal pensioners have decided to stage a *dharna* at Jantar Mantar in New Delhi on March 30 to raise their demands.

The protest is being organised by AIACE-AICPA and other pensioners’ organisations. Ahead of the protest, Rathor said that the government should recognise the sacrifices of coal workers and take immediate action to resolve the long-pending pension issue, emphasising the need to draw national attention to the difficult conditions faced by thousands of elderly coal pensioners.

‘Spent Our Lives Serving the Nation’: Ex-Coal Mine Employees

Write to Modi Over Pension Revision

The pensioners have alleged that for decades, they have worked in some of the harshest and most hazardous conditions. Yet, they are now struggling to survive because the pension rates have fallen far behind the rising costs of living, medicines and basic necessities.

New Delhi: Seventy-five retired coal mine employees, consisting of former chairmen, managing directors and directors of Coal India Limited and Singareni Collieries Company Limited, on Monday (March 23) wrote to prime minister Narendra Modi, urging him to address the issue of long pending pension revision, which they have repeatedly raised has remained unchanged without any revision since their retirement.

“We have superannuated from Coal India Ltd. (CIL) / its Subsidiary Companies and Singareni Collieries Company Ltd. (SCCL), after serving the nation for decades, many of us at the level of Chairman and Directors. Our collective efforts, along with lakhs of coal workers, have helped build these institutions into pillars of India’s energy security, contributing over 55% of the country’s commercial energy needs and generating more than Ra 70,000 crores annually for the national exchequer,” read a letter, dated March 23, 2026.

“The root of the problem is the fact that the pension fixed on the date of retirement, remains constant forever without any adjustment for rise in prices,” they said.

The retirement age for coal mine employees is 60 years. Many of the protesting pensioners are in the age bracket of 70-90 years now, facing serious health problems and struggling to meet daily expenses.

The Wire has previously [reported](#) that several top-level executives of these coal companies receive a pension of less than Rs 10,000 per month. The pension amount which, as per the Coal Mines Pension Scheme (CMPS), 1998, is to be reviewed every three years has not been revised for many employees since inception. Additionally, the 1998, 2007 and 2017 wage revisions for employees were also not applied to these pensioners.

The pensioners have alleged that for decades, they have worked in some of the harshest and most hazardous conditions, “comparable only to those of jawans in the armed forces, to power the nation’s growth and ensure energy security”. Yet, many of these retired workers are now struggling to survive because the pension rates have fallen far behind the rising costs of living, medicines and basic necessities.

“It is deeply concerning that pension in coal sector under CMPS-1998 has suffered due to corpus mismanagement and suboptimal investment decisions. These shortcomings have already been highlighted in the 12th Report of the Public Accounts Committee (Report No. 2193, presented on 18th March 2020). Though the Government had agreed to review and restructure the scheme, no meaningful corrective action has followed,” they have said.

The Coal Mines Provident Fund Organisation (CMPFO), the autonomous body which provides for the pension of coal sector employees, and falls under the Union coal ministry, has repeatedly told the pensioners that their pensions have not been revised due to a shortage of funds.

In October 2025, 77 years after the 1948 Act’s enactment, the Union government announced an overhaul by proposing a draft Bill, titled the [Coal Mines Employees’ Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Bill, 2025](#).

The Bill has not been tabled in the parliament yet.

In March last year, Modi, hailing the country’s achievement of 1 billion tonne coal production, called it a “historic milestone” and “proud moment for India”, and [recognised](#) the relentless dedication and hard work of those associated with the sector.

Highlighting this, the coal pensioners said that the “entire Coal Family of India felt proud” when this was declared. “Such proud moments are because of the dedication of today’s

workforce in coal (tomorrow's pensioners) and equally the contribution of the past workforce (today's pensioners)."

The pensioners have demanded the government to take immediate steps to substantially increase the coal pension so that retired miners and employees can "live their remaining years with dignity and security".

"It is an issue of justice, dignity, and national gratitude to those who spent their lives serving the nation from beneath the earth to keep the wheels of the economy running," they said.

