AUDITOR'S REPORT

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statement of **ALL INDIA ASSOCIATION OF COAL EXECUTIVES BILASPUR C.G.** which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st DEC2021, the Statement of Income and expenditure account and Receipt & Payment account for the year ended 31.12.21.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Organization is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance of the association in accordance with the Accounting Standards. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Those Standards require that we comply with the ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and the disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers the internal control relevant to the association preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by the Management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

All members of All India Association of Coal Executives(AIACE) are hereby notified that a general body meeting of association will be held on 27/1/17 at 6.00 PM at Senior Recreation Club ,Korba to consider and amend bye-laws of AIACE. This notice is being given as per the provision for AMENDMENT OF BYE-LAWS as per clause no 25 of approved bye-laws of AIACE.

The proposed amendment is as below.

1. Clause no-3

AREA OF OPERATION:--

EXISTING PROVISION:-- It shall have its Branch Offices and area offices in the

at other places where sufficient nos of members work

The area of operation of the Association shall correspond to the all mines, units and other establishments of coal mines in Chhattisgarh.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT:-- It shall have its Branch Offices and area offices in the coal mining areas and at other places where sufficient nos of members work or reside.

The area of operation of the Association shall correspond to the all mines, units and other establishments of coal/lignite mines in India.

3. Clause no 8.2

ADMISSION AND MEMBERSHIP FEE:-

EXISTING PROVISION ---Application for admission for ordinary membership shall be submitted to Area Executive Committee for its consideration and approval. The right to reject any application without assigning any reason thereof and the decision of the Committee in the matter shall be final. Any executive shall need to apply in the prescribed form (Appendix “ A”) .The membership shall be effective from the date of approval .

The membership fee will be as below for time being and it will be revised by Central Executive Committee after every pay revision.

a. One Time Payment :- Ordinary/Advisory Members : - Rs 1000/-

b. Monthly Subscription :- Ordinary/Advisory Members :-- Rs 50/

In case any member wishes to make advance payment for membership fee for 12 months, he shall pay only for ten months ie Rs 500/towards membership fee. Any member defaulting to pay membership/Subsription / levy for six months will cease to be a member of the Association. But they can be readmitted on payment of all the due arrears along with Re-admission fee of Rs.500/-. Special subsription/levy will be raised, if necessary, to fulfill the aims and objectives of the Association on approval of the General Body. Such amount shall be payable by each and every member and in case of default, such a member shall be debarred from voting/contesting rights.

MINUTES OF VIRTUAL ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING
HELD ON 27TH DECEMBER 2020

The Annual General Body Meeting of AIACE was held virtually on ZOOM platform on 27th December 2020 from 10:00 AM. About 85 members attended the meeting that was held in 2 Sessions. Sri.P.K.Singh Rathor, Principal General Secretary/Convener, AIACE welcomed all the members.

Homage was paid to the following dear departed members by observing 2 minutes silence.

In his inspiring Presidential address, Sri.R.B.Mathur said that the importance of coal and Coal India should be maintained. Coal is an important mineral and as long as it is relevant, AIACE will also be relevant. The huge reserves of coal in India should be used in an environmental friendly manner. He informed that CIL is setting up a plant to mix coal gas with petrol in order to save precious foreign exchange and reduce pollution.

He was appreciative of the activities of AIACE and suggested that we should expand of our field of activity to Singareni Coal Company & Neyveli Lignite Corporation. He congratulated Mr. Muslim Ansari for his untiring efforts in membership drive. His kind words were appreciated by all members.

The following points as per the Agenda were discussed and resolutions were passed as per Annexure-I.

1. REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN DURING 2020.

Dr.B.K.Shrivastav gave a Power Point Presentation on the activities and major achievements of AIACE during the year 2020. Notable among these are the following.