They have also demanded the government to introduce a mechanism for periodic adjustment linked to inflation, ensure fair returns on contributions under CMPS-1998 and restore dignity and financial security for retired coal employees. Separately, they have also demanded that medical facilities be provided free of cost to retired employees and their spouses.

Notably, the All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE) and the All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA) have been raising these demands for years.

"It is a matter of grave concern that while the coal sector – particularly Coal India Limited and Singareni Collieries Company Limited – has consistently contributed thousands of crores of rupees to the national exchequer in the form of taxes, royalties, and dividends, the very workforce that built and sustained this sector has been left neglected in their old age," the associations said in a letter on Monday to Securities and Exchange Board of India, Bombay Stock Exchange and National Stock Exchange of India.

The coal pensioners, led by AIACE and AICPA, have decided to stage a *dharna* at Jantar Mantar in New Delhi on March 30 to raise their demands.

It is a complaint that the provision to revise pension every three years as per the Coal Mines Pension Scheme, which has been implemented since April 1998, is not being implemented.

He reminded that for the last five years, protests have been organized in cities like New Delhi, Varanasi, Kolkata, Kothagudem, Nagpur, and Godavarikhani to increase pension. He said that petitions have been submitted to the Prime Minister, Union Ministers, and members of Parliament. He expressed his concern that the pension is not sufficient to meet minimum basic needs due to the burden of old age, medical expenses in old age, and rising prices in the market. He demanded that the Coal Mines Provident Fund 2025 Draft Bill be introduced in Parliament, the Coal Mines Pension Fund be strengthened, a minimum pension of Rs. 10,000 be paid to coal sector employees, and a dignified life be provided in the society. In this meeting, Singareni Retired Employees Welfare Association Vice Presidents Bangari Rajaiah, K. Beeriah, Joint Secretary Samantula Narsing Rao, Geesa Kanakaiah, Kotte Malliah, M. Raja Nurse, CH. Narsayya, Rafiq, Madanayya, Rama Raju Subhash Reddy, Muninder Reddy, Rajamallu, T. Srinivas and a large number of retired employees of Singareni participated.

Pension revision guarantees should be implemented every three years

- Coal pensioners angry over no change for 30 years Protest
- in Bhupalpally in support of Jantar Mantar dharna

Jayashankar Bhupalpally, March 30: Despite the promise to revise the pension scheme for coal miners every three years, Singareni pensioners have expressed their anger that it has not been implemented even after three decades. In this end, a dharna was held at Ambedkar Square in Bhupalpally district headquarters on Monday in support of the Maha Dharna held at Jantar Mantar in Delhi. Several pensioners participated in this program held under the auspices of Singareni Pensioners Association President Gundeti Sammayya. Speaking on the occasion, they criticized that as part of the pension scheme introduced for coal miners in 1998, it was proposed to revise it every three years; but it has not been revised even once so far. At present, the workers are getting a pension of between Rs. 300 and Rs. 1000, and it is very difficult to continue living with this small amount. He said that it is unfortunate that coal miners have to take to the streets for their survival today. He said that thousands of elderly people are living below the poverty line due to the lack of pension revisions for 30 years. He said that the legal battle on this issue has already reached the Supreme Court and the Delhi High Court, and in 2020, the PAC Commission also suggested the need for reforms, but it has not been implemented, he criticized. He said that a draft bill was proposed in 2025, but it has not been implemented. He recalled that recently 75 former CMDs wrote a letter to the Prime Minister and sought his intervention. They demanded immediate revision of pension, provision of dearness allowance in line with inflation, provision of government financial assistance to the pension fund, and transparent changes in management. "We have worked hard for the institution our entire lives... have we become useless after becoming a panditaka?" The pensioners expressed their grief. He said that the Mahadharna to be held at Jantar Mantar will be a decisive step to resolve the problems. Gatala Rajinidhi, Madugula Samesi Reddy, Betla Swamy, The Ashadapu Rangayya, Marupalli Ramaswamy, Goll Mohan Reddy, Janga Lakshma Reddy, Thota Rajayya, Sheemayya, Saravaham and others participated in this program.