- i. Membership has crossed 2384 as on 1st December 2020. Officers of SCCL and NLC are also eager to join AIACE.
- ii. With the digitisation of fee payment, members can now pay their subscription by scanning the QR Code on our website.
- iii. After a prolonged fight CIL finalised in January 2019 Executive Defined Benefit Pension Scheme that was pending since 1st January 2007

- iv. A Core Team of AIACE guided and helped its members to file online Profile Form, Form-10E and Annexure-I on the pension portal of CIL Website
- v. AIACE constantly followed-up with Chairman, CIL and achieved in successfully settling more than 200 cases under the CIL Executive Defined Benefit Pension Scheme. This was possible because the cases were thoroughly verified by the Core Team before being sent to CIL.
- vi. 5 Cases of death claim under CDBPS for were settled with the help of AIACE. A few more have been taken up.
- vii. Instances of missing and/or inaccurate data on the pension portal were pointed out and CIL made the necessary corrections. Such cases are being regularly taken up for resolution.
- viii. Members had doubts about the treatment of arrears under the Income Tax Act. Again the Core Team gave clarifications and helped the members to file their tax returns correctly. FAQ guide prepared on this matter was highly appreciated at various levels and is available on our website.
- ix. Due to persistent efforts of AIACE, CIL has enhanced the reimbursement of annual OPD charges under CPRMSE from Rs.15000 to Rs.36000 with effect from 1-1-2020
- x. Issue of Smart Cards has started at CIL HQ and will soon be introduced at all Subsidiaries
- xi. Streamlining of medical claims is being done as per our demand. Meanwhile, speedy approvals for cashless treatment of 4 Covid-19 cases were obtained successfully.
- xii. Cashless treatment at hospitals: Assurance has been given by CIL that matter will be settled early
- xiii. Revision of Hospital Rates by having an agreement with empanelled hospitals (as has been done by some PSUs) has been demanded. Formation of an empowered committee has been requested to revive the CPMRSE which seems to be in a coma.
- xiv. PRP issue was resolved
- xv. Some retired executives have not been paid PRP for the terminal year in which they retired. This issue was taken up, Office order on PRIDE was issued FOR revising the modalities.
- xvi. Some retired executives who could not submit PRIDE due to various reasons have not been paid PRP. This issue is also under consideration of the management.
- xvii. AIACE has again forwarded 38 cases where PRP has not been paid.

- xviii. **ENHANCEMENT OF PENSION DUE TO PAY REVISION W.E.F. 1st January 2017:** Nearly 200 such cases were raised with Commissioner, CMPF.
After repeated follow-up most of the cases have been resolved. The remaining 61 cases have again been sent.
- xix. **REVISION OF PENSION UNDER CMPS,1998:**
After a strong representation, CIL has finally decided to collect Cess on coal @ Rs.10/mt towards Pension Fund. This will improve the fiscal status of the Fund. With this, our demand for review & increase of pension will grow stronger.
- xx. A delegation of AIACE, Bengaluru met Hon'ble MP, Bangalore South, Sri. Tejasvi Surya and submitted a memorandum about revision of pension and Interest on NPS. Hon'ble MP has assured to extend help to us. A delegation of AIACE, Patna met Hon'ble Minister, Sri. Ravi Shanker Prasad and submitted a memorandum about revision of pension and Interest on NPS. Members of AIACE, Varanasi handed over a similar memorandum at the Secretariat of Hon'ble Prime Minister, Sri. Narendra Modi and have sought an appointment with him to demand revision of pension and Interest on NPS. Due to restrictions on movement caused by COVID-19, the progress is slow. But we will keep up the efforts to achieve our goal.
- xxi. **PENSION TO SPOUSE:** AIACE has vigorously pursued simplification of procedure for payment of pension to the spouse of deceased pensioner. It is learnt that due to our efforts a Draft Note has been prepared to simplify the procedure.
- xxii. **SUBMISSION OF LIFE CERTIFICATE:** Submission of Digital Life Certificate (Jeevan Pramaan) has been made easy. An accord was reached with India Post Payment Bank to avail their services and Camps were organized at Bilaspur and Korba for our members. Jeevan Pramaan camps were organised by Bengaluru, Kolkata, Asansol, Dhanbad and other Branches for our members.
- xxiii. **REFORMS IN HR POLICY OF CIL:** Promotion orders issued for different disciplines. Online requests for Inter-Subsidiary transfers started. AIACE protested against abolition of E-9 Grade and creation of E-8A grade. As a result, CIL immediately restored E-9 Grade (Executive Director).

- xxiv. We demanded that executives transferred on promotion be immediately released or transfer should be cancelled. In response to this CIL cancelled all the transfer orders.
- xxv. Accepting the demand of AIACE, Annual Coal Stock Measurement was deferred by CIL in view of Covid-19 pandemic.
- xxvi. **Environment clearance for NEC:** A few mines in NEC were closed due to lack of environmental clearance. AIACE demanded that Mines in NEC be reopened or manpower be transferred. Accepting our demand, CIL issued orders for transfer of all staff & executives deployed there to other Subsidiaries.
- xxvii. Last but not the least, impressed by our achievements, Wikipedia granted us recognition and 8th September, 2020 turned into a Red Letter day in the history of AIACE when it registered its presence in Wikipedia and following page was created:

2. MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

Sri. Muslim Ansari, the principal driving force behind enrolling new members, said that each member should contact at least 8-10 of his/her contacts and motivate them to become members so that our membership will exceed 5000 by March 2021. He assured that he is available at any time to help enrol members. The proposal for increase in registration fee to Rs.2000 and annual fees of Rs.1000 p.a. for new members was discussed at length. After considering the views expressed by Sri. M.L.Gandhi, Dr. N.G.Mukherjee, Sri.A.K.Singh, Sri.Zahoor Ali, Sri.P.K.Singh Rathor and others, the following resolution was passed.

- i. Registration Fees will be Rs.2000.00 with effect from 1st January 2021
- ii. Annual Fees will remain at Rs.500.00 for all members

3. DHARNA AT CMPF OFFICE, DHANBAD AND RELAY HUNGER STRIKE AT NEW DELHI

Dharna at CMPF Office, Dhanbad will be held on 15th February 2021 and Relay Hunger Strike at New Delhi will be held on 15th March 2021 to demand revision of pension under CMPS, 1998 and for simplification of Widow Pension. Of course these events will be subject to COVID-19 situation prevailing at that time. Members reacted enthusiastically to these moves and assured that they will participate in good numbers. Sri.A.K.Upadhyay and others suggested that simultaneously we should hold gate-meetings at Headquarters of Subsidiary Companies.

4. REORGNISATION OF BRANCHES

The General Body was informed that Due to the ever increasing number of members of AIACE, it is felt necessary to re-organise the Branches by merging some of the locations into one Branch. The following proposals were put up for the consideration of the General Body.

- (i) It is proposed to have 26 Branches/ Chapters to cover nearly 100 locations. Each of these Branches will have an independent WhatsApp group from 1st January 2021.
- (ii) The re-organisation is broadly based on geographical location of cities/towns, all over India, where members are residing. Different locations are clustered under the nearest major city.
- (iii) Members are requested to interact only in their respective WhatsApp Group of Local branches.

- (iv) Local Functionaries of Branches will be empowered to take decisions, find solutions to members' problems & grievances and communicate the same to Central Body.
- (v) The existing WhatsApp Groups of Local Branches will cease to operate and/or will be merged into New WhatsApp Group for Branches.
- (vi) A LINK will be given in Main Bonafide Groups. Members can use this link to join any Branch WhatsApp Group.
- (vii) A member may join either 1 or 2 Groups of his/her choice. If any member has opted for more than 2 Groups, his/her name will be summarily removed by Admin from 3rd Group onwards.
- (viii) Admin may add Core Working Committee Members in the Local Groups to facilitate and co-ordinate the functioning of the Association. The existing 10 AIACE Members' Main Bonafide Groups will be turned into Admin Only Group where only Admin will be able to post messages.

6. ISSUE OF IDENTITY CARDS TO MEMBERS

Sri.Zahoor Ali informed that Identity Cards for members with membership number from 1 to 1868 will be issued on 1st January 2021. I-Cards already issued to members' serial number 1869 onwards are valid till December 2021. Sri.Zahoor Ali explained that a lot of important information is available on our website, **www.aiace.co.in** and requested each member to visit the website to get the details such as Bank Account of AIACE, generation of I-Card, links to Zoom meeting videos, Wikipedia, Enrolment form. Members can also get information on ITR filing, NPS, CMPS, CMPRSE and related forms under different sections such as FAQ, Member's Corner. Replying to Sri. A.K.Singh's observation that Google Form is not accepting telephone numbers of 62 series, Sri. Ali said that the matter will be looked into.

7. BENEVOLENT FUND

A proposal by Sri. Muslim Ansari for setting up a Benevolent Fund for all the members was discussed. There is a provision in the Bye-Laws of the Association for creation of Benevolent Fund for Ordinary Members of AIACE. After detailed discussion it was decided that the Convener will form a committee to study and formulate a scheme.

8. Convener informed the General Body that National Confederation of Officers' Associations has requested AIACE to join them. After discussion it was decided to further strengthen AIACE before joining NCOA.

9. SESSION-2: BRANCHWISE DISCUSSION

The Branch members were requested to put forward their views and problems. Some of the Branches replied that their members are not actively involved. Convener asked the Branches to resume meetings and other activities to activate the Branches. He also said that Central Body members may visit Branches soon. It was decided to hold meetings on 30-12-2020 at Bilaspur and on 5-1-2021 at Korba that will be attended by the Convener. Branches may also hold virtual meetings on ZOOM platform.

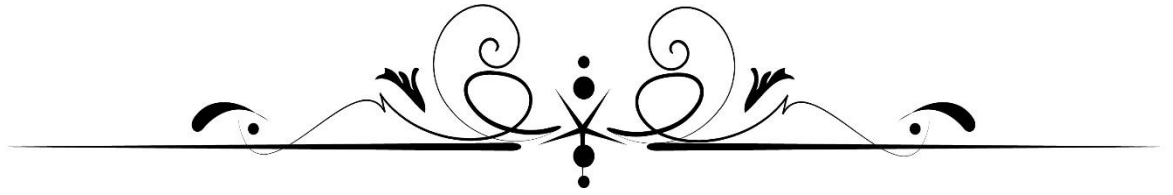

He also informed that he will try his best to get an appointment with Hon'ble Prime Minister, who also represents Varanasi Constituency, during his next visit.

Sri.C.T.Fulzele rendered a good poem on AIACE and was well appreciated. He was requested to post his poem on WhatsApp Group.

The meeting ended with Vote of Thanks by Sri. M.L.Gandhi.

A physical meeting of General Body Meeting of AIACE was held on 03.10.2021 at Country Club, Koni, Bilaspur.

Sri PK Singh Rathore National convener of AIACE attended the meeting.

The meeting was presided over by Dr A M Mohan, president of Bilaspur branch who enumerated the five years of journey of the association and insisted on strengthening the association by adding more members.



Sri N N Roy, Vice president, informed the members that Aar bee hospital, Bilaspur, has been added to CIL empanelled hospitals.

Sri Rathore informed the members about various activities and proposals of AIACE.

>Waiver of annual fee for members more than 75 years of age on 1st January of every year.

So far, members above 80 years of age are exempted from paying renewal fee for membership. It was decided to waive annual membership fee from members who become more than 75 years of age in 1st January of every year.

>Enhancement of registration fee to Rs 5000/ for new members who join AIACE after 31/12/2021.

It was explained that it has been observed that people are avoiding to join AIACE during their service period and opting to join it only after retirement in a selfish way to gain advantage over their problems. In order to discourage this mentality, it was decided to increase the registration fee of AIACE from Rs. 2000.00 to Rs. 5000.00 WEF 1/1/2022 so that people volunteer for membership during their service life. Those who join before 31/12/21 will continue to pay RS. 2000.00 only as registration fee. The annual renewal fee will continue to be Rs 500/ only.

MINUTES OF AGM HELD ON 16TH OCTOBER, 2022

at

BILASPUR

Annual General Meeting (AGM) of AIACE was held on 16th October 2022 at Hotel Ananda Imperial, Vyapar Vihar, Bilaspur, (CG) from 11 am onwards.

The meeting was presided over by Sri D K Saha, Secretary, AIACE Bilaspur branch..

Welcoming the delegates coming from all over the places of India, Sri P K Singh Rathor, Principal General Secretary elaborated the major achievements of AIACE since inception as below:

All India Association of Coal Executives (AIACE) was formed in 2015 and registered under trade union act in 2016. The association has achieved many mile stones during last seven years which are given below.

1. **Impact at CIL Level--** Reforms in HR Policy of CIL initiated
 - a. Promotion orders issued for different disciplines.
 - b. Online requests for Inter-Subsidiary transfers started.

2. **Impact at Government Level**

On 31-7-2020, AIACE wrote letter to Dr Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble Minister of State, Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions requesting reforms in PESB Selection

process. Within one month of raising this issue, Committee constituted for Reforms in PESB Selection process.

3. **CIL Executive Defined Benefit Pension Scheme.**

a. After a prolonged fight, CIL finalised in January 2019 Defined Benefit Pension Scheme that was pending since 1st January 2007.

b. A Core Team of AIACE guided and helped its members to file online Profile Form, Form-10E and Annexure-I on the pension portal of CIL Website

c. AIACE constantly followed-up with Chairman, CIL to settle the cases of more than 200 retired executives. This was possible because the cases were thoroughly verified by the Team before being sent to CIL.

d. 5 Cases of death claim were settled with help of AIACE. A few more have been taken up.

e. A list of retirees from SECL who have not filed Profile form was received and Core Team of AIACE helped file profile forms of the following and their claims were settled or in the process of settlement.

1. Sri. Ashok Kumar Sinha Roy

2. Sri. B.Sinha Roy

3. Sri. Bhiwajee Pawar

4. Sri. M.P.Baraskar

5. Late R.K.Goyal

6. Late S.S. Lepccha

7. Sri. S.Premchandam

8. Late R.P.Bansal

f. Instances of missing and/or inaccurate data on the pension portal were pointed out and CIL made the necessary corrections. Regularly cases are being taken up.

g. Members were confused about the treatment of arrears under the Income Tax Act. Again the Core Team gave clarifications and helped the members to file their tax returns correctly. FAQ guide prepared on this matter was highly appreciated at various levels.

4. **CPRMSE**

- a. Due to persistent efforts of AIACE, CIL has enhanced the reimbursement of annual OPD charges from Rs.15000 to Rs.36000 with effect from 1-1-2020
- b. Issue of Smart Cards has started at CIL HQ and will soon be introduced at all Subsidiaries
- c. Streamlining of medical claims is being done as per our demand. Meanwhile, speedy approvals for cashless treatment of 4 Covid-19 cases were obtained successfully.
- d. Cashless treatment at hospitals: Assurance has been given by CIL that matter will be settled early.
- e. Revision of Hospital Rates by having some agreement with empanelled hospitals (As has been done by some PSUs) has been demanded. Formation of an empowered committee has been requested to revive the CPMRSE which seems under comma.

5. **Payment of PRP**

- a. PRP issue was resolved.
- b. Some retired executives have not been paid PRP for the terminal year in which they retired. This issue was taken up, Office order on PRIDE was issued modifying the requirement.
- c. Some retired executives who could not submit PRIDE due to various reasons have not been paid PRP. This issue is also under consideration.
- d. AIACE has again forwarded 38 cases where PRP has not been paid.

6. **Enhancement of Pension due to Pay revision due to Pay revision w.e.f. 1.1.2017**

- a. Nearly 200 such cases were raised with Commissioner, CMPF.
- b. After repeated follow-up most of the cases have been resolved.
- c. The remaining 61 cases again sent from which 20 cases now remained to be settled.
- d. Further, fresh 26 cases of non-revision of pension due to pay revision has been sent.

7. **CMPF Pension Issues**

- a. After a strong representation to improve the financial status of Pension Fund, a Cess of Rs.10 per MT on coal has been levied and paid to Pension Fund
- b. A delegation of AIACE, Bengaluru met Hon'ble MP, Bangalore South, Sri. Tejasvi Surya and submitted a memorandum about revision of pension and Interest on NPS. Hon'ble MP has assured to extend help to us.
- c. A delegation of AIACE, Patna met Hon'ble Minister, Sri. Ravi Shanker Prasad and submitted a memorandum about revision of pension and Interest on NPS.
- d. Members of AIACE from different branches handed over a similar memorandum to different Member of Parliaments like Smt Himadri Singh (Shahdol constituency), Sri Virendra Kumar Singh Mast (Ballia constituency), Sri Sanjay Seth (Ranchi constituency), Smt Pragya Thakur (Bhopal constituency), Sri Arun Sao (Bilaspur, CG, constituency), Sri Rakesh Singh (Jabalpur, constituency) and Sri Mahesh Sahu (Bhubaneswar constituency) and have submitted a memorandum about revision of pension.
- e. Members of AIACE, Varanasi handed over a similar memorandum at the Secretariat of Hon'ble Prime Minister, Sri. Narendra Modi and have sought an appointment with him to demand revision of pension and Interest on NPS.
- f.Submission of Jeevanpramaan (Life Certificate) in Digital payment was made easy.
- g. An accord was reached with India Post Payment Bank to avail their services . Camps were organized at Bilaspur and Korba for our members.
- h. Even AIACE itself organized in-house Jeevanpramaan camps at Bengaluru, Dhanbad, Asansol, Kolkata and elsewhere to generate LC for its members.
- i. Pension case of Late Sri. H.Venkatappayya was taken up and it is a great pleasure to inform that arrears of pension and pension up to February 2021 has been paid to his widow, Smt. Prabhavati Venkatappayya.
- j.After much persuasion, AIACE was invited for a meeting with Sri. Animesh Bharathi, Economic Advisor, Ministry of Coal who also held additional charge of CMPF Commissioner to discuss various pending issues regarding Revision of pension, enhancement of pension and simplification of procedure for widow pension. A team consisting of Sri. R.B.Mathur, Sri. Abdul Kalam, Sri. P.K.Singh Rathor and Dr. B.K. Srivastava had a very fruitful meeting with him. As decided in the meeting, AIACE has submitted our suggestions on these issues.

It is a pleasure to inform that, suggestions submitted by AIACE to Economic Advisor, ministry of Coal have received due cognizance and the consequent follow up actions have triggered as reflected in different letters issued by CMPFO.

8. **AIACE Members' Benevolent Fund** -- Launching of AIACE Members' Benevolent Fund at the Foundation day Function held at Bengaluru on 16th May 2022 is another remarkable achievement. Amount of Rs.10000 each as per the scheme has been disbursed to Smt. Sangita Dubey w/o Late Dr.A.K.Dubey (M-180) on 17/8/2022 and to Smt. Latika Srivastava w/o Late Sri. V.K.Srivastava (M-1418) on 10/9/2022.

9. E-magazine AIACE TODAY-- The association has been bringing out quarterly emagazine, AIACE TODAY since 2019 and it has entered into 4th year. This mazagine provides useful information as well as news about the activities of the association.

10. **Successful dharna at Jantar-mantar, New Delhi and before CMPFO offices across the country**- AIACE and AICPA organised two dharnas at Jantar- Mantar, New Delhi in Decemeber,19 and July, 22.Similarly two dharnas were organised before CMPFO offices in Dhanbad, Asansol, Kolkata, Deoghar, Ranchi, Bilaspur, Jabalpur, Nagpur, Chhindwara, Talcher, Kothagudem, Rangundem in Feb21 and Oct,22 on the issue of review of CMPS 1998,simplification of widows pension and others.

11. Formation of CIEWA- Coal India Executives' Wives Association was formed at Bengaluru, Bilaspur, Patna, Varanasi, Kolkata, Pune and at other places under aegis of AIACE.

12. Opening of Bilaspur Coal Club- Members of AIACE at Bilaspur inaugurated Bilaspur Coal club on 10/10/2022 and decided to meet every month with spouses and also start social works in nearby areas.

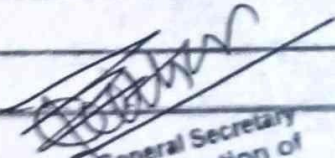

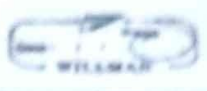

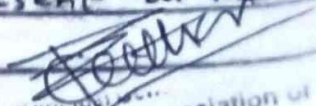
